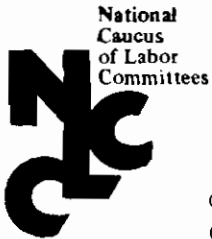
'ZERO POPULATION GROWTH' ANTI-WORKING CLASS QUACKERY!

The facts of economic decay and the failure of the capitalist class to expand needed production are daily becoming a very real part of working people's lives - in overcrowded hospitals; housing shortages; cuts in city budgets for public services and welfare; wage cuts; inflation and unemployment.

Stepping forward from campuses across the U.S., academics and scientists are trying to outbid one another for top job as apologists for their capitalist employers -- "The technology itself is at fault, economic growth is impossible, the working class will just have to 'tighten its belt' and begin to 'conserve' the present level of misery."

Through our electoral activities, propaganda, and interventions into this Zero Growth movement, the Labor Committee has begun the job of exposing the idea of "zero growth" as both a scientific fraud and a recruiting ground for proto-fascist "enforcers" of the capitalist class' plans for all out union busting and a "final solution" for the welfare population.

At a forum held last week, NCLC Congressional candidate A. Robert Kaufman outlined the socialist strategy of building an organization which unites employed, unemployed, welfare victims, and students around a common program; supporting the struggles of all working people and developing the kind of political muscle capable of reversing capitalist attacks on wages and living conditions.

In this 'Tuesdays' presentation, NCLC spokesman John Asher will expose the Zero Growth movement as an expression of the program of the capitalist class during impending depression and counterpose to it a Socialist working class program of expanded production as the necessary task for humanity in this period.
