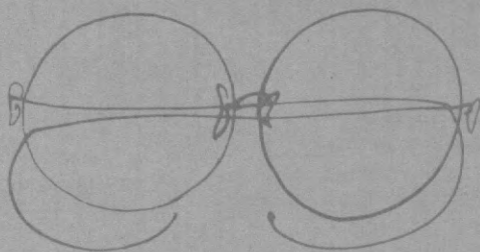
Here are over thirty essays assessing Gandhi's contribution to problems of violence, social change and world peace and applying that spirit to action against war.
