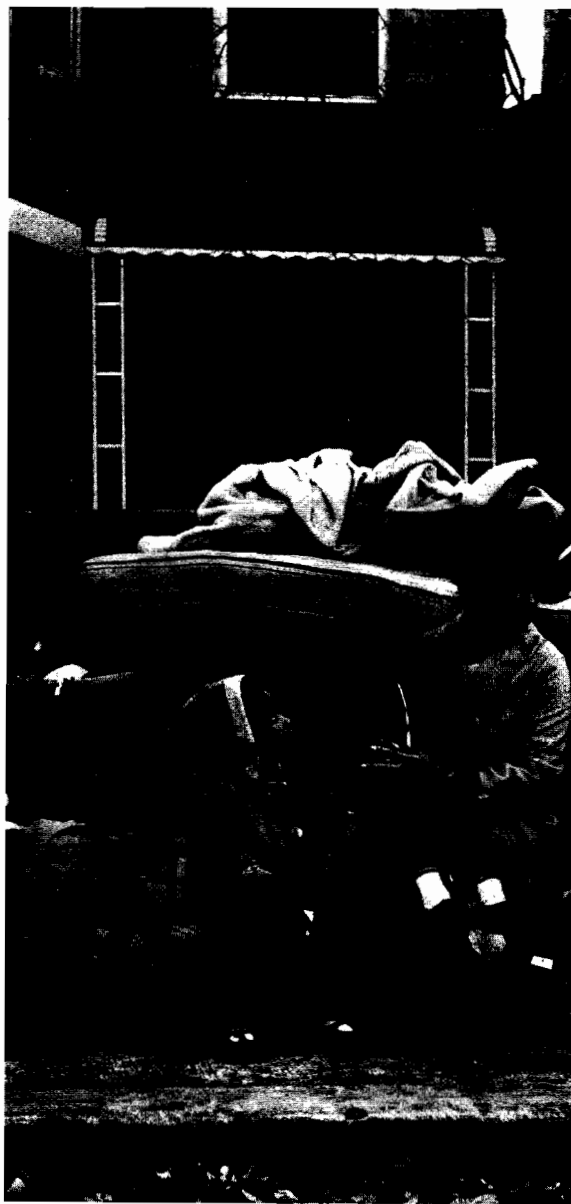

### **NLADA Voice For Law And The Poor**

NLADA works with federal agencies, Congress, and other organizations on behalf of Legal Services, Legal Aid and Public Defender programs and attorneys throughout the United States and its territories.

NLADA works to affect those national policy decisions which concern the legal rights of the poor and the case of JUSTICE.

NLADA gives voice to those who are powerless and unable to exert influence on decisions affecting their lives and Constitutional rights.

### **Technical Assistance (T/A)**

NLADA is the leading expert in assisting local programs to use their talents and resources more efficiently. We assist in office administration, litigation, developing funding applications and methods by which programs can handle overwhelming caseloads.

Through on-site staff and consultant visits, training programs, conferences, and evaluations, our T/A projects enable member programs to extend their limited resources and improve service to the poor.

### **Research And Amicus Briefs**

NLADA files amicus curiae briefs in those cases in which the issues are of vital concern and national import to the rights of the poor. Such cases have included many landmark decisions — the unconstitutionality of withdrawal of government benefits without prior hearings; challenging a state's denial of indigents access to its courts solely because of inability to pay certain fees and court costs; the unconstitutionality of changing a fine to a jail sentence because of indigency. Research conducted in many areas of law necessary to the practice and further development of poverty law.

### **National Law Office (NLO)**

NLADA's National Law Office works for needed reform in our nation's prisons and in the treatment of juveniles.

NLO has established significant precedents in litigation concerning the constitutionality of many prison practices and is developing national standards for correctional reform.

NLO has created the Prisoners' Rights Organization (PRO) to coordinate defender offices' work in this area. It has joined with the American Civil Liberties Union and the NAACP Legal Defense Fund, among others, to form the National Committee for Prisoners' Rights to serve as a clearing-house of prison reform information.

### **Publications, Information Services, And Public Relations**

NLADA publishes a bi-monthly magazine, the BRIEFCASE, and a newsletter. These publications provide NLADA members with information on substantive developments in poverty law and news of events concerning JUSTICE in AMERICA.

Other publications include NLADA's Directory of Legal Aid and Defender Services in the U. S. and Canada, and its national statistical survey. Substantive legal books and studies are continually developed and offered for sale.

NLADA is the authoritative source for information concerning justice and the poor and legal assistance efforts throughout the U. S.

NLADA also provides public relations for the significant accomplishments of member programs and attorneys. It also highlights those national issues of concern to the poor, and promotes the concept of free legal assistance.
