Dear Friend:

The tremendous drama of the year 1972 grinds steadily to some profound conclusions. The whole course of human freedom on earth may well be in the balance, and the part we are playing in this stupendous activity can be decisive.

The attached REPORT ON FREEDOM outlines some facets of the drama, and our part in them. The growth of our project and purpose has been great, yet not enough. The break-through we seek is not yet, but is getting close, even as the danger to our institutions becomes critical.

Your Committee is preparing the greatest public information program we ever imagined, and the public approval already given to them is being evidenced. Example--the little squib buried deep in the newspapers of Friday, October 6, regarding the filing of our action against the IRS in the Supreme Court has produced extraordinary interest and support. The publicity that will flow from it will be enormous as the people are truly living in a hope that someone will do something, and this very likely is the thing that will "turn them on."

These activities are costly. It has taken great ingenuity and much costly activity to approach the Supreme Court, just as it has the court of public opinion, which we are now reaching through the other programs outlined in the REPORT. Yet these activities MUST BE BROUGHT TO A SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION. We may have no other chance, so we must throw every possible support behind these efforts immediately.

The election, as it is working, is bringing countless people to a full realization of the fact that freedom is at stake. This is, of course, a most difficult time to seek your maximum financial contribution for the LIBERTY AMENDMENT, yet it is the crucial moment of initiating the drive that must follow Campaign 1972. What is done between the day of the election and the start of the sessions in Congress and the States can be decisive.
