LINAGE AND HONORS
6TH BATTALION, 11TH ARTILLERY

Organized 1 June 1917 in the Regular Army at Douglas, Arizona as Battery F, 11th Field Artillery.

Assigned November 1917 to the 6th Division.

Relieved from assignment to the 6th Division 12 November 1920.

Assigned 1 March 1921 to the Hawaiian Division.

Relieved from assignment to the Hawaiian Division 1 October 1941.

Concurrently, absorbed by Battery C, 11th Field Artillery Battalion.

Battery C, 11th Field Artillery redesignated Battery C, 11th Field Artillery Battalion 1 October 1941, and assigned to the 24th Infantry Division; transferred (less Personnel and equipment) from Korea to Department of the Army Control 15 October 1957 relieved from assignment to the 24th Infantry Division, and inactivated 31 March 1958.

Former Battery F, 11th Field Artillery (absorbed 1 October 1941 by Battery C, 11th Field Artillery Battalion), reconstituted 31 March 1958 (Battery F, 11th Field Artillery entitled to share history and honors of Battery C, 11th Field Artillery Battalion for period 1 October 1941 - 31 March 1958).

Redesignated 31 March 1958 as Headquarters Battery, 6th Battalion 11th Field Artillery.

Withdrawn from Regular Army and allotted to Army Reserve 6 April 1959.

concurrently, redesignates as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 6th Howitzer Battalion, 11th Artillery and assigned to the 94th Infantry Division (organic elements concurrently constituted).

Activated 1 May 1959 at Cambridge Massachusetts.

Inactivated 1 March 1963 at Cambridge, Massachusetts; concurrently, relieved from assignments to the 94th Infantry Division.

Redesignated 1 March 1967 as 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery and activated in Hawaii as an element of the 11th Infantry Brigade; concurrently withdrawn from the Army reserve and allotted to the Regular Army.

11th Inf Bde stops sappers

FSB 4-11 (11th INF BDE IO) — Without an enemy round being fired, "Jungle Warriors" of the 11th Infantry Brigade here recently nipped a midnight sapper attack in the bud, killing 10 VC soldiers and detaining two.

A large number of enemy weapons which included two rocket propelled grenade (RPG) launchers, two AK-47s, one AK-50, one 9mm pistol, 76 CHICOM grenades, 10 RPG rounds, 11 B-40 rockets, and one five-pound satchel charge were seized in the aborted attack on this 3rd Battalion, 1st Infantry firebase.

Near midnight three enemy sappers had advanced through the perimeter wire when a fourth member of the party, with an RPG launcher slung over his shoulder, touched off a trip flare. "I looked in front of me and there were a dozen of them just frozen in place," recalled Specialist Four Jerry D. Parker, Hickory, N.C., of Company D.

With the enemy sighting, the bunker line opened up with rifle and machinegun fire. Hand

grenade and claymore mine shrapnel showered the area. Constant illumination, intermingled with accurate mortar fire from the 81mm and 4.2 mortar sections, encircled the perimeter as the soldiers methodically dispatched the intruders in their sights.

After the ravaging fire subsided, the second platoon was called upon to make an on-line sweep of the area. As the infantrymen made their way to the wire, the bodies of two sappers armed with RPG launchers were discovered.

Uncovering no additional bodies or weapons, the search was discontinued until early morning.

Direct artillery fire from D Battery, 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery continued to suppress any further enemy activity. Two platoons from Company D continued their push outside the wire uncovering eight additional enemy bodies.

The attacking force had consisted of 14 enemy sappers and supporting riflemen.

According to Captain Harry G. Sheppard, Palmetto, Fla., commanding officer of Company D, "The sapper squad was extremely well armed."

Uncover rice cache

FSB LIZ (11th INF BDE IO) — Rice is abundant in the fertile "515 valley" but "Jungle Warriors" of the 11th Infantry Brigade are making it scarce for VC and NVA rice carriers in Duc Pho District. A 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry element recently cleaned out an enemy supply cache and put two VC rice carriers out of the wholesale food business.

On a routine search of the hamlet according to Specialist 4 Stuart Robertson, Middletown, N.Y., the men were just poking around with their sticks and came across an 800 pound rice cache buried in the floor of one of the huts.

The men then intensified their search and found two tunnels, each with a good sized room, one of which contained an enemy hand grenade. Just to the left of the first dwelling they found a larger, half-ton stash of rice buried about two feet underground.

