THE CHALLENGE AND OPPORTUNITY OF THE VIETNAMESE REFUGEES

"Oh, that my head were waters and my eyes a fountain of tears that I might weep day and night for the slain of the daughter of my people."

One million Vietnamese have fled or are fleeing from the terror in Vietnam. Half of them are dying during the flight.

Joseph Stalin said, "The death of one person is a tragedy; the death of a million is a statistic." To feel the horror of this monstrous tragedy, it needs to be liberated from the bondage of statistics and translated into the hopes and fears, pleasure and pain, life and death of known and loved individuals.

There is a beautiful young Vietnamese woman who works in the Crusade office. We call her Rose because her Vietnamese name is too difficult to pronounce. She works cheerfully and efficiently, and everyone loves her. She has a 3-year-old boy, who was born during her escape from Vietnam and whom she occasionally brings to the office and with whom we delight to play.

Can we see the Vietnamese refugees as the extended family of Rose? Let's assume we arranged a boat picnic in the seas off the coast of California and, as a result of a terrible accident, the main vessel sank and Rose and her son were adrift in a small boat 10 miles off the coast. What would we do to rescue them? How much time would we sacrifice? How much money would we spend? These questions would become irrelevant. Whatever was necessary would be done without question. Helicopters and planes would search the seas and the coast guard would mobilize its rescue ships. Anyone who protested the expenditures necessary to rescue them would be scorned.

Another Rose and her boy are in a boat at sea as you read this. They have just been towed away from the coast by a vessel of the Malaysian Navy. Rose is filled with anxious dread though the little boy does not understand what is taking place. All he knows is that he is hungry and in pain and Rose tries to comfort him. Where are the friends who will help them?

This is an emergency. This is not the time to discuss quotas and responsibility; it is the time to help. Not one Vietnamese refugee should be permitted to drown, or starve, or die from exposure if we can possibly save them.

Other nations are failing in their duty to accept these refugees but during these crisis days that is irrelevant. Diplomats can and should be negotiating a permanent solution to the problem, but the immediate call is "Man overboard." Compassion compels assistance. The country which was able to transport and maintain a half-million men in Vietnam can certainly find the means to rescue and temporarily maintain every refugee regardless of the considerable cost, not only in money, but in risks to health and security.

Such action would earn the admiration and respect of the whole world and would deal a devastating blow to the communist campaign to present the U.S.A. as an Imperialist carnivore void of kindness and compassion. Please write to President Carter and your Senators and plead that the "boat people" be saved.

COMMUNIST "EULOGY" OF JOHN WAYNE

John Wayne received many honors during his life and since his death but, knowing him, I am confident he would have taken particular pride in the "eulogy" which appeared in the June 16 edition of the DAILY WORLD, published by the U.S. Communist Party. It is a vicious diatribe of malignant hate. Since a man's character is revealed by his enemies, as well as by those he chooses as friends, "The Duke" would have rejoiced in this expression of hostility.



Under the caption, "Just whose hero was John Wayne?" the article begins by classifying him as a "war-mongering, racist, anti-union millionaire."

The major portion of the article is written by Lester Cole who was one of the infamous Hollywood Ten who served Joe Stalin faithfully when that tyrant controlled both the Soviet and the U.S. Communist Parties. Cole is outraged that President Carter would "sign a bill authorizing a gold medal to be struck for that 'reactionary racist,' John Wayne, and then, in an outrageous disregard for fact and history, call him a symbol of 'the American ideals of integrity, courage and patriotism'."

Cole is trenchantly critical because John Wayne was one of the founders of "The Motion Picture Alliance for the Preservation of American Ideals" which was formed to oppose the attempt of the communists to

control Hollywood. The members of the Motion Picture Alliance were traditional American patriots, and John Wayne and Ronald Reagan were prominent among them. They were joined in the battle to liberate Hollywood by a Labor Union Leader, Roy Brewer. Cole attacks venomously both John Wayne and the head of the stage hands union, Roy Brewer, whose devotion to American ideals and opposition to communism has never waned and who is a personal friend and Crusade supporter. Cole uses the customary communist technique of attempting to link Wayne and Brewer with anti-Semitism and violence, specifically the Ku Klux Klan, Gerald L.K. Smith and Father Coughlin.

John Wayne was a personal friend and supporter of the Crusade. In his consistent and public support for the Crusade, he demonstrated



that courage which was the cornerstone of his life. ABUNDANT OIL

The earth possesses adequate and available supplies of oil to fulfill all foreseeable needs for hundreds of years. This information comes from an authoritative and untainted source. It is contained in an article published in the June 22, 1979, edition of SCIENCE, the journal of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. The caption of the article is, "Opec Prices Make Heavy Oil Look Profitable," with the subtitle, "In Canada, companies line up to develop the huge and hugely expensive tar-sand deposits."

