FOR AMERICANS



Too often, Americans who are concerned with the downward plunge of their Nation and civilization, particularly after imbibing a little too much of their local edition of the controlled press, or after watching some particularly obnoxious red on television shamelessly slant the news, think that the tide cannot be stopped.

This is the "Don't Fight Communism and National Destruction - It is Inevitable" Syndrome. They want you to think that you can't do anything to restore a decent environment for yourself and your family and your heirs. They want you to feel alone and helpless.

What few people stop to consider is that although political efforts to reverse the direction of national suicide have not been successful, *the onrush of communism has been slowed down*, and there have been many notable victories in past years which should give encouragement to every loyal American.

In the very forefront of this legislative battle has been LIBERTY LOBBY, which maintains a day-by-day, hour-by-hour watch on Washington, and devotes its entire resources (limited as they are in comparison to the gargantuan liberal lobbies) to mobilizing the power of numbers for good and honest government.

One word of caution. As you read this compilation of victories, do not think that every victory listed happened entirely because of LIBERTY LOBBY. Often, LIBERTY LOBBY was assisted by other groups of patriotic Americans, and in some cases these other groups have more claim to the victory

than does LIBERTY LOBBY. On the other hand, even the most cynical will have to admit that in this case or that, the victory would have been a defeat if it had not been for the one extra measure of pressure supplied by a unique sort of pressure group which is composed of persons who have nothing to gain for themselves except the knowledge that they are doing what they can to save America from an otherwise certain and dismal fate.

After you read this list of victories, you may conclude that you owe it to your America – and even to yourself – to become a part of LIBERTY LOBBY and help make that day inevitable when the tide of communism and threatening national destruction will be a matter of merely unpleasant history.

1955

July 17 – LIBERTY LOBBY is born.

1958

August 30 – For the first time in American history, the voting record of each Member of Congress is researched and published by a non-partisan, anti-communist group, LIBERTY LOBBY.

1959

March 6 – The newly-opened Research Department of LIBERTY LOBBY discovers Senator Javits' Senate bill S 125 (House version HR 3136). LIBERTY LOBBY notified known patriots across America – the bill was stopped! Cleverly disguised for swift passage, the bill would have prevented anyone from using the U.S. Mails who criticized the government or Supreme Court. Also, it would have made operative another bill (S 120) prohibiting this criticism from being conveyed across states lines (by any means) and providing a \$5000 dollar fine and five years in prison for offenders.

1960

November 24 – Americans received Liberty Letter No. 1 which gave the same warning about the so-called "free press" given by Vice President Agnew nine years later in November of 1969. LR (Liberty Letter) No. 1 was the opening shot to slow down the "New Frontier." (See LR No. 1)

1961

Liberals, to prevent Senate debate upon "New Frontier" bills, wanted to revoke Senate ground Rule 22 which would allow their bare majority to shut-off debate instead of the traditional 2/3 majority. The revoking measure, S. Res. 4, was defeated. See *Liberty Letters* No. 2 and No. 10.

Liberals wanted Foreign Aid money to be appropriated for a 5 year period instead of being reviewed each year by Congress. Defeated, see LR's 4, 8, 9 and 10.

President Kennedy "muzzled" military officers who spoke out for America against Communism. JFK planned a ruthless purge by Adam Yarmolinsky of all offenders. His hand was stayed by Senate Resolution 191 calling for an investigation. See *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 1 and LR 10.

Liberals establish the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency to strip the U.S. of its military strength. A clause forced into the bill prevents treason: The Agency will not "obligate the U.S. to disarm or reduce its armed forces or armaments. . ." LIBERTY LOBBY urged patriots to pressure Congress for this clause. See LR's 4 and 10.

1962

LIBERTY LOBBY moves to unify fragmented right wing groups into power bloc. See LR 14, January.

An Urban Affairs Plan to give local city politicians vote

buying money defeated (HR 8429 and S 1633). See LR 15.

Foreign Aid slashed by 1 billion dollars – See LR 15.

Liberal plan to force unqualified voters onto voting lists of southern states – defeated. See LR 18.

