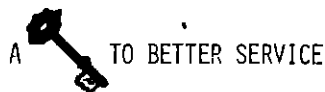

SECTION I - GENERAL INFORMATION

1. CONTENTS: Section I contains general information relative to loan of Department of the Army (DA) films. Section II contains a list of films by number, title and running time, which are authorized for loan to United States Civilian Organizations for showing on a non-profit and non-commercial basis. All films listed are 16mm sound motion picture films unless otherwise indicated and must be shown or projected on 16mm sound projectors only. Section III lists films that were recently released or recent changes that affect public clearances.

2. COMPLETING THE LOAN ORDER FORM:

a. United States Civilian Organizations should request loan of DA films which are cleared for public non-profit exhibition on DA Form 11-44 from the Audio-Visual Support Center (AVSC) servicing their geographical area. (See back cover of catalog)

b. DA Form 11-44 should be completed in the following manner:

- (1) Submit in triplicate (third copy will be returned to requestor as confirmation copy.)
- (2) If typewriter is available, please type. If typewriter is not available, please letter legibly so that all copies can be easily read. One item to line, please.
- (3) Submit requests well in advance of desired booking dates, allowing for requests to reach this Center at least 15 days prior to showing dates. Requests may be submitted up to one year in advance.
- (4) Indicate only actual dates films are desired. The AVSC will allow for shipping time.
- (5) Help Us, Help You! Indicate film prefixes and numbers as well as titles.
- (6) Include telephone number in appropriate space.
- (7) Submit separate sets of requests for each separate set of showing dates.
- (8) List alternate dates or alternate films if possible, provided that all films listed are desired for the same period.
- (9) Sign DA Form 11-44 in space marked "Requesting Officer", and kindly type or letter legibly name of requestor. Any request received without signature will be returned.
- (10) Zip Codes must be included on film requests.
- (11) Remove carbons from DA Form 11-44's.
- (12) See page iv for sample copy of completed form.

3. CONDITIONS OF LOAN:

a. Films must be returned to the issuing Audio-Visual Support Center, in the same containers supplied, using the same shipping tag that accompanied film(s), the day following the last showing date as indicated by the requestor. Your cooperation is requested in this matter, since failure to return films on time may result in cancellation of film loans previously booked to units of our Armed Forces. Booking period may be extended upon request if film is available. Requests for extension of loan period must be received at the AVSC prior to expiration date of original loan.

b. "Showings and Attendance" figures should be entered in appropriate spaces on the copy of DA Form 11-44 which accompanies the film when issued and this copy should be returned with the film.

c. Outgoing postage is paid by the Army. Requestor pays only for return postage.

d. Films are not to be reloaned without permission of the issuing AVSC.

e. Breaks or tears to film may be repaired if proper facilities are available, however, it is requested that repairs be noted on DA Form 11-44 upon return of film. Your cooperation is necessary so that films may be kept in top quality.

f. Editing or cutting film(s) in any manner is prohibited.

g. Reproduction of film(s) in whole or part by any method is prohibited.

The following should be added to page iii to the "Army Films for Public Use" civilian catalog:

j. Requestor should not rewind film after the last showing. (This will be done at the AVSC.)

4. PURCHASE OF DA FILMS: Civilian organizations may purchase certain DA films. These films which are available for public sale are coded "PS" following the synopsis of the film in Section II. For information on "PS" films write:

