

SUMMER HAS BEEN GREAT, BUT NOW IT IS DRAWING TO A CLOSE AND VACATION TIME IS ALMOST OVER!!!!

ARE YOU SURE THAT YOU ARE PREPARED FOR YOUR WINTER ACTIVITY? IS YOUR EQUIPMENT UP TO "SNUFF"? DO YOU HAVE YOUR TRAINING FILMS ON ORDER?

NOW IS A GOOD TIME FOR THAT LAST MINUTE CHECK FOR "WINTERIZATION".

FOR YOUR INFORMATION ARMY PICTORIAL CENTER (APC) HAS BEEN PHASED OUT AND NOW OUR DISTRIBUTION POINT FOR ALL FILMS WILL BE "TOAD", TOBYHANNA ARMY DEPOT, TOBYHANNA, PENNSYLVANIA.

WE DO ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN ADDITIONAL PRINTS ON OUR POPULAR FILMS, HOWEVER, IT IS ALMOST IF NOT IMPOSSIBLE TO RE-ORDER CERTAIN FILMS. WE KNOW THAT THESE FILMS ARE VERY POPULAR WITH THE CIVILIAN USERS, BUT WE CANNOT OBTAIN MORE PRINTS. THEREFORE, THE EARLIER YOU GET YOUR REQUEST IN, THE BETTER CHANCE YOU HAVE TO GET YOUR FILM. REMEMBER WE TAKE REQUESTS UP TO ONE YEAR IN ADVANCE OF SHOWING DATES.

FOR THE SAME REASON, IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT WHEN YOU DO RECEIVE YOUR FILM(S) THAT YOU RETURN THEM ON THE DAY YOU STATE YOU WILL ON YOUR REQUEST. WHEN YOU HOLD A FILM OVER FOR EVEN A FEW DAYS, YOU MAY BE GYPPING ANOTHER ORGANIZATION OF THE USE OF THIS FILM. IF YOU FEEL THAT YOU MUST HAVE AN EXTENSION, CALL AND IF AT ALL POSSIBLE WE WILL MAKE ARRANGEMENTS FOR YOU TO KEEP THE FILM FOR THE DESIRED TIME.

IT IS ALSO VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU TAKE GOOD CARE OF YOUR FILM. MAKE SURE YOU HAVE THE FILM THREADED CORRECTLY IN YOUR PROJECTOR OR YOU MAY DAMAGE IT BEYOND REPAIR. ALL MILITARY USERS MUST POSSESS A VALID DA 11-78 PROJECTIONIST LICENSE. IF YOUR UNIT DOES NOT HAVE A QUALIFIED PROJECTIONIST, WE HAVE OUR NEW FY 70/71 SCHEDULE LISTED ELSEWHERE IN THIS BULLETIN. THIS INCLUDES OUR PROJECTIONIST, PROJECTIONIST INSTRUCTOR AND TRANSPARENCY COURSES.

IT WOULD HELP SPEED UP YOUR NEEDS IF YOU WOULD LIST YOUR REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSPARENCIES, TRAINING FILMS AND CLASSIFIED FILM ON A SEPARATE SET OF DA 11-44'S.

WE NOTE THAT SEVERAL CIVILIAN USERS ARE NOT USING THE DA 11-44 "FILM, FILM STRIPS LOAN ORDER" FORMS. THERE ARE SOME OFFENDERS THAT WE HAVE SENT FORMS TO ON SEVERAL DIFFERENT OCCASIONS HOWEVER, THEY STILL COME IN BY LETTER, NOTE, CARD, ETC. THIS PUTS A TERRIFIC BURDEN ON OUR PERSONNEL. EACH TIME WE MUST TYPE A LETTER, SEND FORMS AND ATTEMPT TO BOOK FILM. WE CANNOT USE YOUR LOCAL FORM OR FORM LETTER. EACH REQUEST MUST BE TYPED ON A DA 11-44 FORM. PLEASE DO NOT REPRODUCE THESE FORMS. IF YOU ARE IN NEED OF MORE FORMS, JUST DROP US A NOTE AND WE WILL BE GLAD TO SEND MORE.

SOON WE WILL BE IN OUR PEAK SEASON AND THIS MEANS A BACK LOG WILL BEGIN ON THIS TYPE OF CORRESPONDENCE. IT WILL BE TO YOUR BENEFIT AND OURS TO USE THESE FORMS. WE RUN ONE OF THE LARGEST MAIL ORDER CONCERNS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY WITH A MINIMUM OF PERSONNEL.

