TF 5-2357 TRACTOR, CATERPILLAR D-S - STARTING AND STOPPING PROCEDURES - 3 Min - Starting and stopping the diesel engine. (PNP)

TF 5-3111 WATER PURIFICATION - PART II - CHLORINE DEMAND, ARSENIC AND NITROGEN MUSTARD TESTS - 11 Min - Describes the objectives, equipment and procedures for making the Chlorine Demand, Arsenic and Nitrogen Mustard Tests to assure safe drinking water for troops in the field. (Professional Groups)

TF 5-3548 CARPENTRY - PART I - MEASURING, MARKING AND LEVELING TOOLS - 18 Min - Introduces types of tools mentioned in title. (PNP, TV)

TF 6-3251 THE AN/TPS-25 GROUND SURVEILLANCE RADAR - 30 Min - Describes the features, capabilities and operation of the AN/TPS-25 Ground Surveillance Radar. (PNP)

TF 7-680 SKI SAFETY - 21 Min - Ski Safety precautions to be taken in connection with excessive speed, faulty waxing, improperly adjusted bindings and pack equipment. (PNP)

TF 7-681 SKI SAFETY - FIRST AID AND EMERGENCY REPAIR OF EQUIPMENT - 41 Min - Rendering first aid for various types of ski accidents. (PNP)

TF 7-1475 MILITARY ROCK CLIMBING, TECHNIQUE OF CLIMBING - 32 Min - Shows techniques of rock climbing using two-man and three-man teams over various types of slopes and rock walls. (PNP)

TF 7-1480 MILITARY ROCK CLIMBING, MOVEMENT OF COMBAT UNITS - 32 Min - Describes methods and procedures whereby men with certain types of equipment can move and operate in mountain area. (PNP)

TF 7-1550 COMBAT IN DEEP SNOW AND EXTREME COLD - 21 Min - Techniques of combat under conditions of deep snow and extreme cold in forested areas of the Arctic are depicted in this film as an infantry rifle company is shown carrying out a two-day combat mission in enemy territory. Much time is spent in preparing for this operation. (PNP, TV, TH)

TF 7-1642 THE REINFORCED RIFLE PLATOON IN THE ATTACK OF A BUILT-UP-AREA - PART II - THE ATTACK - 35 Min - Depicts tactical planning, preparation and execution of an attack on enemy held town by reinforced rifle platoon. (PNP, TV, TH)

