## THE VIETNAMESE CONQUEST OF CAMBODIA--EVIL OUT OF GOOD

Who can deny that the overthrow of the Pol Pot regime in Cambodia is a good thing? The paradox is that this good event increases the danger of communist world conquest, which is evil.

The Pol Pot communist regime in Cambodia was indescribably murderous. Words are inadequate to depict the horrors and hardships it inflicted upon the Cambodian people. While accurate statistics cannot be obtained, estimates of those killed during its brief reign range from one to three million.

The communist rulers of Cambodia surpassed Stalin and Hitler in barbarism, cruelty, and genocide. Without prior notice, they drove the population from the cities into the countryside with total inhumanity. The description of hospital beds containing patients, who had just undergone surgery, with a bottle of blood suspended to give a blood transfusion, being wheeled by family members along dusty roads while the hot sun beat down, competes in horror with recent amputees being carried on the backs of living relatives. (All this is described in the book, *Murder of a Gentle Land*, by John Barron and Anthony Paul.) The survivors were forced to work for long hours, 7 days each week, without medical service, money, schools, books, or postal service. Families were scattered and forced to change their names so that they could never be reunited. Romance was forbidden. An adolescent boy could be executed for the crime of placing his arm around a girl. Marriage partners were selected by the communist authorities and forcibly united. It is doubtful if history records any regime of equal barbarity.

All this was done with the alleged objective of creating a new communist man. The leaders of the Cambodian Communist regime took the doctrines of Marx and Lenin with the utmost seriousness and set out to destroy the old society ruthlessly and rapidly. The sufferings of the Cambodian people were due to the doctrines of communism being applied consistently.

### Re-education in Vietnam

The Vietnamese conquerors confess faith in the same communist doctrines but they apply them more slowly. They, too, have created a hell on earth as proven by the fact that scores of thousands of Vietnamese are prepared to load their families into leaky and overcrowded boats and set forth upon the turbulent oceans with limited food and fuel, and no place of refuge. Their destination is some inhospitable shore or death. However, the Vietnamese Communists have concentrated upon "re-education" camps where they are overworked and underfed, and the therapy of "labor" is combined with interminable lectures espousing the doctrines and glories of Marxism-Leninism to lead to a changed outlook or, frequently, to the grave. Few have returned.

### Increase of Soviet Strength

Vietnam is a colleague and dependency of the Soviet Union, whereas Cambodia received the

commendation and support of Communist China. The conquest of Cambodia by Vietnam is thus a victory for the Soviet Union. It adds to the forces at the disposal of the Soviet Union for the conquest of the world. It must never be forgotten that the formula for communist conquest of the U.S.A. is: "External encirclement, plus internal demoralization, plus thermonuclear blackmail, leads to progressive surrender." Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia contain 63 million people and vast military power so that the encircling might of communism is considerably increased.

### Communism Causes War

Although the Vietnamese conquest of Cambodia increases the danger of the communist conquest of the U.S.A., there are a few positive side effects which can be used effectively in the battle against communism if we have sufficient understanding and intelligence. One of these is that the war between these two communist countries should drive the final nail into the coffin of the Marxist doctrine that capitalism is the cause of war and that the victory of communism abolishes the danger of war. The doctrine that communism will abolish war has been one of the attractions of Marxism since its inception. Whittaker Chambers, who joined the communist party as a young intellectual and served it faithfully as an espionage agent before repenting and writing the magnificent book "Witness", stated that every intelligent person of his acquaintance who became a communist was recruited by the promise that communism would abolish war and depression. Millions have joined the ranks of the communists because of this conviction.

The argument that persuades educated and intelligent students that capitalism causes war is one of the greatest achievements of Marx. It is neat and plausible, and in the absence of historical experience it is most convincing. The argument appears so logical and convincing that I have always been reluctant to present it to a high school class lest they be convinced of its truth.

In essence the argument claims that because of the surplus value of labor or profit, the amount of money distributed in the capitalist process of production over the long term is never quite enough to buy the goods produced. Therefore, production inevitably leads to overproduction with inadequate purchasing power being distributed among the population. This leads to recession and depression. The argument then states that relief from depression is brought about by war which distributes money to the population, without producing consumer goods that can be purchased, so that the accumulated surplus production can be bought.