ANOTHER VERY IMPORTANT PART OF OUR SERVICE. A NEW REGULATION CALLS FOR A CERTAIN NUMBER OF SHOWINGS FOR EACH PRINT IN OUR CENTER. IF WE CANNOT PROVE THAT WE ARE UTILIZING THESE PRINTS, WE MAY BE FORCED TO TURN THEM OVER TO ARMY MATERIEL COMMAND (AMC).

IF YOU NOTICE ON THE FORM THAT COMES WITH YOUR FILM, THAT IT IS STAMPED "DO NOT DESTROY - THIS FORM MUST BE RETURNED WITH FILM & INCLUDE SHOWINGS AND ATTENDANCE - DO NOT REWIND FILM". FIND YOUR APPROPRIATE COLUMN (ARMY & CIV COMPONENTS - MEAN REGULAR ARMY, ROTC, NG, RESERVES, ETC AND OTHERS MEAN CIVILIAN USERS, AIR FORCE, NAVY, MARINE, ETC.) TELL US HOW MANY TIMES YOU SHOWED THE FILM AND HOW MANY PEOPLE WERE IN ATTENDANCE. REMEMBER ONLY YOU CAN GIVE US THIS INFORMATION. WITHOUT IT WE MAY LOSE A LARGE NUMBER OF PRINTS.

AS FOR THE REWINDING. WHEN YOU REWIND THE FILM IT MEANS DOUBLE WORK FOR OUR INSPECTORS. EACH FILM AS IT COMES IN MUST BE INSPECTED WHETHER IT WAS SHOWN OR NOT BEFORE IT CAN BE PLACED IN THE RACK FOR FUTURE USE. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ENOUGH TAKE UP REELS LET US KNOW AND WE WILL SEND YOU EXTRA REELS.







NEW RELEASES

The following listed films released since publication of Information Bulletin 4-70, May 1970, are now available from the Fifth U. S. Army Central Audio-Visual Support Center. Clearance will be given for each film after the synopsis. NOTE: Only films cleared for public use can be loaned other than DOD activities and films loaned to active Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force and NG, are NOT TO BE RELOANED to other organizations. This is per AR 108-30, Para 3-12. Films must be used in their entirity.

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AFIF 196 MARIJUANA (Drug Abuse) (Color - 34 Min)

Examines the facts about physical changes, emotional dependency and the legal implications of marijuana.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

AFIF 198 THE PEOPLE VS POT (Drug Abuse) (B&W - 30 Min)

Delineates the marijuana problem in terms of its dire effects on users. Emphasis is placed on the DOD position on the use of marijuana within the military establishment.

CLEARANCE: Cleared for Public non-profit and non-sponsored TV showing.

MF 8-5539 YOU IN OPD (Outpatient Department) (Color - 23 Min)

This film teaches hospital personnel how to maintain a cheerful clinic atmosphere and harmonious relations with outpatients.

CLEARANCE: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

MF 16-5541 MIRROR, MIRROR (Color - 25 Min)

This is the story of a young High School student who is unhappy and uncomfortable with his peers because of a poor self image, and how he overcomes this feeling.

CLEARANCE: Cleared for military personnel, their dependents and authorized DoD civilian personnel.

TF 3-4085 RADIAC INSTRUMENTS - PART II - ION CHAMBERS METERS (B&W - 19 Min)

Describes the characteristics, use, functioning, and maintenance of the Army's standard dose-rate radiacimeters IM-174A/PD & IM-174/PD.

CLEARANCE: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 3-4086 RADIAC INSTRUMENTS - PART III - G-M INSTRUMENTS (B&W - 16 Min)

(TF 3-4086 con't)

Describes the characteristics, use, functioning, and maintenance of the Army's standard personnel and equipment monitoring radiac set, the AN/PDR-27.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 3-4100 NUCLEAR BURST REPORTING (Color - 16 Min)

Demonstrates the steps in gathering information for the NBC 1 Nuclear Report used to determine nuclear yield and to make fallout predictions. Stress is placed on observer's location, flash-to-bang time, cloud width, and azimuth to attack to determine location of ground zero and nuclear yield. (Replaces TF 3-3139 which is now obsolete)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 8-4145 OPERATING ROOM PROCEDURES (Color - 41 Min)