TF 7-2636 ASSUMPTION OF COMMAND, PROBLEM I - 6 Min - A young second lieutenant is reporting for duty for the first time. He indicates a lack of confidence in himself. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2637 ASSUMPTION OF COMMAND, PROBLEM II - 6 Min - A young inexperienced sergeant about to take over command of a squad overhears the men in the squad discuss him unfavorable. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2638 ASSUMPTION OF COMMAND, PROBLEM III - 6 Min - An acting squad leader, unpopular with the men, recommends stern action by the new leader to show how to lay down the law to the displeased men. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2639 SENIOR-SUBORDINATE RELATIONS, PROBLEM I - 4 Min - A first lieutenant is assigned to a new unit commanded by another first lieutenant who is a personal friend and his senior by 5 days. The officer thinks he is better qualified than the unit commander. He reports a day late and begins to take over. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2641 SENIOR-SUBORDINATE RELATIONS, PROBLEM 3 - 5 Min - Three sergeants expecting consideration for a master sergeant vacancy close ranks against the newly appointed master sergeant, work suffers and the new master sergeant is forced to report the situation to the lieutenant-in-charge. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2642 PHYSICAL LEADERSHIP, PROBLEM 1 - 4 Min - The men of an ammunition convoy in a combat zone are frightened by mortar and artillery fire, drivers leave their trucks and refuse to comply with the lieutenant's order to continue on the route. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2643 PHYSICAL LEADERSHIP, PROBLEM 2 - 8 Min - A squad of men detailed to clear a road of mines refuse to go back to work after one of the men is killed, and another is wounded by an exploded mine. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2644 PHYSICAL LEADERSHIP, PROBLEM 3 - 8 Min - An ammunition handler and an ammunition bearer are assigned as gunner and assistant gunner to replace the three men that were killed or injured during firing practice. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2645 INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNIQUES FOR SMALL UNIT LEADER, PROBLEM 1 - 5 Min - A sergeant who is fed up with the business of instructing trainees violates every rule pertaining to military instruction. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2646 INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNIQUES FOR SMALL UNIT LEADERS, PROBLEM 2 - 7 Min - A lieutenant with a know-it-all attitude is assigned to conduct a class in leadership for noncommissioned officers. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2647 CHAIN OF COMMAND, PROBLEM 1 - 4 Min - A train commander, a lieutenant, over-rides a car commander's orders, the car commander is unaware of this and reproves a sergeant for disobeying his order. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2648 CHAIN OF COMMAND, PROBLEM 2 - 5 Min - A private is ordered by his lieutenant to dig up a heater somewhere for his jeep, the driver cannibalizes a heater from a deadlined jeep and is discovered. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2649 CHAIN OF COMMAND, PROBLEM 3 - 5 Min - A private is ordered off a mess detail by the company commander unknown to the mess and supply officer and is rebuked for taking off without finishing his work. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2700 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - STAFF AND SUBORDINATE COMMANDER RELATIONSHIP-PROBLEM 1 - 5 Min - The S3 of a battalion size unit happens to walk by Company A barracks at the very moment a platoon of men are dismissed; none of them stop to salute the S3. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2701 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - STAFF AND SUBORDINATE COMMANDER RELATIONSHIP-PROBLEM 2 - 4 Min - Two majors have words over a changed assignment and unable to resolve their differences, bring it to the attention of the group commander. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2702 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - STAFF AND SUBORDINATE COMMANDER RELATIONSHIP - PROBLEM 3 - 7 Min - A company commander unable to check the training of his men because of excessive paper work, complains to the S1, but to no avail. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2706 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - HANDLING OF SUBORDINATE LEADERS IN COMBAT - PROBLEM 1 - 6 Min - A platoon leader committed to a critical mission confesses his lack of confidence to the company commander. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2707 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - HANDLING OF SUBORDINATE LEADERS IN COMBAT - PROBLEM 2 - 6 Min - A company commander crawls within grenade throwing distance of enemy gun emplacement, puts gun out of action. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2708 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - HANDLING OF SUBORDINATE LEADERS IN COMBAT - PROBLEM 3 - 6 Min - A sergeant who had been wounded badly in combat is assigned to the rear area of supply unit, he shows his contempt by driving his men mercilessly. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-2709 LEADERSHIP-POST COMMISSIONED SERIES - UTILIZATION OF PERSONNEL - PROBLEM 1 - 4 Min - A company commander is reluctant to give up one of his good men to his group commander, this move would mean a better job for the man and a better man for the job at headquarters. (Professional Groups concerned with Case Study Methods)

TF 7-3764 SURVIVAL - 34 Min - Color - The basic principles and techniques needed for survival upon escape from an enemy prisoner of war camp are described and discussed in this film. All aspects for survival and avoiding detection are covered. (Professional Groups)

TF 7-3956 RANGER - THE ULTIMATE SOLDIER - 32 Min - Color - This film covers the purpose and nature of training provided in the US Army Ranger course. (PNP, TV)

TF 8-3 EMBRYOLOGY OF THE LIVER, GALLBLADDER AND PANCREAS - 18 Min - A simple visualization of the embryology of the liver, gallbladder and pancreas. (PNP, TV)

TF 8-1468 DDT IN THE CONTROL OF HOUSEHOLD INSECTS - 17 Min - Methods of applying DDT in its three forms are shown along with the equipment used in application against houseflies, cockroaches, and bedbugs. (PNP)

TF 8-1476 OUR FOOD AND OUR HEALTH - 15 Min - Illustrates the importance of proper eating habits as a factor in maintaining the individual soldier's health and well being. (PNP)