An outrageous liberal Permanent Non Voluntary Controls bill to imprison farmers who wouldn't grow what they were told – defeated. See LR 20.

First Liberal attempt to enact unconstitutional gun controls foiled (Anfuso gun bill HR 613). See LR 21 and 25.

First attempt to enact socialized medicine thwarted. See LR 21.

Communist propaganda mail from outside the U.S. was allowed to flood the country when President Kennedy issued an Executive Order stopping the Post Office Department interception of this mail. Strong support for section 12 of HR 7227 (the Cunningham amendment) revoked Kennedy's bid to help the Communist cause. See LR's 21 and 25.

A right wing bill requiring armed forces members to take an oath supporting the U.S. Constitution edged through Congress. See LR 24.

Liberals groaned when HR 9753 limiting communists in defense plants and requiring an oath for passports squeaked through Congress. See LR 24.

Communists – in the March 25, 1962 *Worker* (formerly *The Daily Worker*) – "blame" LIBERTY LOBBY for stopping the "New Frontier" programs for Federal control over guns, farmers, education, voters and medicine.

1963

February – *Liberty Lowdown* begins – published monthly this newsletter rushes inside and advanced information to Americans who sign an Oath of Loyalty to the U.S. Constitution and join LIBERTY LOBBY'S Board of Policy.

March – LIBERTY LOBBY unity efforts pay off in merger with the RIGHT TO WRITE COMMITTEE. See LR 29.

April – In 1969 a bill passed Congress to provide your family protection from Chinese and Russian missile attack – the pressure for this bill began in April 1, 1963 when *Liberty Lowdown* No. 3 revealed the Russians had developed effective anti-missile missiles. Twenty-two days later a red-faced press and Congress rocked the country when they sheepishly confirmed the story.

May – LIBERTY LOBBY unity efforts win merger with "TEL 'M."

June – *Liberty Lowdown** predicted and gave inside reasons why Barry Goldwater would be the Republican nominee for President (this was one year prior to convention).

Liberals pushed 29 separate "educational" bills to gain a Federal stranglehold over local public schools. Of these bills, 26 were either killed or held to a minimum – only two were passed exactly as the liberals had concocted them – one was stalled until 1964. See 1963 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 189 for LIBERTY LOBBY'S testimony. See LR's 31, 32, 33.

The U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency moves to strip the military and private citizens of all arms. Senate bill S 777, supported only by LIBERTY LOBBY and Americans for National Security, scuttled the sinister effort by:

1. Prohibiting the Agency from making disarmament treaties (treaties supercede all other laws in the U.S.);
2. Preventing the Agency from propagandizing the American public or interfering with the private ownership of arms;
3. Slashing funds and deleting the unlimited funds provision.

See *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 5, LR's 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 39, and *Liberty Lowdown* No. 7.

The Senate Judiciary Subcommittee praised the "excellent testimony" of LIBERTY LOBBY regarding the Civil Rights Commission. See the June 5, *Congressional Record* and LR 33.

Communists – in the October 27, *Worker* (formerly *Daily Worker*) unleash their fury against LIBERTY LOBBY for its major role in defeating the Civil Rights Act of 1963.

Liberals through the U.N. Participation Act would have empowered the President, at will, to place the U.S. under

absolute authority of the United Nations. Defeated - see *LR's* 31, 32.

Liberals/communists - outraged at LIBERTY LOBBY for delaying their world takeover plans - fire opening shot of a continuing smear campaign. See July 1963 *Group Research Report* (published for insiders of the liberal/communist conspiracy).

Million dollar Domestic Peace Corps boondoggle defeated - see *LR's* 31, 33.

Foreign Aid (HR 7885) slashed by another billion dollars for LIBERTY LOBBY testimony see *CQ Almanac* Pg. 268** and *LR's* 31, 33.

Aware of LIBERTY LOBBY'S growing political clout, liberals abandoned a push to raise the immigration quota 250,000 above normal (HR 770/S 747). See *LR's* 31, 33.

Liberal effort to put Federal Government into local transit business (HR 3881/S 6) - defeated. See *LR's* 31, 33.