The article states:

An identified resource in the Western Hemisphere amounting to about 4 trillion barrels of heavy oil is now turning ripe for commercial development. (This figure does not include oil shale which is more costly to produce.)

The reference is to the heavy oil which is present in tar sands which are abundant in Western Canada. Although there has been no systematic search for tar sands, many massive deposits are known. The four largest are in: 1) Venezuela, 1 trillion to 3 trillion barrels; 2) Canada, more than 1 trillion barrels; 3) The Soviet Union, 1 trillion barrels; and, 4) The United States, 175 billion barrels.

Some idea of the massive size of these oil deposits is given from the following:

1. The total amount of the oil consumed by the world in history is about 300 billion barrels.
2. The known conventional light oil reserves of the Persian Gulf nations are estimated to be about 350 billion barrels.

Thus, the tar sands contain at least 13 times as much oil as mankind has consumed throughout history and at least 11 times the reserves of the Middle East. At present rates of consumption, this will last the world for hundreds of years.

The oil is difficult to extract and this makes it expensive. One reason for the difficulty of extraction is that the oil is "heavy" and does not flow unless heated or diluted.

Development of the tar sands is relatively advanced in Canada. Two full-scale commercial plants are in operation. To make a return on the investment, the oil produced must sell at \$19 (Canadian) per barrel. Already the cost of the oil provided by the Opec nations is close to this figure, and much is already above it. The rush to invest in oil sands should soon surpass the gold rushes of history.

The present world oil crisis should be temporary unless the environmentalists are able to prevent the extraction of this oil.

ANGOLA

Despite the presence of 25,000 Cuban troops, all is not going well for the Communists in Angola, Southern Africa. The Cuban Communists have imposed the rule of the MPLA, led by Neto, on the country. However, many, if not most, Angolans support UNITA, led by Jonas Savimbi, and Neto and his Cubans have been unable to defeat the forces of UNITA decisively. They try to blame South Africa for the success of UNITA.

The magazine, SOUTHERN AFRICA, supports the MPLA and Neto, but it acknowledges the power of UNITA. Here are extracts from the June edition of that magazine:

"The Defense Minister discussed UNITA's continued activity. He said UNITA, with South African backing, has infiltrated Angola mainly in Cubando Cubango province in the southeast.

"It's in the area of counter-UNITA measures that the Angolan army FAPLA needed to improve its offensive capabilities, Carreira said.

"Despite UNITA's concentration in the remote southeast of Angola, there is some evidence that its forces have caused disruptions in areas further north. Prime among the targets is the Benguela Railway. Although the railway is open throughout the width of Angola and now able to cross the eastern border into Zaire, it is still not carrying Zambian or Zairian minerals to the port of Lobito on the Atlantic. Meetings have been held among the principals involved, and they have included representatives from the UN and the European Community, but Zambia for one has become impatient. 'All the high-powered meetings and technical committees cannot control the UNITA guerrillas,' an editorial in the ZAMBIA DAILY MAIL stated in April. 'The blunt truth is that UNITA's guerrillas are keeping the Benguela Railway closed.' The editorial went on to suggest, very obliquely, that perhaps the only way to settle the conflict would be to include UNITA in the Angolan government, an attitude that Zambian officials held during the war in 1975 but have kept largely to themselves since.

"At the same time, sources recently in contact with UNITA representatives outside Angola report that it still claims to control at least the southern half of the country and that an 'offensive' is being planned for this summer. A UNITA representative in the U.S. has been making the rounds of major American newspapers and magazines, offering to take journalists into UNITA-held Angola to see for themselves.

"Angola has not been unaffected by this permanent state of war with South Africa. Energy has been diverted from reconstruction and economic development. But in the process of self-defense, Angola has created an army in which most of its citizens participate, some in the regular army, others in the militia known as the People's Defense Organization. Carreira calls it a people's army, capable of defending our conquests and of helping others, our allies, other African peoples who still suffer from oppression and exploitation.

" 'It's not an easy task. Our people don't always understand it. But it's the only way to consolidate the revolution in Angola.' " (Pages 17 and 18)

The communists are not invincible. They can be defeated.

THE WEAKNESS OF THE U.S.A.

Dr. Fritz Kraemer retired last year from his position as a top adviser to the Joint Chiefs of Staff. On June 2, in Washington, D.C. he accepted on my behalf an award given me by the Council Against Communist Aggression. During his speech he drew attention to the declining power of the U.S.A. throughout the world. Discussing the U.S. reaction to the developing revolution in Iran, he said:

"When that revolution was building, we, the United States, felt very belatedly that we should do something. And the President of the United States, Mr. Carter, gave the order that the big aircraft carrier, Constellation, from Subic Bay, our base in the Philippines, should be sent into the Indian Ocean and then to the Persian Gulf to demonstrate by our presence the power and interest of the United States in our ally, Iran. The aircraft carrier never made its way even into the Indian Ocean, to say nothing of the Persian Gulf. The President of the United States recalled that aircraft carrier before it had gone from the Pacific into the Indian Ocean.

