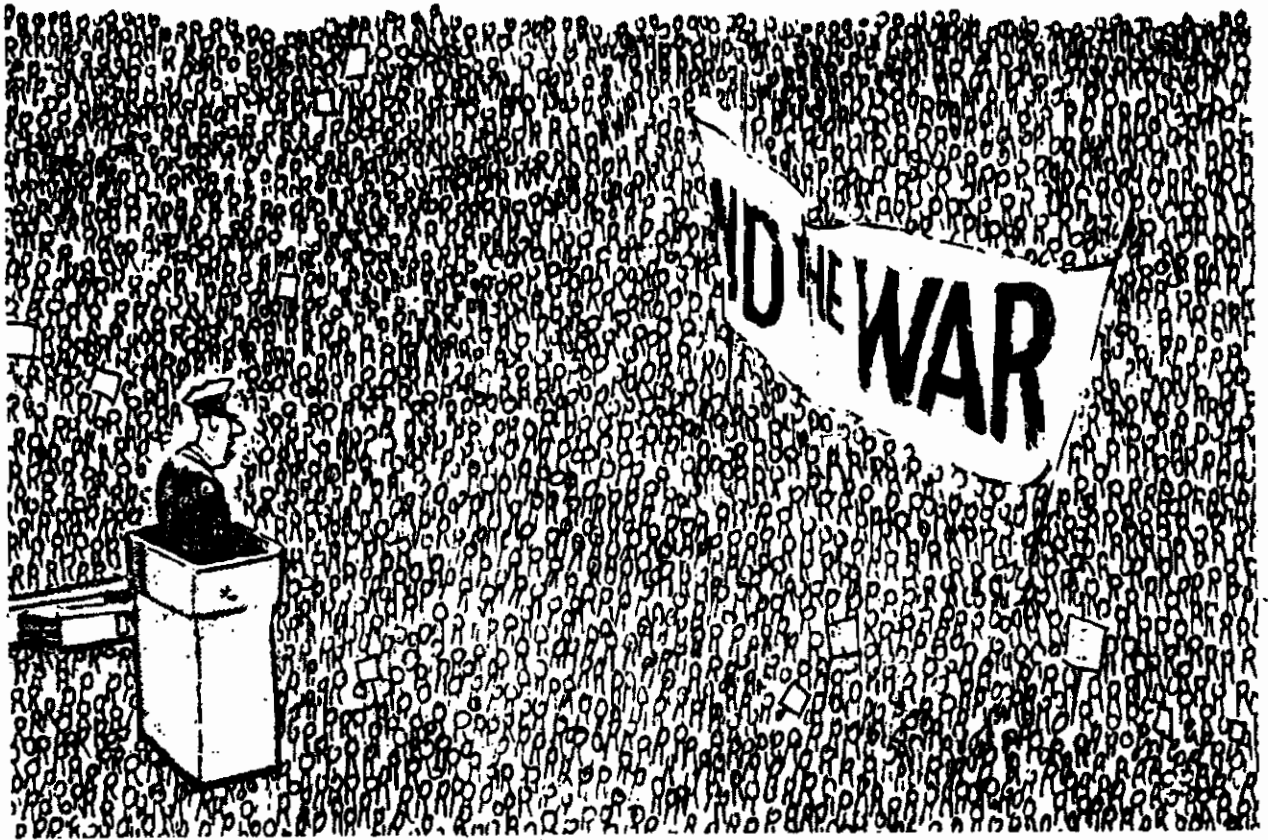

* During the Nov. 15th - Jan. 15th period, which is normally a slack season for us, we want to get speakers on campus to talk about election year strategy, the fact that the War in S. E. Asia is not "winding down," and other concerns of the Movement.

