Subject: Andrew Davis case and information on legislation

Enclosed is an article about Andrew Davis written on May 23, 1975. The article gives a good run down on Andrew's current situation. A delegation led by Mrs. Rosalie Stewart, Andrew Davis' mother and Dee Knight went today to Washington D. C. to see Charles Goodell and demand Andrew's immediate release from prison. Also enclosed is a petition which was written with the help of Andrew's co-workers. It is being circulated by some of the people who worked with Andrew Davis when he was working as a social worker in Queens, N. Y. We urge wide distribution of this petition.

The information on legislation was written by Duane Shank of NISBO. None of the legislation is endorsed by NCUUA. This information should be helpful to you to get some idea of what is going on in Congress. Duane just called to say that Sen. M. Hatfield (R.Ore) has agreed to co-sponsor the Hart Bill. This was not included in his memo.

The third enclosure is an analysis of the Javits-Nelson Bill with suggested actions for opposing it. The Kastenmeier Committee is meeting the second week in June to write an Amnesty bill. They should hear from us about our opposition to Nelson-Javits and the need for universal unconditional amnesty.
