<p style="text-align: center;"><u>SUMMARY</u></p> <p>On 10 and 11 August 1968 the Challenger class ship "Pioneer Contender" a 12,000 ton ship of the United States Lines, New York, arrived at Keelung, the northern most port in Taiwan, Republic of China, and is located approx 30 kilometers NE of Taipei. Part of the "Pioneer Contender's" cargo was 47 crates, containing 36 disassembled 2 1/2 ton trucks.</p> <p>After the ship was moored at pier 17 in Keelung Harbor, Chinese stevedores were briefed by the assistant port commander and the ship's cargo was unloaded using the ship's gear to lift the cargo out of the hold and to lower it onto the pier. Forklift trucks were used to move the crates from the pier to a storage area. From the storage area, forklift trucks load the crates of truck components onto railroad cars that will transport the cargo to the assembly plant in Taipei.</p> <p>The trucks will be used by the Army of the Republic of China and are assembled under the direction of LTC John A. NEPOTE (Huntington, W.Va.), Project Officer, Army Material Command, for the Wheeled Vehicle Co-Production Program, for the Republic of China. The actual assembly of the trucks is accomplished by the Army of the Republic of China, Combined Service Force (CSF) in a recently constructed vehicle assembly plant in Taipei. The purpose of assembling the trucks in Taiwan is to provide trucks to the Army of the Republic of China at a lower cost than the trucks could be purchased assembled in the US; to provide jobs for Chinese workers; and to teach the Chinese techniques of mass assembly of automotive vehicles.</p> <p>The truck parts are shipped in wooden crates in units of four, i.e.; four frames per crate, four engines per crate, wheels for four trucks per crate, four truck cabs per crate, etc. Some components such as tires are locally produced and purchased.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>SUMMARY</u></p> <p>On 13 and 14 August 1968 the Military Vehicle Plant (MVP), Combined Service Forces (CSF), the Republic of China continued the assembly of M35A2 2½ ton cargo trucks at the East side industrial area of Taipei, Taiwan. The trucks are being built to replace WWII vintage vehicles that are currently being used by Chinese Military units.</p> <p>The MVP is the result of a Cooperative Logistics Arrangement between the Government of the Republic of China and the Government of the United States, signed 13 July 1966. Upon the signing of the Arrangement, the Military Vehicle Plant was constructed and the first run of 2½ ton M35A2 cargo trucks was completed by the end of September 1967. Eighty percent of the parts are currently manufactured in the U.S. and shipped, via ship, to the Port of Keelung, Taiwan. From Keelung, the crates of parts are transported on railroad cars to the MVP in Taipei.</p> <p>After the crates of parts are unloaded from the rail cars, they are unpacked, sorted, inventoried and are ready for assembly. Some parts such as gas(fuel) tanks, cargo boxes and tires are locally purchased and are manufactured to U.S. Army specifications. These indigenous items account for 20% of the components that make up a vehicle.</p> <p>The assembly plant is typical of any modern, efficient automotive assembly and is limited in production only by the quantity of labor and parts that are available. The MVP has contracted Kaiser Jeep Corp to provide engineering and technical assistance in operating the plant.</p> <p>The rate of vehicle production at the MVP is classified by the Chinese Government.</p> <p><u>NOTE:</u> "NOT FOR PUBLIC RELEASE UNLESS CLEARED FOR THE PUBLICATION OF DEFENSE"....</p>