Since renouncing Soviet denomination in 1948, she has been receiving aid from the United States. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 42 AUSTRALIA - 12 Min - Geography, government, economy, industries, social customs and traditions of Australia including her historical development and current role in world affairs. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 43 CANADA - 18 Min - A pictorial study of Canada's geography, early history, current life, industries, economy, government and present role in world affairs. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 45 DECISION AT WILLIAMSBURG - 20 Min - Color - The decision at Williamsburg, Virginia, on May 15, 1776, prompted the new and independent nation, the United States of America. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 48 THE PHILIPPINES - 15 Min - Geography, political history, people, religions, industries, government, activities in WWII and current role in world affairs of the Philippine Islands. AFIF 55 GREECE - 18 Min - Study of modern Greece; political, economic, technical and military development with US aid and role as a member of NATO. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 60 PANAMA - 19 Min - Historical background, social, economic and military status. Function and welfare of US Armed Forces stationed in Canal Zone and strategic significance to the US and to the defense of the Americans. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 65 ICELAND - 23 Min - Historical background, and current social, economic, and political status and its strategic significance in Western defense plans. Member of UN, signatory of NATO. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 70 HEADQUARTERS, USA - 30 Min - A pictorial tour of Washington, D.C., highlighting past and present symbols of the greatness of America. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 73 TOM SCHULER-COBBLER STATESMAN - 29 Min - Color - Animated film tells the story of Tom Schuler, an ordinary cobbler of the revolutionary era, who played small but vital role in the history of our Nation. (PNP)

AFIF 75 THE COMMUNIST WEAPON OF ALLURE - 36 Min - Dr. Warren B. Walsh, Professor of Syracuse University, explains how Communist persuasion is designed to appeal to the basic human hungers. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 76 COMMUNIST BLUEPRINT FOR CONQUEST - 33 Min - Mr. Boris H. Klosson, Department of the State, explains the methods and techniques used by the Communist Party to seize power in a country. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 85 A MOTION PICTURE HISTORY OF THE KOREAN WAR - 58 Min - A documentary on the Korean War showing the fighting and problems encountered by American and UN Forces during the major

phases of the battle, tracing back to the events from the initial gunfire on 25 June 1950 to the Armistice on 27 July 1953. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 86 NAVY UNIFORM - 19 Min - Recounts the story of the United States Navy uniform. (PNP & TV)

AFIF 88 WHY NATO - 27 Min - Narrated by Edward R. Murrow, this film describes the purpose and development of NATO from the time of its inception to the summit meeting held December 1957, at the NATO Headquarters in Paris. (PNP)

AFIF 89 CUMMINGS CITY - MILITARY ASSISTANCE IN CIVIL DISASTER - 35 Min - Describes the assistance given by the Armed Services when natural disasters strike civilian communities in Continental United States. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 90 THE CODE - THE U. S. FIGHTING MAN'S CODE OF CONDUCT - 29 Min - The precepts of the U. S. Fighting Man's Code are vividly brought to life as we sweep back through history to review the heritage of courage and valor left by the fighting men throughout all of America's wars. (PNP & TV)

AFIF 92 YOUR LEGAL STATUS IN THE REPUBLIC OF GERMANY - 50 Min - This vitally important film deals with the status of Forces Agreement, (signed 5 August 1959), governing the rights, obligations and conduct of members of a foreign force on the territory of a NATO nation. In this case it outlines the legal status of American service men and their families in West Germany. (PNP, TV, TH & PS)

AFIF 93 KEEP ON LEARNING - 15 Min - Concerns the Armed Forces Education Program, describing what it is, how it is organized and how it benefits the serviceman. (PNP, TH & TV)

AFIF 94 YOU IN SPAIN - 28 Min - Living conditions for those serving a tour in Spain receive attention as the major Air Force and Navy Bases are visited and the homes, shops and recreational facilities are depicted. (PNP)

AFIF 95 NORTH AFRICA - 20 Min - This information film covers the four countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea on the northern shoulder of the awakening continent of Africa. The countries we see are Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia and Libya. (PNP)

AFIF 96 KOREAN ARMISTICE - 27 Min - Organization and responsibilities of UN Command Military Armistice Commission. Role of each of the following is defined; CINCUNC, UNCMAS, The Secretariat, JOT, and NNSC. (PNP)

AFIF 98 THE CHALLENGE OF IDEAS - 31 Min - An appraisal of the great contest of our times between the Democratic and Communist way of life; and the challenge it presents in preserving our standard and traditions. (PNP, TV & PS)

AFIF 99 OLD GLORY - 28 Min - Color - Story of the evolution of the American Flag from 1607 until 1960 when the new 50 star Flag became a reality. (PNP, TV & PS)

