It might be said that this issue is also for men who are disgusted with their own rigidly structured "masculine role." Because that's what Women's Liberation is all about—the elimination of all roles based upon sex. We want to destroy the myth that only women are the maintainers of society and only men are the creators. True, only women can bear children, but why must a woman dedicate her entire life to bringing them up? Why can't women and men raise children? Why can't women and men have creative, meaningful careers outside the home? Why must a woman have her body degraded and her mind dismissed as trivial? Why do the vast majority of women still feel guilty about making basic decisions about their own bodies (birth control, abortion)? And even those who do make these decisions are not granted, by a male-dominated society, safe and effective means of carrying them out!

There are a few women who have answered these questions and made these decisions for themselves, but they are considered freaks and are exceptions to the rule. Moreover, most of them are not interested in helping other women.

Women's Liberation groups are for women who feel the need to help themselves and other women and men to the realization of the humanity of human beings. It must be noted that this is one woman's view of the problem. Each woman has her own outlook. Tallahassee women meet and discuss every Monday night at Ruge Hall at 8 PM. Join Us!!
