THE LIBERTY AMENDMENT

Section 1.: The Government of the United States shall not engage in any business, professional, commercial, financial or industrial enterprise except as specified in the Constitution.

Section 2.: The constitution or laws of any State, or the laws of the United States shall not be subjected to the terms of any foreign or domestic agreement which would abrogate this amendment.

Section 3.: The activities of the United States Government which violate the intent and purposes of this amendment shall, within a period of three years from the date of the ratification of this amendment, be liquidated and the properties and facilities affected shall be sold.

Section 4.: Three years after the ratification of this amendment the sixteenth article of amendments to the Constitution of the United States shall stand repealed and thereafter Congress shall not levy taxes on personal incomes, estates and/or gifts.

TWO TOWNS



The difference in towns, either here or there, past or present, generally depends upon whether the people are free or intimidated.

Hundreds of millions of tax dollars went into propaganda to sell the idea that only government could do the job. History books were rewritten so the minds of youth would be conditioned. They had not seen the truth with their own eyes.

The process was surprisingly simple. Farmers lost their power to manage and decide through enforced crop allocations and crop subsidies.

The same process was moved into town and applied to every other vocation, destroying our free and dynamic society to impose a "permissive" society upon us. In surrender, this town was renamed Compliant.

Old timers remember when people in town and on the farm were free. Then farmers sold wheat for \$1.50 per bushel and a pound loaf of bread cost 5 cents. Now compliant farmers, with the lowest farm income in history, sell wheat for \$1.34 per bushel and compliant citizens pay 35 cents for a pound loaf of bread.

The blame is put on the "greedy" backs of labor and private enterprise, while the bureaucratic contrivers are at least "well meaning," if not "saintly." Suspicion of one another is generated and the enforced "trip to Washington" for permission to do usual things shatters the independence of the people.

Make no mistake about it — the SPIRIT of the people has been impaired. They have learned to do that which is permitted. All else is prohibited, just as in other countries and other ages.

So the town proudly built by rugged pioneers and individualists become known as "Compliant."

Revival of Spirit of Liberty

But there is another town down the way. It went through the same processes of subjugation by bureaucracy. It was once known as suburban Compliant. But something happened one day to revive the public spirit and caused the town to be known as "LIBERTY."

When you get there, you can feel the spirit that made it so. There is a vitality in the air reminding one of "The Spirit of '76" with the sprightly drum and fife tunes of hope and aspiration challenging fulfillment.

People talk differently. Little is heard of subsidies or compliance. The "free lunch" concept is missing. Instead, folks talk of the terms of liberty and how to apply them — not wistfully, but objectively, and within their reach.

Return to Free Enterprise

The clerks in the shops act differently, striving to serve their customers well as the best way to serve themselves.

Perhaps that sums up the attitude in the town of Liberty. It is the spirit of self-interest and self-improvement — to serve better and prosper more. It is the spirit of adventure and exploration — of trying to make each day better than those before it.

This is an American concept, in the ideal of personal incentive, personal responsibility and personal achievement, knowing the progress of the world begins with the ambitions of a single person — ones own self.

Folks in the town of Liberty point out that the sticks and stones with which the town is built are just about the same as in other towns. The utilities and appliances work the same, or even better when free men employ them, and these people have every intention of regaining their freedom.

They haven't made it yet. The big fight is still ahead, but they are WORKING at it — and intend to win.