✓ We are reducing the fees of all speakers listed by 40 to 50% in an effort to energize this season. The fee range will be \$25.00 to \$600.00; with only three speakers having fees over \$400.00. Most of the speakers have fees under \$250.00. If you don't have money in hand we will participate in programs for which a small admission (50¢ to \$1.00) is charged to pay the speaker's fee. Only transportation must be pre-paid.

SPEAKERS AVAILABLE THROUGH MOVEMENT SPEAKERS: Nov. 15th - Jan. 15th

- Eqbal Ahmad - Fellow of the Adlai Stevenson Institute of International Affairs in Chicago; Ph.D; citizen of Pakistan; spent several years in North Africa; indicted in the Berrigan Conspiracy Case; author of: Revolution and Reaction in The Third World; he is considered an authority on revolutionary movements and political development *
- Stewart Albert - a long haired former candidate for Sheriff's Office of Alameda County. He received 70,000 votes & won in Berkeley by 8000 votes; just returned from a two month tour of revolutionary Chile; active in organizing Peoples Park in Berkeley; named as a co-conspirator in Chicago 8 Trial for being a Yippie organizer
- Leslie Bacon - movement activist; MayDay organizer who was ripped-off by the U. S. Government in its effort to smear the anti-war movement; a victim of the Mitchel/Kleindienst/Goodwin/Rehnquist Grand Jury strategy of repression
- Richard Barnett - Co-Director of The Institute For Policy Studies; with the U. S. State Department (Disarmament Agency) during Kennedy Administration; expert on the Pentagon and U. S. foreign policy; author of Intervention and Revolution, Washington Plans An Agressive War, After Twenty Years, and Economy of Death
- Murray Bookchin - an anarchist expert on ecology; well known for his articles, lectures, and books on ecology and contemporary issues; founded Anarchos Magazine; author of Our Synthetic Environment, Crisis in Our Cities, and Post-Scarcity Anarchism, which presents a vision of the free society and a strategy for building it
- Anne & Carl Braden - Executive Directors of Southern Conference Educational Fund; longtime activists and organizers in the South; jailed and harassed many times for civil rights activity and organizing
- Stewart Brand - Editor and publisher of the Whole Earth Catalog, the most incredible do it yourself kit in existence
- Michael "Bumblebee" Herthneck - national MayDay organizer; activist and organizer for Gay Liberation; former seminary student; worked with the Quakers in Culebra, Puerto Rico
- Noam Chomsky - Professor of Linguistics at Mass. Inst. of Technology; a founder and member of Resist; Author of American Power And The New Mandarins, also many books and articles on linguistics, philosophy, political and social theory

- Jay Craven - last year's Student Body President at Boston University; member of the U.S. Student Peace Treaty delegation to Vietnam in Dec. 1970; national organizer for MayDay demonstrations and the People's Peace Treaty; testified before Senate Foreign Relations Committee last April on Indo-China & Peace Treaty; traveled this past summer in Cuba; recently met with the Vietnamese delegation in Paris; organizer for the Evict Nixon Campaign
- Elaine Brown - member of the Central Committee of the Black Panther Party; Panther organizer in Southern California
- Rennie Davis - brought back three prisoners (American) of the Vietnam War in 1969; National Coordinator for the Mobilization Committee to End The War In Vietnam; member of the Chicago Conspiracy 8; organizer for: Join Community Union, 68 Democratic Convention, MayDay, Evict Nixon Campaign; traveled to North Vietnam twice (1967 & 69)
- * Fred Branfman - Director of Project Air War, a nine person research group, which has more information about the expanding air war and automated battlefields in S. E. Asia, and more documentation of the fact that the War is not "winding down," than any other group except the Pentagon; spent four years in Laos (67-71); speaks Laotian & French fluently; has interviewed thousands of War refugees and dozens of American pilots and U. S. officials, enabling him to describe graphically the situation of tens of thousands of Indo-Chinese huddled underground to avoid the 2000 tons of bombs being reigned on them daily by the U. S. Airforce
- David Dellinger - Editor of Liberation Magazine; former Chairman of the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, and organizer for virtually every major anti-war action since 1965; member of the Chicago Conspiracy 8; Since 1965 has traveled to: Cuba, China, Saigon, North Vietnam, Thailand, Cambodia, Paris Peace Talks
- Marlene Dixon - Women's Liberation organizer and activist; Sociologist; PH.D; effectively black listed in USA after leading Women's Liberation, anti-administration action at Univ. of Chicago, spring 1968; now teaching in Canada, McGill University as a result; published in Ramparts, Nation
- Jennifer Dohrn - active in the anti-war & anti-imperialism movement; community organizer in Chicago; organizer for Women's Liberation; recently met with Timothy Leary and Eldridge Cleaver in Algeria and traveled through Mid-East
- Muhammed Kenyatta - organized black student unions for the Northern Student Movement; spent 3 1/2 years doing voter registration for the Freedom Democratic Party in Mississippi; integrally involved in 1969 in formulating the ideology of the Black Manifesto with the Black Economic Development Conference; presently National Vice Chairman of the Conference; visited Vietnam & China this summer as a delegate of the Black Worker's Congress

