

# IMPEACHMENT MEMO #3

Concerning: The upcoming National Impeachment Conference and related matters.

Dear Friends,

1. We are enclosing a copy of a brochure we have done up describing the NATIONAL CAMPAIGN TO IMPEACH NIXON. We send it to you first of all to give you a better sense of who we are and secondly to let you determine if there are ways it could be revised to be more clear, more inspirational, more to the point, etc. If you have ideas or suggestions be sure to bring them to Chicago.

2. You will notice in the brochure at the bottom of the page of text a reference to a "three-day CITIZEN'S IMPEACH-IN in Washington. . ." This is one of the tentative parts of the brochure since, as you know, there has as yet been no decision to hold such an event, though the founding conference did call for a "mass demonstration" in late April or early May. The CITIZENS' IMPEACH-IN is our idea as to what could be a creative, imaginative, successful and important event, something other than solely a mass outpouring which would then listen to 25 speakers. The CITIZENS' IMPEACH-IN would consist of two days of large-scale lobbying in Congress Thursday and Friday, April 25 and 26, to be followed by a focused demonstration with 5 or 6 speakers Saturday, April 27, and an "impeachment fair" with a wide variety of groups putting up displays, booths, literature tables, etc. to follow. We think this could be a powerful event, and we would like you to know about it and begin thinking about it before the conference. In addition, if you are talking to people between now and then, this scenario and those dates could be put forward as something tentative for them to begin thinking of.

3. We're in the process of lining up resource people for the conference for the various parts of the agenda. There is a good possibility that folksinger Phil Ochs will be with us for at least part of the weekend. Workshops in the afternoon Saturday on "Beyond Impeachment" topics will include ones on: "Watergate and the Indochina War" with Jane Fonda and Tom Hayden (tentative); "Impeachment and the Bicentennial" with a movie of the Boston Tea Party (1973 version) and staff from the Peoples' Bicentennial Commission office in Washington; "Towards a Radical Impeachment Program" with Ted Lieberman and Arthur Waskow (tentative); and "Impeachment: A Step Towards a Mass Party" with representatives of various third party and pre-party groupings present. If you have suggestions for other workshops let us know.

Be sure to bring a sleeping bag if you don't have friends or hotel money, and we'll be looking for you in Chicago Friday, March 1.
