SUMMARY

On 2-8 June 1968, elements of the 538th Eng Bn. (Const); 44th Eng Grp, all located at various camps along Route 304, with Headquarters at Camp Bassayons, approx 42km South of Korat, Thailand. The elements are in the process of constructing a Class-50 High Speed Highway (Route 304). Route 304 (Bangkok by-pass Extension), a highway designed to link the Northeast section of Thailand with the principle Military Port of Sattahip at the south.

The 538th Eng Bn is working to upgrade 33 kilometers of Route 304 which is in a mountainous terrain. To cut through the terrain, heavy equipment is utilized. High terrain is cut away and pushed into the lower areas, to build up the standard highway construction base. After a solid roadbed is prepared, it is ready for asphalt paving.

Asphalt paving, is made from sand, crushed rock and asphalt (a tar like substance). Conveyed from hoppers, the sand and crushed rock passes through a dryer. The dryer, is a huge cylindrical container, equipped with a blasting burner. After passing through the dryer, the sand and crushed rock pass through a gradation unit, and then into the pug mill. At the pug mill, the asphalt is mixed with the dried sand and crushed rock. Now as asphalt paving material, it is trucked to the work site where it is dumped into an asphalt spreader.

After the spreader has laid the desired thickness, a steel tandem roller compresses and smoothes out the pavement. A wobbly-wheel roller is utilized in kneading the asphalt pavement.

Since the construction of Route 304, small villages and concession stands have been established along the highway. At present, traffic is routed through the village of Pak Tong Chai, due to the heavy flow of traffic, the main thorough-fare of the village is in need of repair. Once a section of Route 304, a by-pass of the village, is completed, plans to pave the thorough-fare of Pak Tong Chai will be underway through a Civic Action Program.

Although sections of the highway are being utilized at the present time, once completed, Route 304 will not only benefit the Military (both US and Thai) but will be a shorter and more efficient means to travel from the Northeast section of Thailand to the Capital City of Bangkok.