- Donald Duncan - former Editor of Ramparts; and author of New Legions; 10 1/2 years of his life spent in the U. S. Army, 5 of those years in the Special Forces (Green Berets) - the last year and a half in Vietnam; activist in G.I. organizing and resistance
- Linda Evans - member of the Weatherpeople faction of SDS; formerly a national SDS organizer; currently under indictment for SDS activities; active in Women's Liberation and anti-war movement
- Carol Evans - anti-war activist; formerly a coordinator for the People's Coalition For Peace & Justice and for the MayDay Youth Coalition, sponsors of the recent MayDay demonstrations; was subpoenaed by the Grand Jury investigating MayDay; cited for contempt for refusing to talk, and jailed; her case (illegal wiretapping) now pending in the Supreme Court; currently an organizer for the Peace Action Coalition
- Richard Fernandez - Co-Director of Clergy & Laymen Concerned About The War In Vietnam; project director for the Chicago Convention demonstrations in 68, and for the March on Washington in 69; co-director of Vietnam Summer, 1967; spent three weeks in Laos and North Vietnam, Spring 1970; spoke with American prisoners of war in North Vietnam; member of Committee of Laison, which deals with prisoner of war issues
- Ann Froines - teaching in Feminist Studies Program at Cambridge-Goddard Graduate School, specializing in women's history, women in the Third World, and U. S. policies in the Third World; active in women's movement; mother of a four year old daughter; traveled to China, North Vietnam and North Korea in 1970 as a member of an anti-imperialist delegation from the anti-war movement
- John Froines - Chemistry professor at Goddard College; taught chemistry at the University of Oregon; Ph.D; member of the Chicago Conspiracy 8; national organizer for the MayDay demonstrations; co-founder of Radical Science Information Service; organizer for the Evict Nixon Campaign; community organizer in New Haven 1964-66
- Fred Gardner - editor and reporter for Ramparts Magazine; initiated organizing drive around the country to establish G.I. coffee houses and foster G.I. resistance
- Susan Gregory - for the past three years has been involved in national organizing in the areas of repression, anti-war, and sexism; activist in the women's movement, concentrating on anti-imperialism and sexism; one of the organizers of the Indo-Chinese Women's Conference in Canada (71); worked in Washington with the women's collective publishing Off Our Backs, a women's liberation publication; currently doing feminist studies

