Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In the October issue of the United Labor Action, we condemned the racist violence against Black school children in Boston right on the front page. C.U.L.A. in Boston has fought against these attacks too, in demonstrations, leafletting in South Boston and saying far and wide "RACISM HURTS ALL WORKING PEOPLE."

We have learned in our unions that we can win grievances and better contracts and enforce our contracts if everyone pulls together to do it! Bosses use racism to pit white against Black and keep us from defending our working conditions. To get unity and strength, we must put racism down forever.

Now thousands are joining in this fight.

The Emergency Committee for a National Mobilization Against Racism has called a National Freedom March and Rally for Human Dignity for Saturday December 14.

We are going to Boston for this urgent and important demonstration against racism and hope you will join us, too.

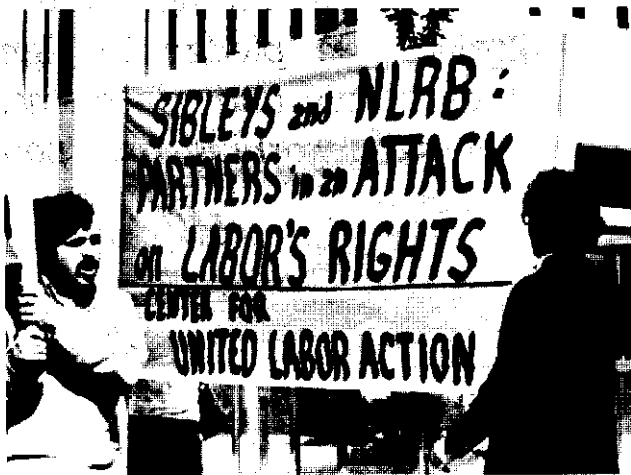
***1974 brought many of us together
