### SUMMARY

On 10-15 Jan 68, the following footage was taken of the 11th Brigade's present activities in the Republic of South Vietnam.

The Brigade arrived in the I Corps area Dec. 20-21, 1967, after completing more than a year of extensive jungle training at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii.

The latest addition to the Americal Division, the Brigade is composed of two Infantry units, the 1st Battalion, 20th Infantry and the 3rd Battalion, 1st Infantry; one artillery battalion, the 6th Battalion, 11th Artillery; the 6th Support Battalion; the 6th Engineer Battalion; and an armored troop ("E" Troop) of the 1st Cavalry Division.

After arriving in Qui Nhon Harbor, RVN, by Army Troop Ship, the Brigade disembarked and moved into a staging area. In the staging area three groups were formed. One left by airlift, the other two moved by motor convoy to their destination, Duc Pho, RVN, in the Quang Ngai, Province, approx 85 miles north of Qui Nhon.

At that time the men immediately began improving the security of the area by sand bagging their tents, and building underground bunkers.

Since arriving in Duc Pho, the 11th Brigade has secured their base camp and begun operations in their area of responsibility. The Brigade's mission, which includes both civil affairs and tactical operation, is to neutralize the effect of the enemy in Southern I Corps.

At present the Brigade is participating in Medical-Civil Affairs Programs (MEDCAP) in the village of Duc Pho. Civil Affairs programs include classes in the English language given to students in the village high school, and medical aid in the village hospital.

Depending on intelligence reports, the Brigade conducts Search and Destroy missions, Ambush Patrols, Reconnaissance Patrols and Search and Clear operations in their area of responsibility.

The Brigade is accomplishing their total mission by impressing on the local population the advantages of a free society, and by destroying or capturing the active enemy and his supplies.