- Robert Greenblatt - faculty drop out from Cornell University (67); co-founder National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam; National Coordinator for Pentagon March in 67; on the Executive Committee of New University Conference; National Coordinator for the People's Peace Treaty; visited North Vietnam in 68; has participated in many meetings & contacts with the Vietnamese
- Fred Halstead - was the 1968 Presidential Candidate of the Socialist Workers Party; organizer and coordinator for the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam; former labor union organizer; a leading anti-war organizer with the Fifth Ave. Peace Parade Committee in N. Y.; and currently a National Coordinator for the Peace Action Coalition; writes for the Militant
- Doug Hostetter - a member of the People's Peace Treaty delegation to North & South Vietnam in 1970; spent three years doing community development work in central Vietnam; speaks fluent Vietnamese; an authority on Vietnam; currently, a student at the New School for Social Research in N.Y.
- Karl Hess - self-educated school drop-out at 15; formerly Barry Goldwater's principal assistant & speech writer; the writer & co-editor of the 1960 & 64 Republican Platform; a consultant to the White House Staff during Eisenhower years; formerly editor of Newsweek; currently a Fellow of the Institute For Policy Studies in Washington where he conducts a series of seminars entitled "Right & Left"; attributes his enlightenment to the conservative rhetoric, "Liberty on the lips, authoritarianism in the bowels"
- Al Hubbard - Co-Director of Vietnam Veterans Against the War; served in Vietnam with the U. S. Airforce; organizer and coordinator of the Vietnam Veteran demonstrations in Washington last April
- David Ifshin - past president of the National Student Association; an organizer of the People's Peace Treaty Delegation to North & South Vietnam; has traveled extensively throughout the world in conjunction with student activities & organizing; just returned from a tour of South America where he was beaten and jailed for participating in student demonstrations
- Nancy Kurshan - Secretary General of the Youth International Party; a movement & community organizer in New York and Ohio; high level Yippie strategist; active in women's movement; anonymous author of Do It!

- Paul Krassner - Editor, publisher and muse of The Realist; a film critic for Cavalier and Society Editor for Ramparts; a guest on many national T.V. shows; selected by Esquire as one of the hundred best people in the world; a co-founder of the Youth International Party; a Yippie Field Marshall for Chicago Convention demonstrations in 68
- Flo Kennedy - activist in Black and Third World struggle; ad hoc attorney; actress; Paul Krassner's adopted mother; conducts class at the Alternate University NYC on institutionalized oppression; delegate to the National Conference on Black Power, 1967,68,69
- John "Dancing Bear" Leland - counter-culture media & press; creator of an alternative news broadcast network. Information release! Audio & video tape. Mayday, collectives, human liberation, drugs, spirituality, good karma and good vibes... an' don't forget to smash the state
- Julius Lester - Third World Liberationist; author: Look Out, Whitey! Black Power's Gon' Get Your Mama, To Be A Slave, Revolutionary Notes, Black Folktales; former field secretary of SNCC; has had articles in numerous publications; formerly a columnist for the Guardian
- Jerry Lefcourt - A member of the Law Commune (for Movement defense); fired from the Legal Aid Society for starting a lawyers union; then organized the first lawyers demonstration against the courts; member of the National Lawyers Guild, and the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee; Abbie Hoffman's lawyer; led the legal team that successfully defended the New York Panther 21
- Mark Lane - lawyer and author; active in investigating American war crimes; co-sponsor of the Winter Soldier Investigation; author of Rush To Judgement
- Mike Lerner - member of the Seattle 8; organizer for the Seattle Liberation Front; formerly a political science instructor at the University of Washington; organizer for the MayDay demonstrations; writes for Ramparts Magazine; instrumental in the organization and development of the New American Movement
- Brad Lyttle - National Coordinator for People's Coalition for Peace & Justice; formerly Coordinator of War Tax Resistance; active in: Committee for Nonviolent Action, San Francisco to Moscow Walk For Peace, Quebec to Quantanamo Walk For Peace, Polaris Action; author of National Defense Through Nonviolent Resistance, and articles in Liberation & other movement publications

