<u>SUMMARY</u>					
<p>On 21 November 1968, at Camp Enari, RVN (approx 390kms NNE of Saigon), elements of the 4th Division Chemical Office, with assistance from the 119th and 170th Assault Helicopter Companies, prepared and began a "people sniffer" mission.</p> <p>The "people sniffer" (Anti Personnel Detector), mounted in a UH-1H Helicopter, collects the ammonia scent in the air, that is given off by the human body. Flying at tree-top level, up wind and over thick jungle terrain, the "sniffer" can detect any recent activity in the area.</p> <p>Once enemy activity is recorded and detected on the "sniffer" meter, a UH-1H helicopter (the Command-Chase ship), drops an E-158 Multi-Point Source Tactical CS Cluster.</p> <p>The CS Cluster is utilized in offensive operations when it is desirable to disable the enemy for a limited period of time. CS, is used because it instantly irritates the eyes, nose and throat. This type of operation brings the enemy from hiding and the men in the aircraft above, can visualize heavy or light enemy activity.</p> <p>During this operation, the UH-1H Helicopter carrying the "sniffer" and six men, received small arms fire. The aircraft crashed and burned, killing the six men aboard. The aerials, of air to ground, shows the UH-1H Helicopter, burning in the heavy jungle brush.</p> <p>Film footage was not obtained on the XM 674 CS Cartridge, at this time.....</p>
