In a Prologue, he tells of the inside history of the weekly and of its meaning for then and now. The book is illustrated with the cartoons and drawings which helped make the magazine famous. V.I. Lenin. This new book provides an opportunity to study Lenin's views of events in the United States and its role as a world power. Spanning the period 1905-1922, the selections include excerpts from lengthier works, articles, speeches, reports, interviews, notes and letters. Among the themes treated here are the nature of U.S. imperialism, national elections, the trade unions, the status of the blacks as an oppressed people, and trends within the American Left. Of special interest is his view of relations with the United States. AMERICAN NEO-COLONIALISM

William J. Pomeroy. The author focuses his study upon the conflicts over U.S. foreign policy at the turn of the century, affecting the Philippines and the Far East. He holds that the conflict between the "imperialists" (favoring the seizure of colonies) and the "anti-imperialists" initiated the struggle between two variants of U.S. policy, in which neo-colonialism eventually emerged as the dominant feature. He shows that even in the Philippine exception this in time proved to be the case. Thoroughly researched, this book bears directly upon the conflicts of our time. THE MOLLY MAGUIRES

Anthonyimba. Originally published in 1932, this book first revealed the true nature of the so-called Molly Maguires of the Pennsylvania anthracite region as pioneers and martyrs in the early efforts to organize the coal miners. No work published since then sets forth so clearly the role of the railroad company which owned the mines, whose president hired the Pinkerton spies and provocateurs and acted as state prosecutor in the trials. DANGEROUS SCOT: The Life and Work of an American "Undesirable"

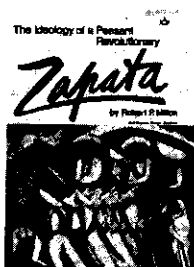

The highlight of this autobiography is his story of the great labor upheavals of the 1930s when, in Chicago and Cleveland, the author played a significant role in the struggles of the unemployed and particularly in the organization of the new industrial unions in rubber, auto and steel. He also throws new light on the role of Communists in the trade unions, the reasons for the split in the CIO and the fight against the Taft-Hartley Law.

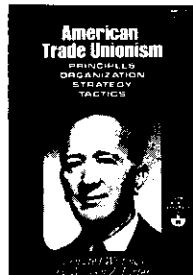

AFRO-AMERICAN HISTORY: The Modern Period

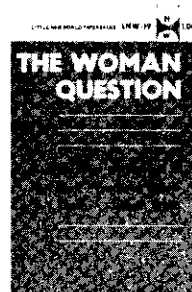

THE NEGRO PEOPLE IN AMERICAN HISTORY

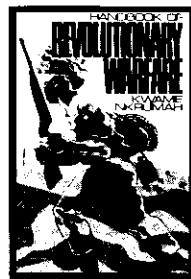

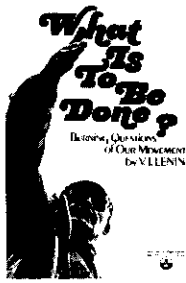
