Dear Friend,

This letter is a follow-up to your request for a catalogue and information about our program. You have already received a copy of our 1978-79 catalogue by this date, and we are writing to inform you that we do not have a catalogue prepared for the 1979-80 academic year.

The Goddard-Cambridge Graduate Program, in its current form, and under the auspices of Goddard College, will not be continued for the 1979-80 academic year. This is a result of many differences concerning budgetary issues, political orientation, and educational philosophy. (See attached copy of a letter to the Board of Trustees regarding this.)

Goddard-Cambridge is exploring the possibility of continuing the basic goals of the program on a community-based, post secondary level. If you're interested in our particular program, you should keep in touch with us about developments for the future. If you're interested in programs that Goddard College offers, you should write to them directly in Plainfield, Vermont 05667.

Also, financial assistance generally is rather limited in most colleges and universities; this also is true of the Goddard College programs. It might be helpful for you to check the financial aid reference section in your local library for assistance in procuring outside sources of financial aid. If you reside in the greater Boston area, you may especially want to use the resources available in the library of the Associated Foundation of Greater Boston, Inc., located in Boston.