"It would be superficial to blame President Carter for the 'miserable situation' that we found ourselves in. The President had good reason to call that aircraft carrier back because one aircraft carrier is nothing compared to what the Soviets have.

"Then Saudi Arabia, our friends, became incredibly frightened by what was going on in the Middle East. We had let Iran fall, and after the fall of Iran, they begged us to please send a squadron of F-15s to Saudi Arabia. We did, and by doing so we proclaimed loudly, officially, by a solemn announcement that these planes had no arms on them, no ammunition, and they had also been deprived of the usual sophisticated electronic equipment which they had.

"I raised this incident with a Cabinet member saying, 'Let's imagine that you have me by the throat and I suddenly pull my pistol, point it at your chest and say, 'Don't be afraid; it ain't loaded.' That is our powerlessness. However, I again understand why we only send the facade of planes. The Soviets have eleven parachute divisions and they can put them in Iraq any day, and they can get everything in the Middle East oil area.

"The Soviets are currently following a 'minimum risk' strategy in the world. Communist intervention in Angola, Mozambique, Ethiopia, Afghanistan, and South Yemen was accomplished without confronting U.S. forces. Weak as we are, they think that they can get us encircled--getting South Africa, East Africa, and the Middle East without the risk of war. That is the greatest danger, there will be no World War III for the horrible reason that before it could take place we will have surrendered anyway.

"I am concerned about two ominous developments in world politics. First, a younger, more energetic leadership may emerge in the Soviet Union and engage in new military adventures. Secondly, there is the possibility of a Soviet-Chinese rapprochement. There's my nightmare--the leaders in Peking have assigned to us but one single function--to be an effective counterweight to the Soviet Union. If the Chinese leadership sees the U.S. as being continuously in retreat, they will enter into a 'marriage of convenience' with Moscow. At that point, the strategic situation would be unmanageable. We must have a return of the military draft and a major rearmament program for the U.S."

Coming Out of the Ice

An award was also granted to Victor Herman, who described in chilling detail his life in Soviet prisons

and labor camps where he ate rats, worms, slugs and dried leaves to survive. Solzhenitsyn describes the monstrous system of Soviet labor camps in his classical trilogy, "The Gulag Archipelago," and Herman describes the life of a camp inmate.

Herman was born in the U.S.A. and his communist father took him to Russia in 1931, when he was 17, to work in one of the automobile factories the Americans were building there. He attained fame as a parachute jumper and became known as the Lindbergh of Russia. In 1938 he was thrown into prison for no discernible reason, and he remained in prison and in labor camps for 20 years. He finally managed to return to the U.S.A. in 1976 after an absence of 45 years.

He has written the book, "Coming Out of the Ice," which gives his life story and which reveals the intrinsic horror of communism. This book is enlightening and soul-stirring. It is published by Harcourt Brace Jovanovich, Inc., 757 Third Avenue, New York, New York 10017. The price is \$12.95.

Reed Irvine Presents the Award

In presenting the award of the Council Against Communist Aggression, Reed Irvine said:

"Twenty-five years ago, an Australian physician came to this country, where he observed that while Americans were very much concerned with the Cold War and the danger that communism posed, there was an abysmal lack of understanding on the part of most people of what communism was all about.

"He decided that the fight for freedom in the world would depend heavily on what happened in the United States. This would be the bastion of freedom that would protect distant countries such as Australia if it remained free, strong, and willing to act decisively.

"This Australian doctor gave up his successful medical practice to devote his time and talent to the study of communist doctrine and practice and to the great task of bringing the knowledge that he acquired to as many people as he could reach.

"And reach them he did. Through his lectures, his newsletter, his books, his debates, he reached millions. He was and is a meticulous scholar, who insists that those who battle the communists ought to know as much about that doctrine as do those who try to spread it. Those who are not knowledgeable are like soldiers who go to battle without weapons.

"Dr. Fred Schwarz has been at the cutting edge of the fight against communism for a quarter of a century. He has been the object of scorn and slander, but he has never wavered. He has demonstrated what responsible anticommunism means, and all of us owe him a deep debt.

"We are proud to honor him with this award, which will be accepted by Dr. Fritz Kraemer."

Lenin once stated that when the time came to hang the capitalist class, he would have capitalists competing for the contract to provide the rope.