AFIF 101 WILLIAMSBURG-THE STORY OF A PATRIOT - 36 Min - Color - Documents the historic events during the turbulent period, 1769 - 1776, in Williamsburg, Virginia. The people, issues, and episodes of the times are vividly re-enacted. (PNP)

AFIF 105 A STUDY OF THE U.S.S.R. - 23 Min - History and development of the Soviet Block; natural resources, cultural aspects, economic, industrial, agriculture, scientific and technological growth. (PNP)

AFIF 107 THE COMMUNIST EUROPE - 19 Min - An appraisal of communist satellite countries in Europe, individual cultural, economic and political climate and significance to U.S.S.R. and the West. (PNP, TV & PS)

AFIF 108 THE ANATOMY OF AGGRESSION - 27 Min - Film appraises the patterns of Communist aggression in both the Eastern and Western Hemispheres since WWII. USSR expansion is traced from 1945, showing post-war crisis in European countries. (PNP)

AFIF 109 ARCHITECTS OF PEACE - 23 Min - An appraisal of the vital role of the Department of State in international diplomacy, training and responsibilities of foreign service officers in this country and in embassies around the world. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 112 KEEPING INFORMED - 20 Min - Story, origin, and development of Communications media for keeping our Armed Forces informed of their vital role in attaining the nation's objectives. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 113 LATIN AMERICA - 20 Min - The role of the United States in the development of these nations and the Communist approach to Latin America. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 116 COMMUNIST TARGET-YOUTH - 34 Min - Explains the techniques and methods used by the Communists to gain and wield control over the young people of the World. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 117 MILITARY MEDICINE - 19 Min - Report on the great strides made in military medicine. Reviews the contributions of all Services in the past century. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 119 THE ROAD TO THE WALL - 34 Min - James Cagney narrates this film which appraises Communist expansion in Eastern Europe and its implications in the international scene. PNP, TV & PS)

AFIF 120 FREEDOM AND YOU - 55 Min - Color - Affirmation of American precepts of liberty, stressing idea that the protection of freedom is the duty of the individual citizen. (PNP, TV & PS)

AFIF 121 BACKGROUND: SOUTHEAST ASIA - 28 Min - This film gives the members of the Armed Forces a view of the military and political situation in South Vietnam, Laos, and Thailand as it exists today. (PNP)

AFIF 123 THE THIRD CHALLENGE-UNCONVENTIONAL WARFARE - 45 Min - Color - Today, we are seeing with increasing frequency evidence of another technique the Communists use whenever they consider the occasion appropriate. The techniques of unconventional warfare - THE THIRD CHALLENGE. This film deals with this challenge and depicts the United States capability to fight this type of war. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 124 HERITAGE OF FREEDOM - 38 Min - Portrayals of four events widely separated in time, location and happenstance in the United States, shows the beginnings and background in the growth of liberty as enunciated in our Constitution and Bill of Rights. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 128 THE VOTE - 11 Min - Describes the origin of the Absentee Voting System, and how eligible military personnel and their qualified dependents can cast their vote in the forthcoming elections. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 129 BALLOTS THAT FLY - 9 Min - Eligible servicemen are shown how to apply for an absentee ballot, what happens to the application and how to mark and mail it after completing procedures. (PNP)

AFIF 134 ESPIONAGE TARGET-YOU - 30 Min - This film helps put servicemen and women on guard against Communist espionage agents seeking to ensnare them into obtaining vital secret information. Shows them what to do when approached by such operators. (PIG)

AFIF 135 PARTNERS IN FREEDOM - 24 Min - Color - This is a 1963 progress report by Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara, of the 3 year build-up of Armed Forces for national defense and assistance to allies and friendly nations. Accomplishments of the past years and future goals are cited. An address by President Johnson relates defense policy for 1964. (PNP)

AFIF 136 ONE FORCE - 21 Min - Men and women of the military services with different ethnic origins are welded into one force dedicated to the defense and security of the nation. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 137 AMERICA'S CRITICS ABROAD - 20 Min - Purpose of this movie is to show US personnel how to counter criticism of the US when they are called upon to do so overseas. (PNP)

