ON INAUGURATION DAY

**TO MAKE NIXON SIGN THE OCT. 20th TREATY

On Oct. 20th, the representatives of the Vietnamese people made public a peace treaty which the U.S. government side had agreed to sign by Oct. 31. Since that time Nixon has not only gone back on that promise (which he also held out to the war-weary American people) but has viciously escalated the air war against North Vietnam.

The Vietnamese peoples' organizations have issued an urgent appeal to the American and world movements to demand that Nixon live up to his word and SIGN THE TREATY!

WE MUST RESPOND TO THAT APPEAL.

The vast majority of the American people, with a huge and growing anger, realize that they have been lied to by Nixon. The demand that Nixon Sign the treaty Now! would also get the greatest response from this mass sentiment.

On Inauguration Day (Saturday, Jan 20) Mad Bomber Nixon will be sworn in for another 4 years. We must be there to give him the reception he deserves. We must also be in other cities organizing people who can't go to Washington so they can manifest their protest in whatever way possible.

But we cannot make the impact necessary if we come as competing coalitions trying to drown out each others' chants. Although everyone should have the right to come with their own slogans, this should not submerge the unity of our main demands.

In Washington, and in every city throughout the country, we must be heard as one voice: demanding that NIXON STOP THE BOMBING! SIGN THE TREATY! AND GET OUT NOW!