Is the rumored prospective appointment of Thomas J. Watson, Jr., former Chairman of I.B.M., as Ambassador to Moscow, the provision of an outstanding rope salesman?

ITALY

The Italian Communists lost 12 percent of their vote in the recent election. In the previous election they had received over 34 percent of the votes cast while this time their tally was reduced to 30 percent.

This is the first time the Italian Communists have lost votes in an election since 1948. Has the tide turned or is this just a freak wave?

Often we hear the advice, "Don't listen to what they say? Watch what they do." Over the long run this advice may be sound but, over the short run, actions can be very deceptive. The successful fisherman may chum the waters by throwing good nourishing food into them with the objective of attracting fish who can later be hooked and barbecued. Similarly, the communists may serve the people well temporarily in order to hook them with dictatorship and barbecue them with "re-education." Deeds may be deceptive.

It is important to listen to communist words; to study communist doctrines. The objectives will then be revealed and humane and liberty-loving people will be repelled. Knowledge of communist doctrines, methods, and objectives is the best defense against the seduction of temporary communist service.

For this reason we distributed thousands of copies of the Italian translation of "You Can Trust the Communists (to be Communists)" throughout Italy.

REACTION TO RHODESIA--HYPOCRISY, RACISM AND FEAR

A bigger percentage of Rhodesia's citizens voted for the present government led by Bishop Muzorewa than the percentage of Europeans who voted for the European Parliament. While 62 percent of the Rhodesians voted, only 61 percent of the Europeans did.

The arguments advanced by President Carter for refusing to recognize the Rhodesian Majority Government are a compound of hypocrisy and racism.

One argument Carter used is that "The black citizens never had a chance to vote for or against the constitution under which the elections were held." The 62 percent who voted actually ratified the constitution by that very act.

Carter charges that the constitution preserved extra-ordinary power for the 4 percent white minority.

If the black majority chooses to make temporary concessions during the transition period in order to retain the white citizens and avoid the economic disruption that would be caused by their departure, what white foreigner has the right to forbid them? To condemn them is arrogant racism.

To fail to present the real reason for refusal of recognition and an end to sanctions and to substitute a false one is hypocrisy. The real reason is fear of offending the rulers of Nigeria who threaten to refuse to supply the U.S.A. with oil if Rhodesia is recognized along with fear of offending other African rulers.

Hypocrisy, racism and fear are ugly motivating forces.

HOW THE COMMUNISTS ARE EXPLOITING THE PUERTO RICAN INDEPENDENCE MOVEMENT

The communists are using Puerto Rico to harass and attack the United States.

The majority of the citizens of Puerto Rico have shown repeatedly by free vote that they desire to retain a special relationship with the United States. Some favor the maintenance of the status quo while others prefer statehood for Puerto Rico.

A small minority of Puerto Ricans desire independence and these constitute a social force which the communists are using. They have persuaded the United Nations to classify Puerto Rico as a colony, and they are agitating for its "liberation."

The Cuban Communist newspaper, GRANMA, shows how the communists are using the Puerto Rican independence movement in its June 10 edition.

During May 30 and 31 the Preparatory Meeting for the 2nd International Conference in Solidarity with the Independence of Puerto Rico was held in Havana, Cuba. The chairman of the meeting was Romesh Chandra, the President of the communist front, the World Peace Council. The Conference itself will be held in Mexico in late November.

Romesh Chandra stated that the purpose of the preparatory meeting was to organize something special along the lines of what had happened in Ethiopia, Afghanistan and Iran.

When asked how the World Peace Council fitted into the picture, Romesh Chandra stated that the struggle for Puerto Rican independence was part of a united international anti-imperialist movement. This is another way of saying that the purpose of this agitation for Puerto Rican independence is to aid the communist conquest of the world.

Cuba is playing a remarkable role in the international communist movement. Cuban troops control much of Africa on behalf of communism, and Cuba provides the weapons and probably some of the personnel for the Sandinista forces in Nicaragua. The objective is not merely the overthrow of Somoza but the creation of a Soviet Satellite on the North American Continent. Cuba is also attacking the U.S.A. through the non-aligned movement, the United Nations and the Puerto Rican Independence Movement. While doing all this, Cuba agitates for the abolition of the economic sanctions the U.S.A. has imposed on its announced and active enemy.

Fidel Castro is not satisfied with being the Dictator of Cuba. He relishes his role as the implacable foe of U.S. Imperialism and doubtless enjoys fantasies of himself as the "Liberator" of the Western Hemisphere. These visions must remain fantasies.

It seems absurd that a small country like Cuba could threaten the security of the U.S.A.. We should note that the danger from a malignancy can never be measured by the mere size of the tumor. Some small lesions are deadly and soon destroy the whole body.

Failure to recognize malignancy is acceptance of the death penalty.