Socialized Medicine defeated (HR 3920/S 880) see *LR's* 31, 33.

1964

The liberals' Civil Rights Act of 1964 demanded:

1. Prosecution of Civil Rights Act critics(!);
2. Trials in Washington, D.C. without a jury instead of locally with a jury;
3. Unlimited punishment;
4. 100 million dollars for new jails to handle expected increase of prisoners;
5. Withholding of Social Security, Veterans and retirement payments from individuals merely ACCUSED of a Civil Rights Violation;
6. The number of Negro employees a business hires must reflect the national percentage;
7. Interference with membership practices of churches, private clubs, fraternities and sororities;
8. Busing of students;
9. You couldn't refuse employment to communists;
10. The Census Bureau could demand you to disclose for whom you voted in Federal elections - defeated. See *U.S. News and World Report*, May 11, 1964 for abridged version of LIBERTY LOBBY testimony. For complete version see *Cornell Law Quarterly* Winter, 1964, p. 228 - also *LR's* 39, 41, 42, 43, 44, and 45.

LBJ seeks power (HR 936) to reward or punish by raising or lowering salaries of board and commission members such as the FCC, Selective Service, Civil Rights Commission, the Subversive Activities Control Board, etc. - defeated. See *LR* 39.

Liberals attempt to build a Leftwing voter bloc by importing and placing on welfare roles unlimited immigrants from Africa and Asia (S 747) - defeated. See *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 9 and *LR's* 43 to 47.

Consular Treaty stopped - see front page of *LR* 45 and description under 1966.

Senator Fulbright's bill (S 2665) to give unlimited aid to Communist countries - defeated, see *LR* 43.

A LIBERTY LOBBY tabloid, *LBJ A Political Biography*, made history for this type publication by selling 14 million copies.

Liberals forced to hold hearings on school prayer amendment (HJ Res 693) - see *LR* 43.

Liberals' Poverty Program (HR 10440/S 2642) was restricted to: give state governors veto power over obnoxious Job Corps programs; eliminate vote buying scheme of buying high priced land and giving it to "poor folks" - also outright gifts of money to "poor" farmers stopped. Job Corps trainees and Vista personnel required to sign loyalty oaths - see *LR* 44.

1965

Liberals re-attempt to build a leftwing voter bloc by importing and placing on welfare roles unlimited African and Asian immigrants - quota held down to 170,000 (near normal). Unlimited immigration of Canadians and South Americans slashed to 120,000 with the stipulation they could enter U.S. only if Americans wouldn't be deprived of jobs. LIBERTY LOBBY was the only organization which both fought and testified for these restrictions - see the *Washington Post*, October 28, 1967 and the 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 469-70,

also *LR's* 49 to 54 and page one of *LR's* 55 to 57.

March - *Liberty Letter* circulation reaches 100,000.

In order to ram legislation through the House, liberals wanted to reduce from 218 to 175 (less than a majority) the number of votes necessary to bring a bill from careful committee consideration to a floor vote - defeated, see *LR* 49.

Liberal bill to destroy the Army Reserve - stopped, see *LR* 49.

U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency funds axed from \$55 to \$20 million - see 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 498 for LIBERTY LOBBY testimony and *LR's* 50 to 52.

A liberal trick (S 1367) to hide Foreign Aid in the defense budget - foiled, see *LR's* 51 and 52.

Otto Otepka, the State Department Security chief who refused to clear Dean Rusk's shifty friends, was saved from destruction because the Senate was flooded with letters from LIBERTY LOBBY supporters - for documentation - see the *Chicago Tribune*, March 12, 1965.

Foreign Aid (HR 18, HR 7750/S 1524) reduced \$241 million and prohibited those countries aiding North Viet Nam, see 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 1445 for LIBERTY LOBBY testimony and *LR's* 51 to 57.

Unconstitutional gun controls (HR 6628, HR 6783/S 1591, S 1592) stopped - see 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 645 for LIBERTY LOBBY testimony and *LR's* 49 and 52 to 59.

