Dear Friend,

I felt greatly honored when I was informed by Reed Irvine, Chairman of Accuracy in Media, that I had been selected to receive an award for my services against communism by the Council Against Communist Aggression and that the award would be presented at a special awards banquet in Washington, D.C. on June 2. I was in the process of composing the message I planned to deliver when my hopes were dashed. I contracted a severe bout of Shingles, known in the medical profession as Herpes Zoster, and the pain informed me that my attendance at the award banquet was out of the question. I asked my friend and colleague, Herbert Philbrick, to attend and accept the award on my behalf.

I was looking forward to meeting those who had also been selected for awards. These included:

VICTOR HERMAN, who was taken to the Soviet Union in the year 1931 while still a boy. He became a famous flier and parachute jumper and was known as the Lindbergh of Russia. Although he retained his American citizenship, he was arrested during the Stalin purges and suffered beyond human endurance in the Gulag Archipelago. His survival was due to a succession of miracles. It took him 45 years to obtain permission to return to his own country. He has recently related his unbelievable experiences in a book entitled "Coming Out of the Ice."

Another awardee is DANIEL KELLY who refused to renounce his American citizenship when the communists conquered mainland China and was rewarded by imprisonment for 21 years. He was freed last year after President Carter announced his intention to recognize Red China.

The other outstanding citizen selected for an award is LT. GEN. DANIEL O. GRAHAM who is co-chairman of the "Coalition for Peace Through Strength." His military career was crowned by his appointment as Director of the Defense Intelligence Agency from which post he resigned in December, 1975. He is currently devoting his talents and energy to exposing the dangers of the SALT II Treaty.

The communists would prefer to conquer the United States without the destruction caused by nuclear conflict. Their preferred method is progressive or phased surrender by the U.S.A. The SALT II agreement provides no protection against the formula: "External encirclement, plus internal demoralization, plus thermonuclear blackmail, leads to progressive surrender."

The response each individual made to my revelation that the Crusade needed \$60,000 urgently provided valuable insight into the quality of our supporters. Some berated me for always asking for money, while others dug deep and found something extra to give. Which received God's Good Neighbor Seal? We have only begun to resolve the problem so the quest for good neighbors continues. No higher honor can be given than God's award of "Good Neighbor."