Illustrates the duties of the circulating and scrub specialists, covering: pre-operative preparations, activities during surgery, and post-operative procedures. (Replaces TF 8-2383 which is now obsolete)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 9-4163 LAND COMBAT SUPPORT SYSTEM (Color - 20 Min)

Film depicts field emplacement of LCSS, physical layout of the test stations and shop equipment coordinated with a functional block diagram.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 10-4158 MEMORIAL ACTIVITIES - PART III - CONCURRENT RETURN PROGRAM (Color - 22 Min)

This film delineates the Army Mortuary Affairs program into four programs: Current Death, Graves Registration, Return of Remains, and Concurrent Return. Depicts recovery, identification, care and disposition of deceased personnel for whom DA is responsible.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4001 AUTHORITY AND THE SOLDIER (Color - 15 Min)

Film shows that rank, alone, does not always imply that an individual has authority; in the military, authority can also be based on special skills or training; that every soldier, even though under authority still has freedom. (Replaces TF 16-3333 which is now obsolete)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4002 GROUP LIVING AND THE SOLDIER (Color - 18 Min)

This film explains the basic concepts of group living and how it applies to the individual soldier. (Replaces TF16-3537)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4003 HONOR AND THE SOLDIER (Color - 16 Min)

This film delineates the basic relationship of honor to duty and country.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4004 HERITAGE AND THE SOLDIER (Color - 18 Min)

This film summarizes the important themes which underlie the American heritage. (Replaces TF 16-2981)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4005 DUTY AND THE SOLDIER (Color - 16 Min)

This film was developed in response to a need for finding some way to "get through" to today's young men who come into the service - an awareness of the importance of a sense of duty. (Replaces TF 16-3148)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4006 MY COUNTRY (Color - 13 Min)

Delineates the diversity and ideals that is America, as well as her problems and potential, to evoke an awareness within the individual of his relationship and responsibility to his country. (Replaces TF 16-2790 and TF 16-3472)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4007 THE REAL PERSON (Color - 10 Min)

Portrays the problem of Private Johnny Cool, a man desperately in search of his own identity. Conveys the essence of what is involved in being a genuine personality.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4008 RESPONSIBILITY (Color - 8 Min)

Delineates the meaning and importance of responsible adult behavior for the good of the individual soldier and for the country.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 16-4009 HAPPY NEW YEAR - HARRY & AL (Color - 15 Min)

Flashbacks into the lives of two old friends point up the (cont)

importance of perserverance and endurance in making personnal and professional progress. Al's lack of these traits results in a steadily deteriorating image, whereas hard-working Harry achieves success.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components.

TF 16-4010 MY BIRTHRIGHT (Color - 8 Min)

Delineates the importance of the individual in our democracy, and stresses the fact that the freedoms of the individual are protected by the Bill of Rights.

TF 16-4011 FAIR PLAY (Color - 8 Min)

Delineates the importance of listening to both sides of the story before making judgement. It does not help to blame others for your own shortcomings.

TF 19-3951 CIVIL DISTURBANCES - PART II - PLANNING FOR CONTROL
(Color - 33 Min)

An overall view of the advance planning necessary for control of civil disturbances by local, state, and federal authorities. Focus is placed on the four major planning areas: intelligence, personnel, logistics, and operations.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components.

TF 21-4152 JUNGLE SURVIVAL (Color - 36 Min)

Describes the characteristics of savanna, rain and cloud forests, and mangrove swamps; and shows how four airmen maintain personal health and implement the procedures for promoting rescue.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 21-4153 RESCUE - SURVIVER'S RESPONSIBILITIES (Color - 37 Min)

Shows downed pilots how to help rescuers achieve a successful recovery on land or sea, highlighting use of MA-1 Survival Kit, Fulton Recovery System of boarding ships or seaplanes, contact with pararescue personnel, and use of rescue devices.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 21-4155 MOUNTAIN AND DESERT SURVIVAL - MOUNTAIN SURVIVAL
(Color - 28 Min)

Describes the principles and procedures for promoting rescue and maintaining personal health and comfort, focusing on sources of food and water, shelter construction, and signal devices.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 21-4156 MOUNTAIN AND DESERT SURVIVAL - DESERT SURVIVAL
(Color - 31 Min)