According to this argument, war is a necessary component of the capitalist cycle of production. Once this is accepted, it is easy to assume that the abolition of capitalism will simultaneously abolish war.

The communists are still trying to use this argument, but the history of communism destroys it utterly. One has only to remember the Soviet invasion of Hungary and Czechoslovakia and the border conflicts between the communist giants, The Soviet Union and Communist China. This recent war between the communist countries, Vietnam and Cambodia, should eliminate totally any vestiges of the attraction of the doctrine which remains.

While realizing the significance of the addition to Soviet strength, which the Vietnamese conquest of Cambodia brings to pass, the United States must not be maneuvered into the situation where it supports, or appears to support, the Pol Pot regime in Cambodia. Such support will make any professed devotion to human rights appear hypocritical in the extreme.

## IRAN

Events in Iran continue in a state of flux, and it is difficult to predict what the final outcome will be. The seriousness of the situation is illustrated by the fact that Iran, which only a few months ago exported more oil than any other country in the world except Saudi Arabia, is now being supplied with oil by the United States. A combination of mass demonstrations and industrial strikes has reduced Iran to destitution and chaos and caused the Shah to leave Iran, leaving in his place a Regency Council and a shaky government led by an opponent of the Shah called Baktiar.

The apparent master mind of the revolution, Shi-ite Moslem leader Ayatollah Khomeyni, who directed the strikes and demonstrations from Paris, is not satisfied with the Baktiar Government and has demanded its overthrow. He announced he was returning to Iran to set up a Moslem state. It is possible that such a state would be modeled upon Libya as some of the close associates of Khomeyni are close to Colonel Gadhafi of Libya. However, much of the army remains loyal to the Shah and at the time of writing, they have prevented the return of Khomeyni with the consequence that the mass demonstrations and strikes continue. While bloodshed is not yet massive, it is continuous with frequent reports of about 30 being killed during a typical massive demonstration.

### The Communist Role

What role are the communists playing in all this? They are keeping a low profile but are active, particularly in the organization of the strikes. Their instrument "the Tudeh Party" is small but superbly organized. They are not trying to make a communist revolution at this time. They seek to reach their objective by steps rather than in one jump. They will assist the Moslems to overthrow the Shah and to create a Moslem State which will break the alliance between Iran and the western powers and seek improved relations with the Soviet Union. The communists are confident that the new government will be unable to solve the problems of the Iranian people and that disillusionment and discontent will grow. This will provide the communists with opportunities to increase their strength and possibly overthrow the Moslem State and replace it by a "Peoples Republic". This republic will make an alliance with the Soviet Union and one of the major goals of the Soviet will be attained. The oil of Iran which formerly fueled the furnaces of Western Europe, Japan, Israel, South Africa, and the United States will now be a weapon for the Soviet conquest of the world.

### The Vietnam Example

The situation is reminiscent of that which existed in Vietnam at the time of the overthrow of Diem in 1963. Diem was accused of cruelty and corruption as the Shah has been accused. The campaign against Diem was led by the Buddhists instead of the Moslems. The campaign became so successful that President Kennedy went on television in an interview with Walter Cronkite and advised that there should be a change of policy and personnel in Vietnam. Various military leaders interpreted this as an instruction to get rid of Diem, which they proceeded to do forthwith, and Diem was assassinated.

The elimination of Diem, however, made the problems worse. The regimes which replaced his were unable to govern and were quickly overthrown so that chaos and instability increased throughout the country. These conditions promoted the growth of the communist party, and today communism reigns.

The repercussions of events in Iran are being felt all round the world but particularly in the Middle East and South Africa. South Africa has no oil of its own and Iran has been its major source of that commodity. Israel has also received most of its oil from Iran. Khomeyni has announced that his government will cease supplying oil to both South Africa and Israel. Already there is talk of imposing gasoline rationing in South Africa.

Saudi Arabia is alarmed by the apparent impotence of the United States and is reassessing its situation relative to the Soviet Union.

The lesson of recent events seems to be clear. When considering what has taken place in Vietnam, Ethiopia, Angola, and Afghanistan, it is difficult to escape the conclusion that the Soviet Union can and will help its friends effectively while the United States can or will not.