TF 8-1501 THE STOWAWAY - PART I - DISEASE AND PERSONAL HYGIENE - 17 Min - Shows how disease is spread by food-handling personnel and proper sanitary precautions. (PNP)

TF 8-1708 HOSPITAL SANITATION - 14 Min - A hospital window cleaner narrates this story of hospital cleanliness. (Professional Medical Groups)

TF 8-1761 MEDICAL PLANNING FOR A TASK FORCE OPERATION - 32 Min - Demonstrates the long term medical planning required for a joint Army, Navy and Air Force operation, Operation Seagull. (PNP, TV, TH)

TF 8-1816 PURIFICATION OF WATER - 20 Min - Types and dangers of untreated water. (PNP)

TF 8-1841 HOSPITAL FOOD SERVICE PERSONNEL TRAINING - PART I - INTRODUCTION - 16 Min - Shows the departments, equipment, menu, planning and food preparation procedures typical of hospital food service. (PNP, TV, TH)

TF 8-1944 THE HOSPITAL WARD TEAM - 23 Min - Composition, contributions and responsibilities of hospital ward team. (Medical and Allied Medical Groups)

TF 8-2083 SWINGING INTO STEP - 33 Min - Shows treatment given amputees and illustrates some of the psychological barriers to be overcome. (PNP)

TF 8-2198 RESUSCITATIVE CARE OF THE SEVERELY WOUNDED - 24 Min - Color - Shows how to care for the following: hemorrhage, fractures, pre-operative, surgical and post-operative, also how to alleviate pain and anxiety. (Medical and Allied Medical Groups)

TF 8-2292 FIRST AID - PART I - MAJOR WOUNDS AND FRACTURES - 33 Min - Color - Covers treatment for wounds of the chest, belly, head and face and fractures of jaw, leg, elbow, arm, ribs, neck and back. (PNP)

TF 8-2295 MESS SANITATION - 25 Min - Mess sanitation principles in storing foods, preparing meals, serving meals, care of left-overs, garbage disposal and control of flies. (PNP, TV, TH)

TF 8-2471 BASIC CARE OF PATIENTS - PART I - CLEANING THE PATIENT'S UNIT AND MAKING AN OCCUPIED BED - 15 Min - Stripping bed of soiled linen: cleaning bed, chair, and bedside cabinet. Making bed with clean linen; final straightening of the unit. (PNP, TV)

TV 725 SONG OF THE SOLDIER - 28 Min - Color - Throughout history soldiers have gone to war with a song. Their songs express pride in country, belief in cause, and determination to win the battle and return home. You are invited to join the US Army band and chorus, as they sing the songs of the American soldier, from the Revolutionary War to Vietnam. (PNP, TV)

TV 726 THE ARMY'S CIVILIANS - 28 Min - Color - The Army Civilian plays an important role in the defense of America. Highly skilled, and completely dedicated to his country, he serves America well at home and abroad; in peace and in war. This film depicts the story of these men and women and their service to our country. (PNP, TV)

TV 727 CONARC, HQ OF THE U.S. SOLDIER - 28 Min - Color - The weapons of warfare are not enough to defend America in today's complex international community. It takes organization and men of vision; men capable of seeing the Big Picture. This film is the story of these men and how they are organized and trained to defend America. (PNP, TV)

TV 728 THE ARMY TRIANGLE - 28 Min - Color - Three things dear to the heart of the soldier are food, mail and pay. The story of how these important items are processed and delivered to the soldier is detailed in the film. (PNP, TV)

TV 732 THEY CLEAR THE WAY - 28 Min - Part of the job of the US Army Engineers is to build the bridges, airfields and roads which bring mobility to the combat forces. This film depicts the story of these difficult and challenging missions in Vietnam. (PNP, TV)

TV 733 THE BIG PICTURE - PLATOON LEADER - 31 Min - Color - Shows the men of leadership who take a platoon of men in battle, quickly assessing the situation and making the right decisions at the right time. (PNP)

