As a former student member of the Intercollegiate Studies Institute, I think you will be interested in the formation of the ISI Alumni Association.

The ISI Alumni Association is based on the fundamental premise that the ideas and programs developed by ISI have a lasting worth and an interest to our members beyond their undergraduate years. There are, of course, a number of objectives that we hope to achieve with this association.

First, we would like to keep former ISI students in contact with ISI and the regular ISI activities and publications, such as The Intercollegiate Review. In addition, we would like to provide an opportunity for ISI alumni to participate in programs particularly designed for them and to enable them to meet and discuss ideas with similarly-minded individuals.
