Your formula, *EXTERNAL ENCIRCLEMENT PLUS INTERNAL DEMORALIZATION PLUS THERMO-NUCLEAR BLACKMAIL LEADS TO PROGRESSIVE SURRENDER*, is an encapsulation of the communist faith and program, as John 3:16 is an encapsulation of the Christian faith and program.

I know you seek no praise or reward or kudos for yourself. I know how great have been the sacrifices your dedicated service has required of you and your equally dedicated loved ones. I can only express my grateful appreciation of the privilege I have had of being associated with you in this, the *CHRISTIAN ANTI-COMMUNISM CRUSADE*, which you have inspired and led these many years.

"Well done, thou good and faithful servant" -- and may your service to God and man be expanded in length, breadth, height and depth in the years ahead.

THE DEATH OF A COMMUNIST DOCTRINE

Pity the poor communists! They are standing watch over the corpse of one of their most cherished doctrines. No longer can they proclaim proudly that the triumph of Socialism means the abolition of war. This doctrine had been wounded by such events as the Soviet invasions of Hungary and Czechoslovakia and the border fighting between the Soviet Union and Communist China; it has now been killed by the invasion of "Socialist" Cambodia by "Socialist" Vietnam, and the invasion of "Socialist" Vietnam by "Socialist" China.

The anguish of convinced communists is revealed in this plaintive editorial published in the **GUARDIAN**, February 28:

These are sorry days for socialism, despite continuing advances by the world's peoples against oppression and exploitation.

China has invaded Vietnam. Vietnam has invaded Kampuchea. The words evoke nausea. Where will it end?

U.S. imperialism, the principal enemy, watches patiently, hypocritically proclaiming "neutrality." Unable to defeat the forces of revolution in hot and cold wars, it is content to maneuver skillfully between the contradictions which have set socialist against socialist, exacerbating problems wherever possible. It is hoping its working-class enemies will exhaust themselves. It is coiled snakelike, waiting to strike, waiting to cripple socialism and prolong the life of moribund monopoly capitalism with the help of socialism itself. Such help, in this case, comes in the form of wars between socialist countries or in offers of a tacit alliance (a la China) against the USSR.

Is this why the men and women of the Paris Commune, the Bolshevik Revolution, the Chinese Revolution and a thousand uprisings, insurrections, liberation struggles, revolutions and wars carried out in the name of human dignity and equality have so courageously given their blood and lives?

Marx, Engels, Lenin, Stalin, Mao and Ho—imperfect beings all, perhaps, but the vehicles to convey to the masses the message of humankind's historic dream of a classless society of cooperation—we pity your unquiet sleep. More, we pity those for whom your dream of socialist internationalism and friendship between nations has become a nightmare in a small corner of Asia so rich of late in heroes, so poor as yet in rice. More, we dread for the future of the dream throughout the world unless these sons and daughters of the founders of scientific socialism—class comrades all—cease their fire and return to their homes.

China, Vietnam, Kampuchea. The names evoke pride. How can these brave comrades slay each other? It is obscene to cheer on one side or the other. Communist lives are being shattered. We are internationalists. We do not agree with the epithets—fascist, capitalist, reactionary—that are being used to justify aggression in Southeast Asia. It is unforgivable that the conflicts between the three socialist countries were allowed to get so far out of hand.

It is a vicious cycle. China fears the USSR and wishes to "punish" a Soviet ally on its southern border. Vietnam fears China and lashes out—ostensibly only because of border provocations—at a small country situated on its

southwestern border which also happens to be China's ally in the region. Kampuchea fears Vietnam, the ally of its ally's enemy. Granted the particular contradictions which developed between each state, what has all this to do with socialism, the new dawn in international relations between class friends and close neighbors?

Looming on the horizon is the Soviet Union, enemy of China, friend of Vietnam, enemy of Kampuchea, gauging how much "punishment" the Chinese have in mind for Vietnam before taking steps which could possibly—even against its intentions—trigger a socialist world war.

There is no precedent for the present predicament. True, the USSR invaded Czechoslovakia, but the Prague government was already in a vassal relationship to Moscow, which was bad enough but different from the events in Asia. True, Somalia and Ethiopia, engaged in a short, bitter territorial war last year but the "socialism" of both countries was problematic.

A SETBACK FOR WORLD REVOLUTION

China, Vietnam and Kampuchea fought protracted wars against imperialist invaders and sharp class struggles to establish their own roads to socialism. When such fraternal societies fight each other it is not only a setback for world revolution but contains the potential for the destruction of socialism (see related news story p. 14).

Are we now to accept the thesis that war between socialist states in an inevitable, permissible extension of policy, as it is in wars between imperialist states or between imperialism and socialism? We do not accept this. Marxist-Leninists have no material basis for going to war with Marxist-Leninists.

The world is still in the era of imperialism—an era that is dying but not yet replaced by the era of socialism, which is just dawning. This presents certain problems for socialist countries, of course. But if our vision of the socialist era is that wars are avoidable—as opposed to the capitalist, feudal and slave eras—will not the principles established in the formative period help determine the practical outcome of that vision? The operative principle in this regard is respect for the territorial sovereignty of socialist countries and for the right of each to independently develop its own social system. This is not an immutable principle, for such do not exist. It is a principle based upon historic realities and necessities, a logical outgrowth of the struggle to eliminate classes. It can be tampered with only at great risk.