The outcome of the revolution in Iran will indicate how close to world conquest the communists are. Iran should be saved from communism, whatever the cost.

### CHANGES OF ENGLISH SPELLING OF CHINESE WORDS

Among the many changes taking place in Communist China, changes in the English spelling of Chinese words must be included.

Peking Review has now become Beijing Review, and the January 5 issue reports:

"China's State Council has recently decided to use the Chinese phonetic alphabet to standardize the Romanization of Chinese names of persons and places.

"According to the decision, all publications and documents in English, French, German, Spanish and other languages put out in China will, starting from New Year's Day this year, use the Chinese phonetic alphabet in spelling Chinese names of persons and places.

"Beijing Review will also, starting from this issue, use the Chinese phonetic alphabet to Romanize Chinese names and place names.

"In accordance with the Chinese phonetic alphabet, the late Chairman Mao Tsetung's name will be spelt 'Mao Zedong'; the late Premier Chou En-lai's name will be 'Zhou Enlai'; and the late Chairman of the Standing Committee of the People's Congress, Chu Teh will be 'Zhu De.'

"Following are names of Party leaders of China Romanized according to the Chinese phonetic alphabet. The old spelling is in brackets for reference.

"Chairman of the Central Committee of the Chinese Communist Party: Hua Guofeng (Hua Kuo-feng)

"Vice-Chairmen of the Party Central Committee: Ye Jianying (Yeh Chien-ying); Deng Xiaoping (Teng Hsiao-ping)." (Pages 18 and 19)

The spelling of the name of the former President of China, Liu Shao-Chi, like his whereabouts and whether he is alive or dead, remains unspecified.

## THE PROBLEMS OF SOUTH AFRICA

In an article by Glen Tinder in the January 27 edition of the New Republic entitled "Liberals and Revolution: The Price of a Moral Posture Without Personal Risk", the author discusses the moral condition of U.S. liberals who profit materially from their advocacy of a redistribution of wealth, which, if carried out, would reduce them to poverty. He writes:

"Most liberal reformers in America can consolidate, if not improve, their social and professional standing through their political activities. It is hard to know, even in one's own case, whether a commitment that costs nothing has any substance... Deploring the poverty of the common people in Asia and Africa is for most of us morally invigorating and at the same time agreeably inexpensive." (Page 22)

This is particularly true of those academics, politicians and other well-meaning citizens who, from their own vantage point of affluence and security, are demanding drastic changes which threaten the prosperity and security of millions in Southern Africa.

The problems in Rhodesia and South Africa are awesome in their complexity and magnitude. Consider, for example, the racial problem. Compare the situation in South Africa with that in Canada, where the presence of the French-speaking minority, who constitute a majority in the Province of Quebec, threatens to tear that nation asunder.

In South Africa there is not one racial problem but many, and attempts to solve one of these problems may exacerbate others.

### Population

The population of South Africa is about 25 million and is divided into four major divisions but each of these divisions can be further subdivided into conflicting groups.

The four major groups are:

1. White: There are 4-1/2 million, approximately.
2. Black: There are about 17 million.
3. Colored: There are about 2-1/2 million. They are the offspring of black and white parents.
4. Asian: There are about one million, mostly Indian.

Imagine the problems that would be caused in any nation by the presence of any two of these groups.

### English and Afrikaans

In South Africa this is only the beginning of the problem. None of these groups is homogeneous. The whites are divided into the Afrikaans-speaking and the English-speaking. The English-speaking are mostly descended from settlers from England, while those who speak Afrikaans are descended from the Dutch and are known as Boers. A bitter Anglo-Boer war was fought in 1899-1902 in which the British were victorious. Since then the Boer population has increased more than the English; they are the majority and dominate politically. The teaching of Afrikaans is now compulsory in all schools. If there were no blacks, colored or Asians in South Africa, the problems caused by the division between the Boers and the English would be serious.

