Dear Friend,

I have recently enjoyed a delightful visit with my son John, his wife Rosalie and their four children-- Katherine, Jane, Sarah and John Michael.

John is a doctor serving at Emmaus Lutheran Hospital for the Zulus in Natal, South Africa. The hospital is located at the foot of the Drakenberg Ranges whose peaks soar 11,000 feet into the heavens. It serves a constituency of 100,000 Zulus who live in most primitive conditions. The basic dwelling is a small hut with a dirt floor and thatched roof known as a rondeval. The Zulus live in extended family groups so a number of these rondevals are grouped together forming a kraal. Sometimes there is a small corral to enclose the cattle and goats owned by the family. Most kraals lack water and toilet facilities. They are scattered in no discernible pattern over the hills surrounding the hospital. Numerous individuals and groups walk along the dusty roads. The women carry enormous bundles on their heads and often have babies wrapped to their backs while the men carry a stick. This stick is related to the historic male role as hunter and fighter.

During the 1974-75 year, the average daily bed occupancy at Emmaus Hospital was 195, 18,500 outpatients were treated, 124 major and 984 minor operations were performed, while 761 babies were delivered. The commonest operation is Caesarean Section, and I assisted at a number of these. I enjoyed my temporary return to active medical work.

The work of the hospital is carried on by two doctors, a matron and a team of excellent nurses. The doctors and matron are white while the nursing staff is black. In addition to their nursing duties, the nurses serve as interpreters as the patients speak only Zulu.

A Zulu chaplain ministers to the spiritual needs of the hospital constituency. It was a challenging assignment to speak at the chapel with the chaplain interpreting.

Rosalie is establishing a library as many of the nurses are studying English. The service John and Rosalie are giving gladdens my heart.