TV 737 THE BIG PICTURE - THE BRIDGE - 28 Min - Color - Looks at the clergymen in uniform, the Chaplain's Corps. Describes the history of the corps and the dedication of the men in it. Also visits Chaplain's School. (PNP, TV)

TV 738 USARPAC - 28 Min - Color - One of the US Army's largest areas of activity is spread the length and breadth of the blue Pacific. This command, known as US Army Pacific or USARPAC, includes the responsibility for men and missions in Vietnam, Korea, Okinawa, Japan, Thailand, Taiwan and Hawaii. (PNP, TV)

TV 739 SOLDIERS-AT-LAW - 28 Min - Color - The responsibility of US Army judicial and legal activities lies with the Judge Advocate General. This issue shows the training which qualifies the civilian attorney as a judge advocate or military lawyer. The film emphasizes how individual rights, which are protected by the civilian judicial system, are also guarded by the military judicial system. (PNP, TV)

TV 741 MEN WITH A MISSION - 28 Min - Color - This film traces the history of the US Army Reserve and its present mission of providing the backup force to the active Army in times of emergency. Narrated by Efrem Zimbalist Jr., this film shows the men of the Army Reserve training to maintain their high state of readiness. (PNP, TV)

TV 742 MEETING THE NEED - 28 Min - Color - To assure that our soldiers will be the best equipped, fed and clothed fighting men in the world, the U.S. Army Natick Laboratories provide research, development and testing of foods, clothing and equipment. (PNP, TV)

TV 743 YOUR ARMY REPORTS #15 - 28 Min - Color - Presents a brief in Army activities world-wide. In this issue the "Missile Mentor" that helps protect our country from surprise attack; the U.S. Army Orthopedic Clinic in Boston; the Demilitarized Zone in Korea. (PNP, TV)

TV 744 TO SERVE A SOLDIER - 28 Min - Color - The soldier with high morale is a tough man to beat. Special Services has the responsibility of providing morale support activities and services to the soldier, wherever he may be stationed in the world. (PNP, TV)

TV 745 THE BIG PICTURE - SOLDIER'S CHRISTMAS - 28 Min - Color - No matter where a soldier is stationed, from a remote Arctic outpost to the steaming jungles of Vietnam, the spirit of Christmas finds its way to him. (PNP, TV)

TV 746 9TH DIVISION - 28 Min - Color - In North Africa, in France and Germany, the 9th Division was unbeatable. Today, "The Old Reliabiles" meet a new challenge in Vietnam and add new victories to their battle record. (PNP, TV)

TV 747 THE BIG GREEN LAB - 28 Min - Color - In the tropics jungle heat and humidity can destroy man and deteriorate his weapons. And so in the forest of Panama the "BIG GREEN LAB" of the Army Materiel Command's Test and Evaluation Command wage a constant battle against the ravages of environment. (PNP, TV)

TV 748 1ST AIR CAVALRY DIVISION - 28 Min - Color - The famous "First Team" became airmobile in July 1965. Shortly afterward, its new power was trained on the aggressive forces in Vietnam. This is the story of how that new power, air-mobility, is helping the 1st Cavalry win the battle for freedom in Southeast Asia. (PNP, TV)

TV 749 LOGISTICS IN VIETNAM - 28 Min - Color - No soldier has been as well supplied as the US soldier on duty in Vietnam. This film documents the activities and facilities which provide major medical, transportation, engineer, supply and other services to the American fighting men. (PNP, TV)

TV 750 WEST POINT-THE ARMY CHALLENGE - 28 Min - Color - Duty, Honor, Country, - the West Point motto, which motivates the lives of all who join the long gray line. This story tells of a young man who completes the four years of study to qualify for a commission as a Second Lieutenant, United States Army. (PNP, TV)

TV 751 EQUAL TO THE ENVIRONMENT - 28 Min - Color - Wars must often be won by conquering a hostile environment as well as an enemy Army. The U.S. Army has often been forced to conduct operations in steaming tropical jungles, on sub-arctic coasts, towering mountains, in sub-zero cold and bleak deserts. This film tells how lessons learned, and history, are used as a basis for training our fighting men in ways and means of combating the dangers and problems of climate and terrain. (PNP, TV)