The platoon stayed in the area that night and moved back through the hamlet enroute to an ambush site to the west. On a trail leading to the hamlet, the men spotted two VC with packs and rice carrying bags. One of the enemy evaded during the ensuing contact but the other, carrying a hand grenade, was wounded and evacuated.

The next day the platoon detained a total of 13 Vietnamese suspected of being involved in the enemy supply operations in the area.

The following day, the men moved to a larger hamlet 650 yards southwest and a search revealed almost two tons of rice.

Specialist Robertson explained that the VC had hidden much of the rice in five gallon tin cans camouflaged by a thin layer of dried potatoes.

Children reveal caches

CHU LAI (AMERICAL IO) — In Operation Geneva Park several Vietnamese children lead troopers of H Troop, 17th Cavalry to an impressive cache of 96

Geneva Park

In an action eight miles north of Quang Ngai, Charlie Company, 1st Battalion, 52nd Infantry, received incoming mortar rounds, rifle-propelled grenades and small arms fire when an undetermined number of Viet Cong assaulted their night defensive position early Friday morning. The company repulsed the attack with small arms fire and 81mm mortars. Also on station were gunships from F Troop, 8th Cavalry, which supported the infantrymen in the battle. At first light the company swept the area and found 14 CHICOM

mortar rounds, 60 mines, and a variety of other highly explosive ordnance. Elsewhere in Operation Fredrick Hill the 3rd Battalion, 21st Infantry and the 2nd Battalion, 1st

grenades, one rifle, two rifle-propelled grenades, and one booby trap. The company also killed one sapper.

The following day, Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 52nd Infantry, spotted four to five enemy soldiers carrying packs moving through the mountains 22 miles west of Quang Ngai. The company unleashed a heavy barrage of small arms fire to kill two. The infantrymen then swept through the area and discovered three burlap packs containing medical supplies, 34 cans of condensed milk, six time fuses and some rice.

Working in the same area,

Infantry, accounted for three-fourths of the brigades 43 enemy killed for the week. In Operation Iron Mountain the 174th Aviation Company killed 34 NVA in a two day action.

Alpha Company, came upon one Viet Cong killed and the capture of several miscellaneous documents.

Elsewhere, several Vietnamese children turned over to H Troop, 17th Cavalry, an impressive cache of munitions. The total cache consisted of 96 mortar rounds, 60 mines, two 2.75 inch rockets, two 57mm recoilless rifle rounds, two rifle-propelled grenades, one CHICOM grenade, four artillery rounds and six fuses. H Troop, maneuvering in an area 12 miles northeast of Quang Ngai, destroyed the munitions.

Also, Alpha Company, 1st Battalion, 6th Infantry received three artillery rounds, one mine, one booby trap, one mortar round, and 60 small arms rounds from Vietnamese children in an area 10 miles northeast of Quang Ngai. The 39th Engineer Battalion, working with Alpha Company, received two artillery rounds, one fuse, and two mortar rounds from the children.

While maneuvering in an area 22 miles west of Quang Ngai in the early morning, Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 52nd Infantry, encountered two to three NVA in green uniforms in the thickly vegetated mountainous terrain. The company responded with automatic weapons to kill one and capture one AK-47, two AK-47 magazines, 70 pounds of salt and several items of miscellaneous field gear.

In another action, Alpha Company, 1st Battalion, 6th Infantry, while maneuvering in an area 14 miles northeast of

General Zais leaves I Corps

CHU LAI (AMERICAL IO) — During a brief ceremony at Division headquarters, Lieutenant General Melvin Zais, Commanding General of XXIV Corps, delivered a farewell address to the officers and men of the largest division within his command.

After receiving thanks and best wishes from Major General A.E. Milloy, Commanding General of the Division, the departing XXIV Corps commander remarked on the characteristics of the soldiers of the Division.

"I admire the appearance of the young soldiers who are standing out there, often not really understanding why, but doing what they are asked to," he said.

General Zais, who began his Army career under the Thompson Act in 1937, was called to active duty in 1940.

During WWII, he led the 3rd Battalion of the 517th Parachute Infantry Regiment from cadre training to combat in Italy, southern France, Belgium and Germany, including one night combat parachute drop into northern France.

In September, 1952 he was assigned to the U.S. Army Advisory Group, Turkey, where he trained a Turkish brigade as an infantry unit advisor. He accompanied that unit when it moved to the Korean conflict.

