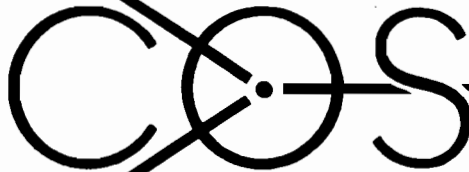



Since 1940 NISBCO has responded to the needs of conscientious objectors to the draft and military service by:

- * Providing professional counseling and draft information by mail and phone, and in our Washington D. C. office.
- * Providing accurate and up - to - date literature on draft and military law and policy for use by local counselors and counselees. Brief readable memos are available on every facet of the CO's classification and appeal procedures.
- * Aiding COs in the armed forces who seek noncombatant transfer or discharge.
- * Maintaining an extensive referral service to local counseling agencies in all areas of the country, and to attorneys who can aid those in need of legal counsel.
- * Providing alternative service counseling for COs seeking meaningful 1 - W assignments.

NISBCO staff members are constantly alert to legislative and administrative changes affecting COs and are in regular dialog with government personnel on behalf of COs.

Current information is published monthly in NISBCO's "Reporter" newsletter. Literature order blanks are available upon request.