The whites dominate politically and economically and this is, of course, unjust. The problem is to discover and apply a system that will give justice to all. This is not as easy as it sounds. If "one man,

one vote" is applied, the blacks will assume control. How can the rights of the minority races be assured in such circumstances? The Indians remember the treatment they received from the black leader, Idi Amin, in Uganda and tremble. The whites remember the flight of the whites from Mozambique and Angola after the blacks assumed power in those countries. They are also painfully aware of the fact that whereas the Indians in Uganda could go to England or India, and the whites in Mozambique and Angola could go to Portugal, most white South Africans have no place of refuge. Their forefathers have lived in South Africa for about 300 years, and they are Africans through and through.

The blacks are not one homogeneous family. There are many major tribes. These include: 1) The Zulus, 2) The Xhosa, 3) The Tswana, 4) The Sotho, 5) The Shangaan, 6) The Swazi, 7) The Udebele, 8) The Venda.

It is an understatement to say that members of one tribe distrust members of a different tribe. An Australian with whom I am acquainted was walking with an educated Zulu along a street in a major South African city. They needed directions, and the Australian asked his black companion to seek help from another black man who was walking towards them. His companion refused and said, "He may be a member of a different tribe."

Relations within tribes are not always harmonious. Faction fights are frequent and the fight is to the death. I visited South Africa last November, and in December a faction fight among certain Zulus broke out, not far from the hospital where I had stayed, and 18 men were killed in one night.

Any reasonable person must agree that the problems are real and grievous, and the question is how to solve them. The solution, "One man, one vote," is oversimplified to the point of absurdity. It is reminiscent of the solution Will Rogers proffered to the submarine problem during the 1914-1918 war. He said, "Boil the ocean." When asked how this was to be achieved, he blithely replied, "You don't expect me to give you all the details, do you?"

The solution provided by the present South African Government is "separate development" and "homelands". The races are kept apart socially though they work together. The name given to this policy of "separate development" is Apartheid, and this word has become anathema in most nations of the world. In practice it means keeping the blacks in an inferior position politically, economically, and socially within South Africa. Consequently South Africa has become a pariah in many countries. Individuals who are ignorant of the complexity of conditions in South Africa and who share none of the risks are self-righteously indignant about the actions of the South African Government and confidently proclaim what it must do. Many wish to stop all U.S. investment in South Africa. They are unmoved by the fact that this will cause unemployment and suffering for hundreds of thousands of blacks. These "liberals" are prepared to accept any suffering provided it is borne by others. They know what is good for the blacks better than the responsible black spokesmen such as Chief Buthelezi of the Zulus who opposes this program because of the suffering it will cause to the blacks.

Along with the practice of Apartheid, the South African Government is setting aside areas of land within South Africa for the different tribes. The tribe which occupies the land is classified as a separate independent nation by the South African Government. For example, the Xhosa tribe was given a substantial area along the southeast coast, and it is known as the Transkei nation. Other nations claim that this is merely a device by South Africa and do not recognize the independence of the Transkei, despite the fact that it has its own government led by the Prime Minister, Kaiser Mantazima.

## THE PRISONERS OF EAST GERMANY

The East Germans are prisoners in the most literal sense of the word. They are confined behind a wall and face death if they try to escape.

The East German Government has finished a 635-mile segment of a 9-foot high fence along its western border from the Baltic Sea to the Czechoslovakian frontier.

It has taken 5 years to complete this portion of the fence at an estimated cost of \$500,000 to \$1 million per mile.

When completed, the fence will be 825 miles long.

The fence forms part of a highly elaborate system containing sophisticated killer devices and patrols by border guards designed to discourage ungrateful East German citizens fleeing the "heaven" of "existing socialism" to the "hell" of capitalism.

The fence has been described as a mesh of razorsharp metal triangles which are just big enough to admit fingers for a hand-hold. This mesh hangs loosely from cement posts sunk 3 feet into the ground and set 5 feet apart. The looseness is purposeful. If a man sticks his fingers in the mesh to climb, his weight makes it sag and the triangles close, amputating his fingers.

In addition, two anti-personnel mines are strapped to the east side of each post, one at head level and one at knee level. They are armed with a quarter-pound TNT and a half-pound of buckshot. They are aimed along the fence, and if one facing south is tripped, the next facing north also goes off catching anyone between them in a crossfire.

The communists mean to keep what they have while they continually conquer new areas.