AFIF 143 A FREE PEOPLE - 20 Min - Color - A cavalcade of America set to song, forming a stirring salute to the American spirit from the Pilgrims to the quest for outer space. (PNP)

AFIF 144 OUR HERITAGE - 30 Min - Color - This film portrays our heritage thru military efforts of our country from it's earliest beginnings to uphold the Declaration of Independence. It includes the original photography of many historical landmarks. (PNP)

AFIF 146 A PERSONAL AFFAIR - 25 Min - Color - This film objectively shows the U.S. Servicemen how to put his personal affairs in order. Emphasis is placed on the importance of this to provide for family members in case of his death, thus avoiding further confusion and upset. (PNP)

AFIF 149 WHY VIETNAM? - 32 Min - Film outlines the U. S. policy with respect to South Vietnam as stated by President Johnson in an address to the American people and the world at large. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 152 THEIR CHOICE WAS FREEDOM - 26 Min - In the years since Communism has become a force to reckon with in the world, much as been said about the inevitability of its ultimate success. But the fact is - - the rate of defection from the Communist world gives lie to these claims. This is the story of the over fourteen million who have turned their backs on the intolerable. (PNP)

AFIF 153 THE UNIQUE WAR - 25 Min - Color - Story of the fighting man in Vietnam and their special task of helping to build a nation at the grass roots level. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 155 AN ALLIANCE OF NEIGHBORS - THE STORY OF THE U. S. SOUTHERN COMMAND - 30 Min - Reviews the mission and responsibilities of the U. S. Southern Command. It points up the importance of our basis in Latin America to prevent the spread of communism. (PNP)

AFIF 157 THE CONGRESS - 31 Min - A general description and workings of the Congress is given by a tour of the legislative buildings and talks with leaders from the House and Senate. Views of the Armed Services Committees show Congressional participation of National Defense. (PNP, TV & PS)

AFIF 158 RED CHINESE BATTLE PLAN - 28 Min - This documentary film traces the history of communism in Red China. From the Chinese revolution in 1911 to the present day, actual behind the scene events (filmed) have been used to illustrate the basic tenets of the Chinese Communist for conquest and political take over of the free world. (PNP)

AFIF 159 GOLD AND YOU - 9 Min - Illustrates the problems of balance of payments and the gold flow and how it relates to the serviceman and his dependents overseas. (PNP)

AFIF 160 A NATION BUILDS UNDER FIRE - 40 Min - Color - John Wayne, host-narrator, shows how the social revolution in Vietnam for a better life and personal dignity is being implemented from the grass roots level. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 161 ASIA: THE CRUCIAL ARENA - 20 Min - US Foreign Policy in Asia as set forth by President Johnson in his speech of 12 July 1966. (PNP)

AFIF 162 THAILAND - WHERE MEN ARE FREE - 20 Min - This film was produced to orient members of the Armed Forces on the modern history, military forces, treaty agreements, economic problems, and geographic areas of Thailand. (PNP, NSTV, & PS)

AFIF 163 THE PRESIDENCY - 28 Min - The office of the Presidency is fully explained and illustrated in this film. The history of this office is traced from its earliest historical beginnings to the present day evolution of Constitutional powers and everyday duties. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 164 THE UNITED STATES STRIKE COMMAND - 20 Min - color - This film illustrates the use and importance of the U. S. Strike Command in any type of crisis anywhere in the world at any time. (PNP, NSTV & PS)

AFIF 165 COMMUNISM - 30 Min - In this film there is a complete orientation on the objectives, concepts, strengths and weaknesses of Communism. This film reviews the history for the past 50 years of communism. (PNP)

AFIF 167 DON'T GET STRANDED - 18 Min - This motion picture fully explains the use of form 1580 when applying for air travel and how to fly at reduced commercial rates while on leave. Problems and advantages of air travel are discussed. (PNP)

AFIF 168 WE THE PEOPLE (The Story of Our Federal Government) - 28 Min - A special effort is made in this film to relate the workings of our government to the Service audience. It is designed to illustrate the functions of each branch of the federal government. (PNP & TV)