Describes the principles and procedures for promoting rescue and maintaining personal health and comfort, focusing on: sources of food and water, shelter construction, and signal devices.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 44-4133 AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY WEAPON SYSTEM, CHAPARRAL, SP -
PART I - INTRODUCTION: THE CHAPARRAL SQUAD IN ACTION
(Color - 28 Min)

A Chaparral Squad moves into a new position and organizes to provide area defense. The Squad engages hostile enemy aircraft in defense of a convoy. The Squad is then deployed against an enemy counterattack.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 44-4134 AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY WEAPON SYSTEM, CHAPARRAL, SP -
PART III - TARGET ENGAGEMENT TECHNIQUES
(B&W - 20 Min)

A Chaparral Squad emplaces where fields of view are clear, employs the FAAR, TADDS, and visual surveillance to detect and identify enemy aircraft, and engages single and multiple hostile targets.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 44-4135 AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY WEAPON SYSTEM, CHAPARRAL, SP -
PART II - EMPLACEMENT AND PREPARATION FOR ACTION
(B&W - 24 Min)

Film demonstrates the action of a Chaparral squad as it emplaces and prepares the weapon system for action.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 46-4115 THE CH-54 TARHE (Flying Crane) - EMERGENCY
(Color - 24 Min)

Illustrates emergency procedures required to meet common malfunctions in the four main categories of aircraft emergencies: Fires, Electrical Failures, Hydraulic Failures, and Engine Failures.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

TF 46-4165 THE CH-54 TARHE (Flying Crane) - BASIC CHARACTERISTICS
(B&W - 29 Min)

Describes the features the operation of the basic components and systems of the CH-54A and CH-54B, the unique flying controls and procedures used in both models, and the capabilities of each helicopter.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

Describes the guidelines and workings of the US Post Office mechanized mail system, and underscores the importance of proper mail preparation to expedite delivery at minimum cost.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components, primarily for all Army employees concerned with mail preparation and handling to include typists, stenographers, and mail room personnel.

T(GTA)3-3-1(1-4) Rev AUTOMATIC ATROpine INJECTOR (Color)

Illustrates the design and functioning of the automatic atropine injector, how it is stored in the protective mask carrier, and its proper use to counteract the effects of nerve agents. (Replaces T(GTA)3-3-1(1-3) which is now obsolete.)

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)3-6(1-8) MARKINGS OF U.S. CHEMICAL MUNITIONS (Color)

Illustrates the markings on US Chemical grenades, mortar and artillery shells, candles and smoke pots, gas and smoke bombs, incendiary bombs and rockets, and safe destroying equipment & mines.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)3-13

PARTS: AIRPLANE SMOKE TANK M10 (B&W)

Illustrates the components of the air inlet assembly and the discharge line assembly.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components, only.

T(GTA)3-28-1

ASSEMBLY AND DISASSEMBLY MAT, PORTABLE FLAME THROWER M2A1-7 (B&W)

Illustrates the components of the fuel hose, valve grip assembly, barrel and inlet body assembly, and ignition section.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)5-11-9(1-11)

PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE OF HEAVY ENGINEER EQUIPMENT - AIR COMPRESSOR, 100 PSI (B&W)

Illustrates the before operation, during operation, and after operation services performed on the 210-CFM Gasoline Driven Air Compressor and the 600-CFM Diesel Driven Rotary Air Compressor.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)8-4(1-39)

MOSQUITO-BORNE DISEASES (Color)

Covers the causes, symptoms, and control of the important mosquito-borne diseases: 1] Malaria, 2] Yellow Fever, 3] Dengue, 4] Encephalitis, and 5] Filariasis.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)8-17(1-37)

PERSONAL HEALTH (B&W)

Presents the guidelines to safeguard the soldier's health against infection and disease in the field, covering: personal hygiene, field sanitation, water purification, foot care, diet and clothing, and defense against germs and insects.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)9-3-92(1-2)

COLLIMATOR M1 (Color)

Illustrates the operation of Collimator M1 used with artillery and mortars.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.

T(GTA)9-4-108

FUZE SETTER, M26 (B&W)

Illustrates the proper use of the M26 Fuze Setter and fuze setting for rounds of ammunition.

CLEARANCES: Cleared for Armed Forces and civilian components only.