As the power of the communists to persuade diminishes, they are dependent more and more upon their power to blackmail and coerce by brute force. Unfortunately, their growing military might gives them increasing power to do this.

The attitude of the U.S. Communist Party towards the convening of a national constitutional convention to mandate a balanced federal budget is shown by this editorial which appeared in the Daily World, March 3:

An attack on the Constitution

DAILY WORLD In the name of "populism" and a balanced budget, right wing forces in the United States are spearheading what could be one of the more sinister developments in recent times — calling of a national constitutional convention.

The major thrust for such a convention comes from the right-wing National Taxpayers Union, which has been joined by anti-abortion forces. The call has so far been endorsed by 28 states: 34 are needed to convene the convention.

Such a convention could rewrite any or all of the U.S. Constitution, including the Bill of Rights.

This is not a democratic move. The people of the United States would no more be represented in such a convention than they are now in Congress by the two parties of big business.

Some of the constitutional amendments being proposed are downright fascistic: denying the vote to the poor, forbidding abortion, outlawing the integration of schools and jobs.

The banner for this campaign is a "balanced budget." We are not opposed to balancing federal spending and income — the question is how. Unfortunately we know too well what the right-wing and the military-industrialists mean when they talk about balance. They mean balancing massive increases in military spending with massive cuts in social services to the people.

The people of the United States have made it clear what they want: jobs, peace, security, and an end to racism. We don't need a constitutional convention for that. We need a powerful mass movement to force the implementation of the Constitution we already have.

It is not surprising that the communists should be opposed to the democratic and constitutional processes of convening a constitutional convention since they are anti-democratic and totalitarian. It is surprising that others, who profess to uphold the authority of the Constitution and to support the democratic process, are similarly opposed. Those who oppose such a convention "in principle", because they think the people cannot be trusted, reveal: 1) They oppose the Constitution which provides for the convening of such a convention; 2) They are authoritarians who think the proper role for the people is to shut up and leave all decisions to the politicians.

The situation in California is most interesting as Governor Brown supports the convening of the Convention and the Democratic Speaker of the House, Leo McCarthy, opposes it.

SOUTH AFRICA (Cont'd.)

The Cutting Edge for Communism

"Few would dispute that Southern Africa is today the focal point, or cutting edge, of the struggle against imperialism... For years, large segments of the U.S. left ignored Africa, or at best assigned it a rather low priority. They failed to understand that the influence of an African revolution would not be restricted to Africa or even the third world. Instead it would have a wide and varied impact upon Western Europe and North America. Having fueled capitalism's growth and expansion, Africa is now a critical agent in its continuing crises and eventual demise."

This statement, which appears in the February 14 edition of the independent communist weekly, the GUARDIAN, shows the importance the communists place upon the battle against the existing regimes in Southern Africa. They openly acknowledge that the goal is not to secure justice for the blacks, colored and Asiatics of Southern Africa but to bring about the "demise of capitalism," in Western Europe and North America. In other words the objective is to use Southern Africa as a weapon to achieve the communist conquest of the western world.

There are many communist parties operating in the U.S.A. These parties differ in their attitudes to the Soviet Union, China, Vietnam, Cambodia and on many other issues. They are united in their hostility to the existing regimes in Southern Africa and in their determination to overthrow them.

It is a rare edition of a current communist periodical that does not contain an attack upon the government of South Africa. As one example among many, the communist DAILY WORLD, February 1, 1979, contains a full-page article captioned "Southern Africa in Crisis." It concludes as follows:

The fires of revolution have now swept across the borders of South Africa itself, the very heartland of racism and oppression and the main bastion of imperialism in the sub-continent. The year 1976 witnessed the mass revolt of African youth in Soweto and other townships throughout the country against apartheid and its foul doctrine of Bantu education — a revolt bloodily suppressed by the racist police and military forces at the cost of thousands of lives.

In the intervening period thousands of young people have deserted their studies to rally behind the banner of revolution bravely carried for so many years by the illegal African National Congress and the South African Communist Party.

Recent months have seen intensified action by the guerrilla forces and underground operatives in all parts of South Africa, vastly intensifying the pressures on the racist regime whose decadent and corrupt practices

were so glaringly exposed in the Information Department scandal.

The recent call to Africa issued by the historic meeting of a number of Communist and Workers' Parties of Africa has found an echo in all parts of the continent, but nowhere so intensely as in South Africa itself, with the largest and most experienced Black proletariat in all Africa. That call declared:

"Today, with the pillars of racism tottering, with the doomed regimes feverishly looking for salvation, the African Communists, who have always been in the forefront of the struggle for the freedom of peoples, believe that anti-imperialists, anti-racists, all true democrats and patriots of Africa, all honest people in our long-suffering continent should increasingly unite in order to put an end once and for all to imperialist and racist domination in Southern Africa and to give material and moral assistance to the genuine revolutionary forces led by the African

National Congress and the South African Communist Party, SWAPO (Namibia) and the Patriotic Front (Zimbabwe)."