TV 752 THE ARMY AIR MOBILITY TEAM - 28 Min - Color - Modern combat operations demand an immediately responsive fighting force. This film gives the inside story. (PNP, TV)

TV 753 SEEK AND STRIKE - 28 Min - Color - The modern armor soldier moves to battle on mounts of increasing mobility and firepower to seek and strike the enemy. The Big Picture takes you to the U.S. Army Armor Center at Fort Knox, Kentucky, for a look at the historical development of mobile armor and examines the training of the tanker as he learns to move, shoot and communicate from aboard the latest combat vehicles. (PNP, TV)

TV 754 THE SOLDIER'S HERITAGE - 28 Min - Color - Through all of this nation's wars, the American soldier has distinguished himself by bravery and determination. He has established a heritage of which all Americans can be proud. To preserve and portray this enduring record we present the historical summary of these accomplishments from the Revolutionary War to the present in "The Soldier's Heritage." (PNP, TV)

TV 755 THE VOICE OF COMMAND - 28 Min - Color - This film tells the story of the globe-spanning communications chain which carries to the ends of the earth, "The Voice of Command." (PNP, TV)

TV 756 THE SILVER RIFLES - 28 Min - Color - Many symbols recognize excellence and valor in the nation's armed forces. Among the most prized is the Combat Infantryman's Badge. The meaning and traditions behind the award of these Silver Rifles is the subject of this episode. Narrated by Fess Parker. (PNP, TV)

TV 757 KOREA REVISITED - 28 Min - Color - In the summer of 1950 the forces of communism unleashed an attack upon the Republic of Korea causing death and destruction. The United Nations answered the attack with a multi-nation fighting force which drove out the enemy and set up a shield behind which the people could rebuild. This film shows Korea today. (PNP, TV)

TV 758 RANGER - 28 Min - Color - The small unit leader of the modern U.S. Army must be a highly resourceful individual capable of directing operations under many types of geographic and climatic conditions. This film visits Fort Benning, Georgia where selected officers and non-commissioned officers are trained to develop their leadership skills to the ultimate degree and earn the coveted "Ranger" shoulder tab. (PNP, TV)

TV 759 CALL ME MISTER - 28 Min - Color - The highly qualified men and women of the U.S. Army who wear the insignia of the Warrant Officer perform a vital role. These officers with a warrant provide special talent in such fields as photo-mapping, automotive maintenance, flying Army aircraft, nuclear power plant operations and many others. This is the story. (PNP, TV)

TV 761 THE BIG PICTURE - UNITED STATES ARMY EUROPE - 28 Min - Color - Describes the role of US Army Europe (USAREUR) as a deterrent force in Western Europe, covering the missions exclusive of NATO as well as those performed as a member of NATO. (PNP, TV)

\*TV 762 D-DAY ANNIVERSARY - 28 Min - B&W - A 25th anniversary look at the sights and sounds of the famous beaches of Normandy. TV 767 THE MEN FROM THE BOYS - 28 Min - Color - This film shows how new recruits are transformed into trained soldiers during the first eight weeks of basic training, focusing on the role of the assigned Drill Sergeant and the reactions of the young inductees. (PNP, TV)

TV 768 THE BIG PICTURE - AMERICAL DIVISION - 28 Min - Color - Focuses on the history of the "Americal" Division; its participation in World War II against the Japanese, and its reactivation to carry on in Vietnam. (PNP)

TV 769 THE BIG PICTURE - YOUR ARMY REPORTS #18 - 28 Min - Color - Reports on: the Chaparral-Vulcan air defense system for use against low-flying aircraft; EUCOM, the United States Joint Services Command on guard with NATO. (PNP, TV)

TV 770 THE BIG PICTURE - THE 11TH ARMORED CAVALRY REGIMENT - 28 Min - Color - Covers the activities in Vietnam of the "Black Horse" regiment, which proved that armored vehicles could be used under the jungle and marsh conditions found in Vietnam. (PNP, TV)