Liberals in Congress wanted to hold hearings to set up a Permanent Control Council for Expanded Trade to boost treasonous aid for the blood-spattered Communist slave empire - halted, see *LR's* 52 to 54 and 56.

The Consular Treaty (see 1966 for description) beaten back - see 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 458 for LIBERTY LOBBY'S major role. See the Drew Pearson column "blaming" LIBERTY LOBBY for "sidetracking" the treaty, September 4, 1965. See also *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 12 and *LR's* 52 to 54.

The persistent liberal efforts to place the U.S. under direct control of the U.N. and World Court stymied again - (S Con Res 32/H Con Res 324) - defeated, see *LR* 57.

The National Chamber of Commerce passed a resolution condemning the Connally Reservation (the only roadblock preventing direct U.N. control over the U.S.). In June, *Liberty Letter* 54 urged subscribers and local Chamber members to pressure the National Chamber to reverse its stand. In August, that body dropped all opposition to the Connally Reservation.

The liberal push to repeal section 14-b of the Taft-Hartley Act (see 1966 for description) - defeated. See the 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 825 for LIBERTY LOBBY'S major role also *LR's* 55, 56 and 58.

Fall 1965 - LIBERTY LOBBY launches continuing campaign to warn Americans about the dangers of a dictatorship posed by certain Presidential Executive Orders. See *LR* 56 and Liberty Lobby pamphlet *Executive Orders - Blueprint for Dictatorship*. Also check U.S. Gov. publication the *Federal Register* for Executive Orders 10995 to 11005, 11051 and 11310.

August - *Liberty Letter* circulation jumps to 150,000.

The *Block Busting Bill* (HR 7984) would give low income families enough money to rent homes in the highest priced neighborhoods - defeated. See *LR's* 54, 56, 58.

1966

January 22 - control of LIBERTY LOBBY political policies is turned over to Americans who sign an oath of loyalty to the U.S. Constitution and support LIBERTY LOBBY with at least one dollar a month.

February 8 and 10 - two separate Liberal all out attempts to ram repeal of Taft-Hartley-14b through the Senate defeated. Repeal would have forced working people in 19 states to join a union against their will and pay labor bosses dues that are generally used to promote legislation directly opposed to their vital interests. See the 1965 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 837 for LIBERTY LOBBY'S critical part in "dooming repeal", also *LR's* 60 to 62.

All six points of a liberal program are defeated:

(1) The Consular Treaty (D-88-2) would have allowed the Russians to establish U.S. spy centers, plant atomic bombs, etc. — all with complete immunity from U.S. law.

(2) The Genocide Treaties would have given the World Court power to try you or your whole community for anything it felt was harmful to the "mental" well-being of any minority group.

(3) The Panama Canal Treaties would have turned our canal over to revolutionaries, choking us economically and militarily.

(4) Repeal of the Connally Reservation.

(5) The Planning for Peace Resolutions (S Con Res 32/H Con Res 384) would have taken your guns and legalized punishment for anyone who balked at government by the U.N. and World Court.

(6) Communist Trade Expansion (S J Res 36) would have funneled billions of U.S. dollars into the blood-spattered Communist slave empire.

See LR's 60, 62, 63, 65, 66, 69, 70.

Unconstitutional gun controls roundly defeated! See LR's 60, 62, 63, 65, 67.

The Urban Development and Demonstration Cities Act, another liberal scheme to "buy" local politicians, was chopped from \$20 to \$1.2 billion — see *Emergency Liberty Letter* no. 15 and LR's 64, 66, 69.

LBJ sought authority (HR 12785/S 2933) to send Russia and Red China 3.3 billion dollars worth of free food each year, for six years — the scheme crushed! Not only was LBJ prohibited from sending food to the Communists but also to any country caught trading with North Vietnam or Red China — see LR's 64, 65, 66, 67.

Liberals wanted Congress to give up their year-to-year review of Foreign Aid (which was being slashed each year) and approve aid funds five years in advance — defeated. Also, \$5 billion slashed from LBJ's current request — also, aid was prohibited for countries trading with North Vietnam and Red Cuba. See LR's 61, 62, 63, 66, 67, 68.