Calling upon all progressive forces to express their militant solidarity with the fighters against racist, fascist and imperialist aggression, the African Communist and Workers' Parties declared: "The assault mounted by the freedom fighters of South Africa, Namibia and Zimbabwe makes the abolition of the racist-fascist regimes inevitable."

Day by day these words are coming true. In Africa today the racists and imperialists are fighting with their backs to the wall. The battle will still be long and hard, because the enemy is no paper tiger and still has vast resources at his disposal. But no one can doubt the eventual outcome. In the minds of revolutionary Africa the battle has already been won

Social Science

The communists claim to be social scientists. Their "science" consists primarily in harnessing and utilizing social forces. A social force is an emotion or conviction shared by a substantial number of people.

Opposition to apartheid is a powerful social force. Most educated people of the world are opposed to the system which denies economic, social, and political equality to blacks, colored, and Asians. These same people have little knowledge, and less desire to obtain any, of the historical roots of the existing situation and the complexity of the problems. They can indulge in the emotion of indignation and demand instant rectification at no risk or cost to themselves. They demand instant solutions.

Students are particularly susceptible to emotional appeals. They have an acute sensitivity to the evils in the world around them and a strange insensitivity to the evil within themselves.

Political Self-Interest

The situation within the U.S.A. is further complicated by the fact that political advantage accrues to those taking a strong stand against the South African regime. Racist sentiment is powerful and universal. The blacks of America naturally identify emotionally with the blacks of South Africa. They are impressed by any politician who appears to take a strong stand against the South African regime and are more likely to vote for him or her.

Principles of Action

It is possible to diagnose a disease accurately without knowing how to treat it effectively. Accurate diagnosis is necessary for effective treatment but is no guarantee of it. Similarly, it is easy to recognize the inequality in South Africa, but not nearly so easy to rectify it so that all groups and individuals secure justice. Some who protest injustice in South Africa seem indifferent to it in other countries.

Humans are complex, with deeply ingrained habits, prejudices and convictions that rarely change overnight. It is possible to change the environment rapidly and dramatically but psychological change takes time.

May I suggest a few principles that should be followed in designing policy towards Southern Africa:

1. The opinions of responsible leaders of all races in South Africa should be solicited with sympathy and perseverance. Greater weight should be given to them than to the opinions of external politicians of the Frontline States, the Organization of African Unity, and the United Nations.
 2. The use of violence should be repudiated.
 3. The communists should not be allowed to use the blacks, colored, and Asiatics as tools to impose their dictatorship and destroy freedom and justice for all.
 4. Legitimate measures to promote justice and well-being should not be classified as communist strategies if there is no evidence that the communists are involved.
 5. Small improvements should be welcomed even if they do not solve major problems.
 6. Each individual should seek to demonstrate understanding, generosity, patience, and love in personal relations with members of a different race. In this way the barriers of prejudice and fear may be penetrated and the area of fellowship enlarged.
- The code for Christian conduct remains, "Love one another."

A DECADE OF FASCISM IN CHINA

The communists, and many alleged non-communist experts, repeatedly affirm that Fascism is the diametric opposite of Communism. They locate Communism on the left of the political spectrum and Fascism on the right. They infer or affirm that Socialism and Fascism are irreconcilable enemies.

Nothing could be further from the truth. The Socialism of Communism, the Socialism of Nazism, and the Fascism of Italy were blood brothers. Fights between Communists and Fascists are really family feuds.

Further evidence of the close relationship between Communism and Fascism is now provided by the present leaders of Communist China. They affirm that China was ruled by a Fascist dictatorship, masquerading as being communist, during the decade 1966-1975.

The BEIJING REVIEW, February 23, 1979, quotes a speech by Mao Zedong (Mao Tse-tung) delivered to 7,000 delegates at an Enlarged Working Conference, convened by the Party Central Committee of the Communist Party of China in 1962:

"Without giving full scope to people's democracy and inner-Party democracy, 'the dictatorship of the proletariat will turn into a dictatorship of the bourgeoisie, and a reactionary, fascist dictatorship at that.' This prophecy of Comrade Mao Zedong's unfortunately came true when Lin Biao and the 'gang of four' climbed into the saddle." (Page 19)

It is noteworthy that most of our so-called China experts, who lurk in the universities, were extolling the virtues of the Chinese regime during this period of "Reactionary Fascist Dictatorship."

THE "REVEREND" JIM JONES CONFESSES

AIM Report, published by Accuracy in Media, Inc., has published a brief autobiography of the "Rev." Jim Jones. This amazing statement was published in "The Chronicle" of Georgetown, Guyana, December 6, 1978. It reveals that his first church appointment, in 1953, was given to him by a Methodist Superintendent despite (or because of?) the fact that he was lacking in any vestige of Christian faith and was a revolutionary communist. He reveals this in his own words, "I took this (-----) church as a communist who believes in nothing."