After several staff assignments for the Joint Chiefs of Staff and USAEUR, General Zais was promoted to Brigadier General in June of 1964 and was appointed Director of Enlisted Personnel, Office of Personnel Operations.

He was assigned as the Deputy CG, First Field Force, Vietnam in February 1966. Later, he served as Deputy CG, 1st Infantry Division.

Upon his return to CONUS in July of 1966, he served as the Director of Individual Training, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff of Personnel, Department of the Army. He was promoted to Major General in May, 1967, and commanded the 101st Airborne Division from July, 1968 to May, 1969, when the unit was undergoing conversion to the airmobile structure. He became qualified as an Army aviator, and in June of 1969 he became Lieutenant General and assumed command of XXIV Corps, Hue-Phu Bai.

General Zais commanded XXIV Corps when it moved from Phu Bai to Danang during March, 1970 to relieve the III Marine Amphibious Force as the organization in charge of all American forces operating in I Corps tactical zone.

General Zais' next assignment is as Director of Operations, J-3, Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Kham Duc airstrip retaken by ARVN and Americans

KHAM DUC (DIVARTY 10) — Two years and two months to the day since Kham Duc was lost to an NVA Division, this Special Forces advised CIDG camp was

retaken by the same Division units that played a central role in that withdrawal of allied forces.

In May of 1968, an entire NVA Division surrounded Kham

Duc, overran the outposts, and from the high ground around the airstrip began an intense mortar and recoilless rifle barrage. The camp was defenseless and a contingency plan to evacuate all personnel was quickly put into action.

In what has been called "one of the most harrowing evacuation efforts of the Vietnam war," the Americal Division sent an infantry battalion and a battery of artillery to hold back the enemy until the evacuation could be completed. The plan called for the approximately 1500 persons in the camp to be flown out in a two day period.

Under cover of more than 150 airstrikes by both US and Vietnamese aircraft from units as far away as Cam Ranh Bay, Tuy Hoa, and Thailand, the heroic airlift was accomplished in only six hours.

The successful evacuation, however, did not have the flavor of an offensive victory, so when Kham Duc was reclaimed from the enemy, the privilege belonged to the men that were ordered to fight and withdraw.

More than two thousand ARVN moved into the ridgeline during the first few days of the recent operation to secure the highground around the camp.

In the valley below, the 2nd Battalion, 1st Infantry, 196th Infantry Brigade, was inserted around the airstrip where they quickly cleared the lowland area.

198th 'Regulars' kill five VC

LZ BAYONET (198th INF BDE 10) — Infantrymen of the 198th Infantry Brigade and gunships from the 116th Assault

Aviation Company maneuvered swiftly to kill five Viet Cong as the enemy attempted to evade in a running battle northeast of Quang Ngai City recently.

"They took us under fire as soon as we hit the landing zone," said First Lieutenant Winston W. Moody, Houston, Texas, a platoon leader with Bravo Company, 1st Battalion, 6th Infantry. "We quickly repulsed the attack with small arms and machinegun fire and the enemy evaded into a village.

Lieutenant Moody split his platoon into two elements and moved them forward to search the village. After moving several yards through rice paddies, a squad leader with Lieutenant Moody's elements discovered a blood trail.

"We followed the blood trail to a hooch," said Lieutenant Moody, "and my squad leader spotted two Viet Cong hiding within the structure. We told out interpreter to tell the VC to come out but they refused and we fired several rounds into the hooch in which they were hiding."

The squad leader, Specialist

Four Dean R. Wood, Central City, Iowa, then moved towards the structure and tossed in a grenade.

"Just as soon as he tossed the grenade the VC kicked it out the door and it exploded. We moved off again and fired several rounds of machinegun and small arms fire into their location."

The infantrymen again moved toward the hooch and inside found the two Viet Cong dead. The platoon then moved northeast toward higher ground where they had observed several more Viet Cong evading.

"As we moved toward the hilly terrain, we heard the gunships firing automatic weapons and rockets ahead of us," Lieutenant Moody said. "Other Viet Cong had tried to evade from the village as we moved through and the gunships spotted them and opened fire."

"We spread out and began sweeping the more thickly vegetated area," said Lieutenant Moody. "We had only moved a few more yards when we found two more bodies lying in the thick brush."

