TO: Key NATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO IMPEACH NEAON contacts.

CONCERNING: A revision of the LOBBY-IN schedule, and some related matters.

FROM: The NCIN Washington office.

After consultation with several cities and people around the country, we have decided to change the dates of the NATIONAL LOBBY-IN. We have decided to reschedule the full week for the NATIONAL LOBBY-IN to February 4 through February 8. Participants who are able to come during January are asked to plan for Friday, Jan. 25, the last day of the week originally scheduled.

Our local contacts have cited several problems about the January 21-25 dates. Many are too busy planning the local town meetings and local congressional visits to initiate LOBBY-IN action. Many college campuses are just starting in mid January and would like time to plan participation. A number of localities were very interested in trying to get a sizable number of people down during a LOBBY-IN week but felt they could be much more successful if it took place a couple of weeks later. At the same time we felt that, for those who are planning, or will be planning to come down during the original week, that option should be left open, thus the Jan. 25 date.

We will be trying to call as many of you as possible to begin the coordination of plans for the LOBBY-IN, but we would encourage you to call here when your plans relative to the action take shape. We would be interested in knowing primarily five things: 1. The date that you would want to come (if you had a preference). 2. The number of people you expect to be able to pull together. 3. Whether or not you would have people staying overnight who would need housing. 4. Whether or not you would want us to set up meetings with Congresspeople, and if so, when and with whom. 5. The extent to which you would like to follow the proposed scenario listed in the first newsletter--the Lafayette Park rally, the visible march up Pennsylvania Ave. to Capitol Hill, a "radical tour" of your nation's Capital (i.e., the Bureau of Indian Affairs building occupied by Native-Americans last November, the site of the Poor People's Resurrection City, the "Hooverville" camp-site of the "Bonus Marchers" of the 1930's, etc.), and a gathering afterwards with music, workshops, opportunity to relax together, etc., before leaving for home.

Also, one last thing: A couple of days after you receive this, NATIONAL IMPEACHMENT LOBBY-IN posters will be ready. They'll be three-color, 17 X 22 size. Let us know how many you want. We would ask that you send us 10¢ for each one you get to cover printing and mailing costs but we're more than willing to absorb the costs if you can't afford it.