Liberals move to end travel to anti-communist Rhodesia — defeated, see the *Washington Post* May 20, 1966, pg. 25 for LIBERTY LOBBY'S major role — also LR's 66, 69.

Liberals fought to turn control of America over to the Federal Union of Atlantic Nations (S Res 128/S Con Res 64) — defeated, see LR's 64, 66.

Liberals struggled to wrest control of Unemployment Compensation from your state; severely increase the tax; and deprive a state of any extended payment benefits if its U.S. Senators or Representatives didn't vote the liberal line (HR 11519, HR 8282/S 1991) — defeated, see LR's 60 to 67.

Common Site (Situs) Picketing (HR 10027) — defeated! Under this bill, even a small union boss could "earn" himself kickback money by threatening a contractor (victim) with a strike that would be "honored" by every union on the construction site, thus shutting down the "unco-operative" contractor's whole job. See LR's 61, 64, 65, 66, 67.

The Economic Opportunity Act (War on Poverty — OEO) was severely amended to:

Prohibit political activities of poverty workers by bringing them under the *Hatch Act*.

Prohibit federal funds or services to anyone convicted of inciting a riot.

Reduce LBJ's request by \$138 million and limit poverty workers earnings to \$12,500 a year. See *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 14 and 16 — also LR's 62, 64, 66, 67 (pg. one), 68, 69.

D.C. Home Rule (S 118/HR 10115) — thwarted. Our founding fathers wisely placed D.C. under the control of Congress so no petty local official, like a mayor or police chief, could intimidate Congress, any Federal agency or a citizens' group like your LIBERTY LOBBY — see LR's 61, 63, 65.

Bureaucrats' files opened to public — patriots' bill (HR 12160/S 1160) — passed! Nearly all extreme liberals (*Lib-*

erty Ledger rating 50% or less) afraid to vote yea or nay — see LR's 63, 65, 67.

LIBERTY LOBBY unity efforts win merger with AMERICANS FOR NATIONAL SECURITY — see LR's 64, 65.

1967

LBJ's attempted 10% tax increase for 1967 — killed, see LR's 71, 78, 80, 81, 82.

Common Site (Situs) Picketing (HR 100) — bottled-up — see description under 1966 and LR's 71, 75, 77, 82.

Panama Canal Treaties blocked again — see *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 19 and LR's 71, 78, 79, 80, 81.

Unconstitutional gun controls (HR 5384/S 1853, 1854) — halted again, see LR's 71, 74, 76, 78, 79, 81, 82.

(S 1026) — to give civil rights agitators special protection while inciting riots — smashed! See LR's 76, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82.

Liberals attempt payoff to rioters by pressing for an increase in poverty funds — funds slashed and program placed under control of public officials instead of so-called clergy and private groups — see LR's 71, 72, 77, 79, 80, 81, 82.

Stopped was a liberal hoax (HR 6649) to put billions of your hard earned tax dollars into the Export-Import Bank. The Communists were to draw upon this account to pay for goods "sold" them by greedy U.S. businessmen. This giveaway scheme was called the East-West Trade Agreement — see LR's 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 78.

Foreign Aid was battered to within 8 votes of permanent death and slashed almost \$1 billion to the lowest appropriation in history — see LR's 71, 72, 75, 76, 78, 80, 81, 82.

Congressman Adam Clayton Powell prevented from taking his House seat — see *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 16 and LR 72.

1968

A liberal scheme to give the Communists billions of dollars under the guise of "trade" — halted, see under 1967 for description and the 1968 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 736 for LIBERTY LOBBY testimony and LR's 83, 84, 85, 93, 94.

Foreign Aid slashed by \$5 billion to all time low — see the 1968 *CQ Almanac* ** pg. 424 for LIBERTY LOBBY testimony and LR's 85, 87, 88, 89, 90, 92, 93, 94.

Common Site (Situs) Picketing (HR 100) — again stopped — see LR's 83, 93, 94.

Panama Canal giveaway to Communists stopped again — see LR's 83, 89, 93, 94.

