In the spring of 1980, Japanese fishermen began slaughtering dolphins off Iki Island. They believed that the dolphins were "stealing" their catch, refusing to acknowledge that over-fishing and heavy coastal pollution by man bore much of the real blame.



Worldwide, thousands of dolphins are being killed every year—by Americans, Japanese, Turks, Peruvians. Man's war against the dolphin doesn't have boundaries. In the U.S. alone, the government "allows" the killing of *31,000 dolphins a year* by American tunaboats.



Dolphins by the hundreds lie dead along the beaches of Iki Island, waiting to be processed into fertilizer. Japanese fishermen plan to continue this slaughter—and will, without worldwide pressure to stop them.



This is how it ends—dolphins, gentle, intelligent, ground into fertilizer—the consequence of man's unthinking and unfeeling relation to the earth.