- Carol Lipman - National Project Director of Women's National Abortion Action Coalition; active as an organizer and spokeswoman in the areas of civil rights, anti-war, and women's liberation; organized the first anti-war teach-in at Tufts University; National Coordinator of the Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam, 1969-70; organizer of the April 24 anti-war demonstration in San Francisco, largest demonstration in the City's history; Secretary of Student Mobilization Committee
- Russell Means - National Coordinator for the American Indian Movement; organizing Indians throughout the country for the express purpose of self determination - to enable them to gain control over their own affairs; an Oglala Sioux; activist representative of Indians and their problems to national and local government officials
- John McAuliff - Peace Corps volunteer in Peru; AFSC volunteer in Mexico; National Chairman, Committee of Return Volunteers, an organization demanding radical change in U.S. policy toward Third World countries while opposing corporate involvement in Asia, Africa, & Latin America; member of Executive Committee of the National Council to Repeal the Draft; MayDay organizer; coordinator for People's Peace Treaty
- Chip Marshall - active in organizing and building the New American Movement; Seattle Liberation Front activist; national MayDay organizer; member of the Seattle 8 (indicted for demonstrations protesting Chicago Conspiracy Trial outcome);
- George Metesky - the illegitimate father of Abbie Hoffman; spiritual godfather and patron saint of the Weather Underground
- Doug Miranda - West Coast organizer for the Black Panther Party; active in the New Haven rallies in support of Bobby Seale; and in the Merritt College strike in Oakland last winter;
- Frank Joyce - community organizer & longtime civil rights activist in Detroit; Chicago Conspiracy 8 Trial staff member; anti-war organizer; he has visited North Vietnam twice and recently met with the Vietnamese delegation in Paris; articles published in Liberation, Win, and Ramparts
- * Elizabeth McAlister - Catholic Nun (Sisters of The Sacred Heart of Mary); has participated in various peace activities since 1964, and has supported actions against the Selective Service since 1967; M.A. degree in art history from Hunter College; indicted in the Berrigan Conspiracy Case

- Dr. Joel Fort - Physician-author specializing in public health, drug abuse, youth problems, and social reform; consultant on drug abuse to World Health Organization, 1963-4; private practice of psychiatry including outpatient and hospital treatment of drug abusers; lecturer at Univ. of California, Berkeley; author of The Pleasure Seekers: The Drug Crisis, Youth & Society
- Colin Nieberger - MayDay organizer in Boston; community organizer in Boston and Columbus, Ohio; Gay Liberation activist; writer for Gay Liberation publications; subpoenaed by the Detroit Grand Jury investigating & harassing the Movement
- Sidney Peck - National Coordinator for the People's Coalition for Peace & Justice; former coordinator of the National Mobilization Committee; has been involved in virtually all major demonstrations against the War; visited North Vietnam and has met with the North Vietnamese delegation in Paris; professor at Case-Western Univ.
- Marcus Raskin - Co-Director of the Institute For Policy Studies; Trustee of Antioch College; Formerly, Consultant to Office of Science & Technology on Education (White House Staff) during Kennedy Administration; Author of: The Viet Nam Reader, Deterrence & Reality, Being and Doing
- Jerry Rubin - ran for Mayor in Berkeley; Project Director for March on the Pentagon; charter member & co-founder of the Youth International Party; Yippie strategist for the Chicago Democratic Convention demonstrations; a member of the Chicago Conspiracy 8; author of: Do It!, and We Are Everywhere
- Robert Scheer - former Editor of Ramparts Magazine; U. S. Senate candidate in California on the Peace & Freedom Party ticket; organized and led an anti-imperialist delegation of Americans on a three month tour of North Vietnam, China, and North Korea in 1970; a member of the Red Family Collective in Berkeley
- Andrew Stapp - Court-martialed 3 times and finally discharged as undesirable for his union activity as Chairman and founder of the American Servicemen's Union. Integral to the ASU program is its firm stand against racism, the War in S.E. Asia, and the privileged officer caste
- Jeff Shero - founder of Austin Texas' underground paper, The Rag; co-founder of the Southern Student Organizing Committee; formerly Editor of The Rat, New York's leading underground paper; was a member of the National Council of SDS; has a radio news and rap program in Huston