TV 771 THE BIG PICTURE - SCOUT DOGS - 28 Min - Color - Shows these modern-day counterparts of the K-9 Corps as they train with their handlers at Fort Gordon and Fort Benning, Georgia. (PNP, TV)

TV 772 THE BIG PICTURE - 82ND AIRBORNE DIVISION - 28 Min - Color - Traces the history of the "All American" 82nd Airborne, the first Army Airborne division, in World War II, in Santo Domingo in 1965, and in Vietnam. (PNP, TV)

TV 773 THE BIG PICTURE - TESTING AT ABERDEEN - 28 Min - Color - Looks at tank and artillery testing at some of the most brutal and exacting test courses in the world, at the Test and Evaluation Command's Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md. (PNP, TV)

TV 774 THE COMBAT INFANTRY SOLDIER - 28 Min - Color - This film portrays the life of the combat infantry soldier in Vietnam. (PNP, TV)

TV 775 WHAT MAKES A MODERN ARMY? -28 Min - Color - This film describes how the special skills and resources of today's soldier serve to implement the four "M's" that are the essence of the modern Army - mission, motivation, modernization, and management. (PNP, TV)

TV 781 THE BIG PICTURE - ENGINEERING FOR TOMORROW - 28 Min - Color - Details research, development and construction work of the Corps of Engineers; includes flood control, polar research in greenland, and a seaborne nuclear power plant. (PNP, TV)

TV 782 THE BIG PICTURE - THE SPIRIT OF FORT BENNING - 28 Min - Color - Describes Fort Benning, Georgia, the largest and most comprehensive infantry training center in the free world. (PNP, TV)

TV 783 THE BIG PICTURE - THE ARMY NURSE - 28 Min - Color - Offers a comprehensive look at the dedicated women and men of the Army Nurse Corps, and their duties throughout the world since 1901. (PNP, TV)

TV 784 FORT SILL - THE FIELD ARTILLERY CENTER - 28 Min - Color - Visits Fort Sill on the 100th anniversary of its founding; shows the Artillery Center and School, the museum, and a "live fire" demonstration. (PNP, TV)

TV 785 THE LARGEST SCHOOL HOUSE IN THE WORLD - 28 Min - Color - Describes the scope and benefits of the US Army General Educational Development Program. (PNP, TV)

\*TV 786 THE GENERAL BRADLEY STORY - 28 Min - Color - Another in the "Famous Generals" series. A film documentary of the life and career of General Omar Bradley. (PNP, TV)

TV 787 8TH INFANTRY DIVISION - 28 Min - Color - Describes the versatility of the 8th Infantry "Pathfinder" Division, and its training activities in Europe. (PNP, TV)

TV 788 PRELUDE TO TAPS - 28 Min - Color - Members of the "Old Guard" 3d Infantry, the Army Band, and the Army Chorus perform the annual "Prelude To Taps" program at Ft. Meyer, VA. TV 794 U.S.ARMY ALASKA - The cameras focus on our northermost defenses--the U.S. Army Alaska. The film moves through history to examine in detail the training centers and troop activities that are USARAL, "U.S. Army Alaska." (PNP, TV) - 28 Min - Color

TV 795 THE THIRD ARMORED DIVISION - SPEARHEAD - 28 - Color - The story of one of the finest fighting machines ever fielded by the United States Army is told in this documentary on the Third Armored Division. (PNP, TV)

TV 805 VISION TO VICTORY - 28 Min - Color - To insure the Army is ready for any mission any time and any place is the responsibility of the US Army Combat Development Command. This film depicts CDC's mission to evolve, test, evaluate and finally recommend the concepts which will determine the structure, tactics and equipment of the Army of the future. (PNP, TV)

TV 806 THERE IS A WAY - 28 Min - Color - This film shows the operations of the school and typical experiences of the cadet candidates from their arrival through the intensive academic preparation and physical conditioning, then on to graduation and qualification for entrance to West Point. (PNP, TV)