AFIF 169 OUTLOOK SOUTHEAST ASIA - 20 Min - The nine nations of Southeast Asia are explored historically, graphically and culturally to illustrate the vital importance of their role in the future for world peace. This film has been made to create a basic understanding of future development in this pivotal area. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 171 THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY (Voting) - 20 Min - This film encourages servicemen to exercise their right and responsibility to vote. A colorful history of elections from Washington to modern times is presented to describe the evolution of the electoral process. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 172 KNOW YOUR ENEMY - THE VIET CONG - 20 Min - This film illustrates the Viet Cong tactics and techniques in the vital areas of combat operations, logistics and demolitions and propaganda and non-military activities. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 174 PACIFIC COMMAND - 30 Min - color - This film explains the mission of the Commander-in-Chief, Pacific and shows that strategic and tactical military planning and operations must be unified. Overall responsibility in the Pacific is in the hands of the CINCPAC, and under his direct operational command he has some one million men of the Army, Marines, Navy and Air Force. It is the largest U. S. Military Command. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 179 SHIELD OF NATO - 20 Min - This film traces the history of NATO and it's role in helping preserve the peace for the community of nations that are party to the NATO pact. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 182 COUNTERINSURGENCY - 30 Min - color - This film discusses the world wide insurgency of subversive activity and what counter measures can be taken to prevent the further spread of it. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 183 PENTAGON FORUM - MILITARY COMPENSATION - 30 Min - Rear Admiral Lester E. Hubbell, USN, leader and staff director of the Department of Defense, explains the new single salary plan for military pay. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 184 PENTAGON FORUM - POLICE DEPARTMENT - 30 Min - A pentagon forum panel discusses what the Department of Defense is doing to help police associations across the country to fill some 15,000 vacancies. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 187 A DAY IN AMERICA - 29 Min - color - This story shows one day in the life of America from dawn to dusk. It stresses the importance of the everyday man and his role in our country's democracy. (PNP, NSTV)

AFIF 192 THE CHANGING FACE OF COMMUNISM - EASTERN EUROPE - 25 Min - This film details and documents the relationship between the Soviet Union and the satellite states of Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Hungary, Poland, Rumania and Yugoslavia since the end of World War II. (PNP & NSTV)

AFIF 200 I&E SPORTSREEL - 35 Min - Highlights major sports events of 1955: "Baseball World Series" - "Tennis Thrills" - "Battling the Bulls" - "Fooing the Bulls in Spain" - "AAU Diving and Swimming" - "Strong Men Behind the Iron Curtain" - "Pitt Late Drive Whips California" - "Women Wrestlers" - "Swaps vs Nashua". (PNP)

AFIF 201 I&E SPORTSREEL - 35 Min - "Football Upset of the Season" - "Modern Pentathlon" - Irish Upset in Last Game" - "Iron Curtain Thriller" - "Canine Caddy" - "Campbell Sets Speed Record" - "Sports Spectacular - Army vs Navy". (PNP)

PMF 5396 MANAGEMENT OF FACIAL TRAUMA - PART II - OPEN REDUCTION OF MAXILLOFACIAL FRACTURES - 28 Min - Color - This is a clinical demonstration of the principles and techniques in open reduction of maxillofacial fractures based on actual case histories. (PMG)

PMF 5397 MAMMAPLASTY: THE STROMBECK TECHNIQUE - 27 Min - Color - A clinical demonstration of reduction mammaplasty showing the complete procedure and good results of this surgery on a 23 year old patient. (PMG)

PMF 5398 HAND INJURIES - PRINCIPLES OF EARLY MANAGEMENT - 24 Min - Color - This film discusses and demonstrates the procedures of treatment in various types of hand injuries. (PMG & PS)

PMF 5399 OCULOMOTOR APRAXIA (ACQUIRED) - 20 Min - Color - This is a presentation of a classic case of oculomotor apraxia (acquired). Clinical testing and characteristics displayed by a 24 year old male patient who acquired the disease in adult life are shown. (PMG)

PMF 5400 INSECT-BORNE DISEASES - 17 Min - Color - The sources, effects, control and preventive discipline of insect-borne diseases are discussed and delineated in this film. (PMG)
