

NAPALM

SAMPLE

A 500-pound napalm bomb creates a firestorm covering 2500 square yards. Anyone in its path is roasted alive or suffocated. Napalm clings to the body as it burns at over 2000° Centigrade. It consumes all the oxygen in the immediate area. The survivors are often burned beyond recognition, doomed to a living death.



At Least 75,000 Vietnamese have been killed or maimed by napalm. Napalm is used almost every day against enemy troops and "unfriendly" villages. Occasionally it is accidentally dropped on our own or friendly troops.

Dow Chemical company is the sole producer of napalm and its output is now about 50 million lbs. per month. Dow Chemical also produces some of the herbicides that have been used to defoliate 5% of South Vietnam and 5% of her croplands.

Duke University indirectly supports and profits from the use of napalm and herbicides in Vietnam by holding 5000 shares of stock in Dow Chemical.



In the name of the American people, our government is using napalm against the people of Vietnam--soldiers and civilians, women and children--and defoliating their croplands and countryside. To remain mute is to condone the use of napalm and herbicides. WHAT, THEN, CAN BE DONE?

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

1. Don't buy Dow products and write to Dow Chemical Co. (Midland, Mich. and 350 Sansome St., San Francisco, Calif. 94104) stating that you will not buy their products as long as they produce napalm and herbicides for Vietnam.
2. Write President Johnson and your congressmen demanding that the use of napalm and crop destruction be stopped immediately.
3. Write Board of Trustees Chairman Wright Tisdale (Ford Motor Co., Dearborn, Mich.) asking that Duke University sell its Dow stock.