Liberals attempt to strip Congress of the constitutional power to "regulate commerce with foreign nations" by giving LBJ carte blanche authority (HR 17551/S 2182) to lower tariffs flooding the country with cheap foreign products — defeated, see LR's 83, 85, 88, 89, 90, 92, 93, 94.

The notorious Abe Fortas blocked from confirmation as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court — see *Emergency Liberty Letter* No. 21 and LR's 84, 90, 91 and 92. LIBERTY LOBBY "blamed" for his defeat by the *Washington Post*, September 13, 1968; *Labor*, September; *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*, August 18, 1968; *Homefront* (ADL/AD newsletters) October, 1969.

June — LIBERTY LOBBY launches its Tax Equity program by distributing 300,000 copies of *The Great Tax Fraud* tabloid. In September, former IRS Commissioner Mortimer Caplin announced the U.S. was in the midst of a Tax Rebellion. This movement resulted in the Tax Reform bill (HR 13270) later signed into law by President Nixon. For grudging praise of LIBERTY LOBBY'S Tax Equity program see the *Washington Post* August 3, 1969, pg. A8.

Despite the intense hysteria whipped up by the liberals over the shootings of Martin Luther King and Robert Kennedy, complete Federal control and registration of your guns (HR 17735) was blocked — see the 1968 *CQ Almanac* **pg. 565 for LIBERTY LOBBY'S far-reaching anti-control activities — see LR's 83, 85, 86, 87, 89, 91, 93, 94.

Liberals and newspapers furious that LR 94 and the September *Liberty Lowdown* revealed facts about the USS

Pueblo affair months prior to official news releases — see the *Houston Chronicle*, February 9, 1969.

October 1 — LIBERTY LOBBY mails out *Liberty Letter* and *Liberty Lowdown*, which announce the beginning of an "all-out campaign" to get rid of Robert Strange McNamara, then Secretary of Defense, whose incompetence and mismanagement was leading to American military impotence. LIBERTY LOBBY published a book and started a campaign of newspaper advertising designed to force McNamara out. Within seven weeks, President Johnson moved McNamara out of Defense. See LR's 80, 81, 82, 83 and *Liberty Lowdown* No. 56.

The Nuclear-Non-Proliferation Treaty, which would have restricted our nuclear capability to the advantage of outlaw nations such as Russia and Red China, was not ratified in 1968, in spite of intense pressure. See LR's 85, 88, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94.

1969

Your family was provided a shield against Chinese and Russian missile attack when the Anti-Ballistic Missile Defense Program (ABM) was battered through Congress despite all-out liberal communist opposition — see the June *Liberty Lowdown* and LR's 99, 100, 101, 102.

Abe Fortas, leftist Supreme Court Justice, resigned under fire from some of the same charges first brought by LIBERTY LOBBY in 1965 — see Drew Pearson's defense of Fortas and criticism of LIBERTY LOBBY in his August 5, 1965 column.

Otto Otepka's name cleared by his appointment to the Subversive Activities Control Board — see the scorn and blame heaped upon LIBERTY LOBBY for Otepka's victory in Drew Pearson's column, April 23, 1969, and by the *Memo From Cope* newsletter, April 28, 1969.

The outrageous "Philadelphia plan" to force unions to have a 20% Negro membership — defeated, see LR's 103, 104.

June 10 — Roudebush Amendment directs NASA to plant U.S. Flag on moon instead of U.N. flag. House dramatically reverses Nixon policy bowing to organized pressure from patriots, alerted by telephone.

December 11 — LIBERTY LOBBY'S Tax Equity Program, launched in 1968, bears its first fruits with congressional passage of Tax Reform Bill. Congress accepts the principle of Tax Equity, establishing foundation for full implementation of LIBERTY LOBBY'S program in years to come. See LR's 97, 98, 99, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105.

Common Site (Situs) Picketing (HR 100) — stopped — see LR's 97, 98, 99, 100.

December 11 — the 10% income surtax slated for phase-out in 1970 — see LR's 97, 98, 99, 101, 102, 103, 104, 105.
