The amount of literature on drug addiction, abuse and misuse is staggering. These problems, their causes and their possible cures have generated much interest, speculation, research and discussion by experts in many fields.

The listing of publications which follows is representative of the divergent opinions which abound on the subject. It is not meant to be a comprehensive listing but merely a point from which to start when investigating the problems of drug addiction and misuse.

Bear in mind that none of these works can be considered to contain THE ANSWER, but that the opinions presented by each merit some consideration.

The works are presented in four categories:

GENERAL INFORMATION

Those works which contain general information on all aspects of narcotic addiction and drug misuse.

NARCOTIC ADDICTION

Those books, papers, articles and abstracts which deal primarily with narcotics, addiction, addicts and treatment.

PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

Amphetamines, barbiturates, tranquilizers and other drugs normally available by prescription.

HALLUCINOGENS

LSD, marijuana, peyote, mescaline and solvents.

Many of these works also contain excellent bibliographies for more detailed study of the specific subjects.