Men from the "ON TIME" 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery have been keeping busy during the month. There was approximately a 5,000 round increase in firing during the month of September over the month of August. In August the battalion tubes fired around 15,000 rounds and during the month of September the final tally was 19,355. Delta Battery fired the majority with a month total of 8478 with Alpha Battery second with 4243. Charlie Battery fired 3586 and Bravo fired 3048. During the first few days of September, Delta Battery fired almost continually, day in and day out. The area around 4-11 was buzzing with enemy activity. "Redlegs" from the 6th of the 11th have been doing a fine job of keeping "Charlie" living in a "World of Hurt."



ON PROMOTIONS...

Everyone would like to be promoted. How do YOU stack up?

Your section chief starts the wheels rolling for your next advancement. He does this by observing your performance and determines how fast you develop in your job knowledge and your willingness to assume responsibility as compared to the other men in your section.

Next, your section chief passes on his recommendation to the platoon sergeant who has also kept up with your progress. The platoon sergeant prepares an Enlisted Efficiency Report and sends this to the First Sergeant.

The "Top" discusses your recommendation with the Battery Commander. After all battery records are checked, the BC directs the battery clerk to type your recommendation for promotion and attaches any needed waivers. The paper work is then forwarded to the S-1 shop where the PSMCO reviews each recommendation according to AR600-200 to insure it is complete and correct. From here, the paper work is sent to the American Division Personnel Center to be checked and scores tabulated from points accumulated while in the service. In a few days the paper work is returned. It is given to the members of the promotion board, consisting of two officers and one senior NCO. Your preparation for the board should include Reporting, Uniform Regs, Current Events, Map reading, Bn Policies, Job Knowledge, Military Justice--and wear your best Uniform.

Lt. WRIGHT HONORED

Many men in the 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery remember a fine Forward Observer by the name of 2LT Robert C. Wright. In January, near FSB Debbie on Hill 285, 2LT Wright gave his life for his country. The following is a clipping from the LAWTON CONSTITUTION dated 30 July 1970.

The nation's second highest award for heroism and three other combat decorations will be presented Friday at Fort Sill to the mother of an Elk City soldier who was killed in Vietnam last January.

The Distinguished Service Cross, the Bronze Star with "V" device for valor, the first Oak Leaf Cluster to the Bronze Star for Meritorious service and the Purple Heart will be presented by Brig. Gen. Lawrence H. Caruthers, Jr., assistant commander of the U.S. Army Field Artillery School.

Mrs. Wright's son, Robert C., a second lieutenant in the field artillery, was awarded the medals posthumously for his actions while serving in Vietnam as a member of the 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery of the American Division.

Only the Medal of Honor ranks higher than the Distinguished Service Cross. LT Wright was awarded the medals for "extraordinary heroism" on Jan 2. He "distinguished himself while in command of an advanced party of field artillerymen establishing a fire base on Hill 285 near the town of Duc Pho," according to the citation.

FREE TRIP TO EUROPE

Travel to Europe, all expenses paid. Thirty (30) days paid vacation and the chance to see the Swiss Alps, the French Riviera, the leaning tower of Pisa or to visit Paris, London or Rome.

Reenlistment for the overseas assignment of your choice is now open to all E-6 and below regardless of ETS while you are in Vietnam. There are now three reenlistment options that allow career soldiers to short out on their current enlistment prior to ETS or even sooner than 90 days prior to ETS. These are reenlistment for Overseas for CONUS station or for Drill Sergeant.

Reenlistment for any of these options can not be made any sooner than six (6) months prior to DEROS. At that time a request for reenlistment for the option of your choice should be submitted indicating three choices or areas where you desire assignment. This request is forwarded to the Department of the Army where a determination of the availability of your selections is made. If the area of your choice is available, upon completion of your Vietnam tour and after a leave in the states you are on your way to duty in the country of your choice.

Overseas areas to choose from include Europe, Alaska, Caribbean (Panama or Puerto Rico) USARPAC (Hawaii, Japan, Okinawa) or Korea, Thailand and Vietnam. Minimum reenlistment is for four (4) years except three (3) years is authorized for overseas areas identified as short tour areas such as Vietnam, Korea, Thailand, unaccompanied 18 month tours to Europe and certain other areas. For more information, see your unit commander or SFC Walt Gwin, 6/11 Arty Battalion Career Counselor. Choice Not Chance, pick your next assignment.




