A. Newcastle Disease Vaccine - Harvesting Allantoic Fluid

One of the main emphasis in protein production in Vietnam is the poultry industry. Newcastle disease and Fowl Pox cause very high losses of poultry in Vietnam. As a result, one of the major efforts of the Veterinary PASA Team, has been in the poultry vaccine area.

The broad purpose of this film sequence (SEE ROLL #6 IN THE ENCLOSED FILM CAPTIONS), depicts the harvesting of Allantoic Fluid, which will be used in the preparation of Newcastle Disease Vaccine Production.

After the inoculated eggs have been inoculated for 4-days, candled and chilled, they are moved into an isolation room.

The eggs are dipped in a disinfectant solution. They are then removed from the solution and placed in egg flats. The shell area over the air cell, is painted with tincture of iodine. This shell cover is then removed with forceps and the eggs are covered with a sterile cloth. The Allantoic Fluid is then removed from the shell by utilizing an egg harvesting needle and a vacuum system.

After each bottle is filled, a sample is removed, which is used to determine sterility of the Allantoic Fluid and hemagglutinating activity. After this, the Allantoic Fluid is filtered and used in the preparation of Newcastle Disease Vaccine.

2. Hog Cholera Vaccine - Rabbit Harvesting

Another very important industry in Vietnam, is Swine Production.

Hog Cholera, causes high losses in the Swine Production.

The PASA Team has exerted much effort in the Hog Cholera Vaccine Production area. The film sequence (SEE ROLL #6 IN THE ENCLOSED FILM CAPTIONS), depicts the harvesting of tissues from rabbits, which will be used in the preparation of lapinized Hog Cholera Vaccine.

Rabbits are inoculated three days prior, with a modified live virus of Hog Cholera virus. On the day of harvesting, the rabbits are prepared and brought into the laboratory.

In the first isolation room, the rabbits are bled out by cardiac puncture. A vacuum system is used to collect the blood. After bleeding, the abdomen is prepared and opened.

Once opened, the rabbit is covered with a sterile cloth.

The rabbit is then passed into the next isolation room, through a hooded structure. Under this hooded structure, the Spleen and Mesenteric Lymph Nodes are removed. These tissues are then used in the preparation of modified live virus, lapinized Hog Cholera Vaccine.