George Smith -



a prisoner of the Vietcong in Vietnam for two years (63-65); he was a medic with the Special Forces when his base was overrun and he was captured; he was released two years to a day after his capture in a gesture honoring Norman Morrison, the Quaker who immolated himself on the steps of the Pentagon; he was confined for six months after his release by the Army because he told newsmen that he would "join the peace movement" when he returned home; pressure by the peace movement finally brought his release; was active in the Winter Soldier investigation into U. S. war crimes; currently, a rural mailcarrier in New Cumberland, West Virginia & president of his union local; he lives with his wife and three children in Ohio

Arlo Tatum -

National Secretary of Central Committee for Conscientious Objectors in Philadelphia; editor of Handbook For Conscientious Objectors; co-author: Guide To The Draft; has conducted Selective Service seminars across the country for lawyers, lay draft counselors, and draft-age men; testified before Kennedy sub-committee on draft

Leonard Weinglass - Co-council with Bill Kunstler in the Chicago Conspiracy Trial; member of a lawyers collective in Newark, New Jersey; specializes in movement cases

Cora Weiss -

Director of the Liaison Committee With Families of Servicemen Detained in North Vietnam, which deals with problems involving American prisoners of war and their families; the Committee has more information about the POW situation than any other organization in the Country; an organizer for Women's Strike For Peace; and formerly a national coordinator for the National Mobilization Committee to End the War in Vietnam

Buleah Sanders -

President of the National Welfare Rights Organization; longtime activist and organizer in the Black Community; works full time on efforts to improve the living situation of welfare recipients & to gain and protect their rights

Dr. Quentin Young -

past National Chairman of the Medical Committee For Human Rights; was in the South during Freedom Summer in 1963-4 with the Medical Com. H.R.; currently Editor of Health Rights News, the publication of MCHR; helped organize MCHR at Chicago Convention, 68;

Howard Zinn -

Professor of Government at Boston University; formerly Chairman of the History Dept. at Spelman College in Atlanta; was a member of the Executive Board of SNCC; anti-war activist; author of: The Southern Mystique, SNCC: The New Abolitionists, Vietnam: The Logic of Withdrawal, and Disobedience And Democracy; member of Resist

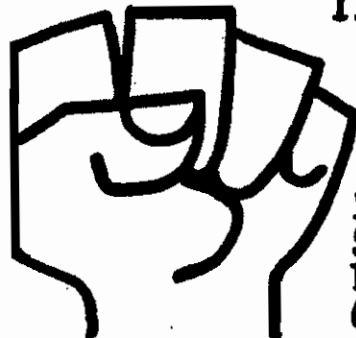

NIXON says "the War is winding down" - BULL SHIT!

THE WAR IS NOT "WINDING DOWN"



WITHDRAWAL

While the American troops are coming home, the technology of the War has been escalated. 60,000 tons of bombs were dropped on the Indochinese people every month of Johnson's Presidency - - Nixon has drastically stepped up that killing, averaging 96,000 tons of bombs dropped every 30 days since becoming President. While the "War was winding down," the number of human beings killed or crippled or driven into refugee camps is 22,000 more a month than the 95,000 monthly war casualties under Lyndon Johnson.*

The bombing goes on beyond the range of newsmen and cameras. The official US line is that no civilians are bombed, despite the stream of refugees (that now number 10 million) flooding into camps and urban centers.

A number of speakers listed in this bulletin can clarify the actual situation in S. E. Asia and document the technological expansion of the War. * facts and figures stated here can be verified by checking with the Pentagon, the U.S. Senate Judiciary Sub-committee on Refugees & Escapees, or by reading the recently released Preliminary Report: The Air War In Indochina issued by the Center For International Studies at Cornell University
