Dear Friend,

The action of President Ford in granting a full and complete pardon to resigned President Nixon is constitutional, patriotic and humane. Nevertheless, the cries of outrage are thunderous. While some of the criticism is motivated by political partisanship and some by personal vindictiveness, there is a genuine concern in many quarters that the law has been applied unequally. It seems inappropriate that many involved in the Watergate fiasco should be sent to prison while the leader is spared that fate.

I do not believe that perfect justice is possible in this imperfect world. I believe that the magnitude of the transgressions of those involved in Watergate has been exaggerated unconscionably and the sooner the whole episode is terminated, the better it will be for this country. The attempt to balance relative culpabilities perfectly is foredoomed to failure and could consume the energies of thousands for years ahead. That energy is needed for major problems which threaten the well-being of all. This is an appropriate time to follow the example of St. Paul when he wrote: "Forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press towards the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." Phil. 3:13-14

The road ahead is perilous and all our energy should be devoted to the preservation of freedom and reasonable prosperity. I applaud the action of President Ford because it frees creative energy for the real battles of this era. The central battle is with communism.

The record of President Nixon with regard to communism was mixed. After many years of fighting communism vigorously, he executed the policies that helped Communist China achieve a position of great power and prestige in the United Nations and throughout the world. By easing trade restrictions, he strengthened the Soviet Union industrially and militarily. His problems were complex and his burdens heavy, but the verdict remains--"communist power increased relative to that of the U.S.A. during the Nixon presidency."

With the new regime in Washington, a new campaign should be instituted to reveal the merciless heart of communism: its doctrines of atheism, materialism, class war, revolution, dictatorship, and class extermination. Solzhenitsyn has stated that the administrative brutality of communism, as revealed in his book, *The Gulag Archipelago*, is a natural and expected consequence of communist doctrines. War against the doctrines must be waged heroically and perseveringly. These doctrines are accepted in the Soviet Union, in Communist China and in Communist Cuba and by many in the U.S.A. Detente should never be permitted to obscure this vital truth.

The Crusade concentrates upon an exposure of the false doctrines of communism and the activities that flow from them. In this war there can be no truce. We need the weapons to project the words that can dispel error and bring deliverance. Lectures, seminars, literature, radio and television are essential and these cost. By sending a contribution to spread the message, you serve in the army of truth.
