William Colby head of the CIA is on the run. Below reprinted is his statement to the Washington Post (Feb. 19, after the paper's article on NCLC Feb. 17). He is running from the NCLC's exposure of how the CIA has stepped up insurrectionary activity here, in Europe, and the Middle East.

NCLC intelligence teams have thrown the spotlight on the CIA's involvement in Watergate, in the Symbionese Liberation Army psy-war stunt, in the LEAA population control network, and other coordinated domestic operations. We have released otherwise unavailable evidence of CIA connected preparations for military takeover in Britain and Italy. Behind the CIA stands exposed the Rockefeller and Mellon interests, operating through loyal front men like Henry Kissinger.

Many of you reading this are already relying on the NCLC intelligence network. Tens of thousands around the country and in Europe already expect regular international briefings from the NCLC and the European Labor Committees to find out what is really going on.

Our only problem is money. We must have \$20,000 a month minimum for telephone, printing, and other costs in order to keep our communications open. Real information on which to base appropriate action is our only guarantee against the actual military takeovers NOW on the drawing boards for Europe and eventually the U. S.

### *The CIA Denies Charges*

The Washington Post's story about the National Caucus of Labor Committees (of Feb. 17, 1974) could leave the impression with some of your readers that the CIA, through its refusal to comment, indeed might be involved in the kinds of activities the NCLC alleges. Our recollection is that we told your reporter that the NCLC appeared to be

a domestic organization, so he should ask the Federal Bureau of Investigation rather than CIA for information about it. While it appeared self-evident that the NCLC charges are only twisted fantasy, your circulation of them forces CIA to deny them flatly as false.
