BECOME ACTIVE in your local SANE Committee. Help in the education of your community. If there is not a SANE group near you, we can help you start one.

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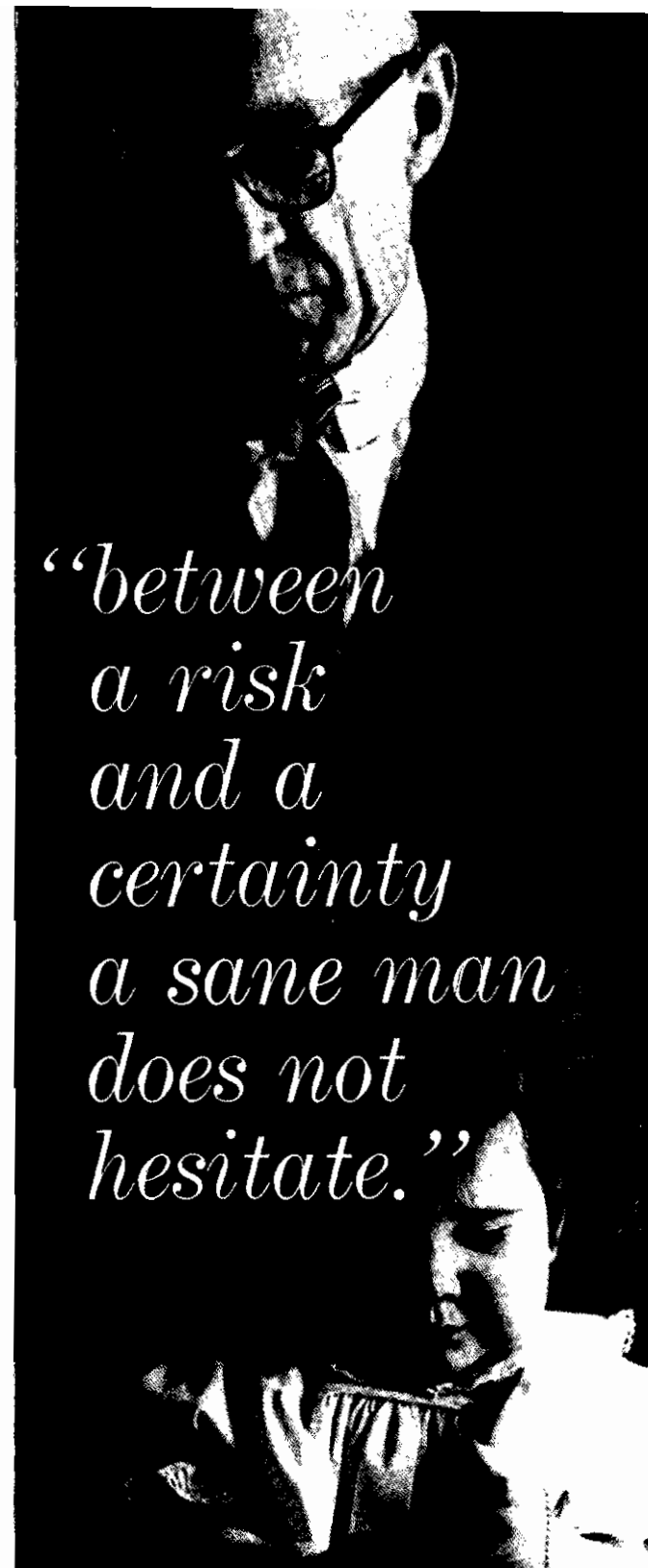

*“Within, at the most ten years, some of these bombs are going off. I am saying this as responsibly as I can. That is the certainty. On the one side, therefore, we have a finite risk (negotiated agreements). On the other side we have a certainty of disaster. Between a risk and a certainty a sane man does not hesitate.”

SANE (National Committee for a SANE Nuclear Policy) stands for:

- Permanent cessation of nuclear weapons tests:**
- MORATORIUM on tests until a treaty is signed.
- INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENT to end all forms of nuclear weapons tests.
- ADEQUATE INSPECTION to prevent treaty violations.
- RATIFICATION of treaty by U.S. Senate.
- INCLUSION of all nations.

- General and complete disarmament:**
- GENERAL to include all types of weapons.
- COMPLETE down to police levels of small arms.
- PHASED in stages of arms control which are fair to each nation.
- INSPECTED to deter violations.
- UNIVERSAL to include all nations.

- Strengthened United Nations:**
- PERMANENT PEACE FORCE to discourage aggression.
- STRONGER WORLD COURT to arbitrate conflicts and encourage justice.
- MASSIVE U.N. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM using substantial savings from disarmament.

- Partial arms control measures:**
- PREVENTION of the spread of nuclear weapons to additional nations.
- DISENGAGEMENT of armed forces in

- tension areas through inspected and phased withdrawals.
- MEASURES to reduce risk of war by accident or failure of communication.
- COOPERATIVE research in outer space and prohibition of militarization of space.

- American initiatives to thaw the cold war and turn toward peace:**
- In an atmosphere of mutual distrust, negotiations may not lead to formal agreement. A series of steps undertaken by the U.S., apart from negotiations, could help reduce tensions and improve the climate for agreement. Such initiatives could be of many kinds:
- STEPS TO SLOW THE ARMS RACE, including measures to prevent accidental war, and the scaling down of some weapons systems and production without jeopardizing our security.

- NEW APPROACHES TO POLITICAL SETTLEMENTS in Germany, Southeast Asia, Cuba, and other trouble spots.
- A SHIFT IN NATIONAL EMPHASIS from military hardware to expenditure on economic and ideological projects throughout the world with a national commitment to a world development program.

- Economic planning for peace:**
- NATIONAL PLANNING for the transition to a peacetime economy.
- COMMUNITY PLANNING, not for civil defense, but for economic readjustment.

WHAT SANE DOES

INFLUENCES public and official opinion by publishing advertisements in major newspapers, and by maintaining a Washington Office for political action.

DEVELOPS POLITICAL EFFECTIVENESS on questions of war and peace by advising citizens on issues before the government through its Washington office, through action memoranda, and by aiding political candidates.

EDUCATES by publishing and distributing hundreds of thousands of pieces of literature, through national coverage in magazine articles, and by its bi-weekly newsletter, SANE WORLD.

MAINTAINS close liaison with the U.S. and other Missions to the U.N. and with kindred disarmament organizations throughout the world.

COOPERATES with national organizations and provides them with educational materials and speakers.

ESTABLISHES local SANE committees throughout America from Minneapolis to Miami and from Boston to San Francisco. These local committees conduct public meetings, forums, and debates, write letters to policymakers, hold demonstrations, and support political candidates.
