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NSRP MASS MEETINGS CONTINUED

Never has a more emotional issue faced the White people of America than the forced busing of children. There are cases where little White girls are being bused up to 90 miles just to have the "privileges" of going to school with Black savages.

The National States Rights Party has been engaged in a vigorous campaign to rally the people behind a boycott campaign. We call for the people to withhold their children from the integrated schools in cities like Jacksonville, Fla., where a certain amount of money is withheld by the state for every week a child is not in attendance. A study has been made which reveals that if 20,000 children would boycott the Jacksonville schools for only 6 weeks the school system would collapse.

In Richmond, Virginia the NSRP is waging a very vigorous "Boycott Busing" campaign. We are telling the people to keep their children off the buses. We are explaining that the back of forced busing can be broken by simply taking your child to the neighborhood school of your choice. We are telling the people not to bother to register the child, but take him by the hand to the proper grade and physically place the child in the class room. If there is no chair available, carry a folding chair and tell your child to remain in his seat.

We will see to it later that the children do indeed receive credit for their class room work and attendance. The parents have been told to remain out in front of the school, if necessary, to make sure no one dares to forcibly remove their child from the school. By simply taking a stand and refusing to place our children on these buses we can break the back on this despicable drive to destroy our children. Beaumont, Texas has also been an object of intense Anti-busing drive by the NSRP.

On Wednesday, Aug. 12, I (Dr. Fields) flew to Richmond.. There I was joined by Dalton Mason and George Andrews, two of our youth corps from Durham, N. C. Chapter Leader Raymond Adams was able to provide us with enough manpower to have three separate crews canvassing the city of Richmond. For three days, prior to the scheduled rally, we distributed 9,000 handbills, and 1,000 copies of the August "Thunderbolt." Out of this we obtained a good number of new people at the rally, at least 400 who had never before heard our message. This figure was to double by the following Sunday rally of Aug. 22nd.

But the following day, Saturday called for another journey. That was a quick drive up to Baltimore for an out door rally in Patasco Park. We were joined by Don DeTurk of Reading, Pa., John Goble and Jerry Heinemann of New Jersey (along with their famous color guard) for a vigorous NSRP demonstration in the park. Also on hand

was Baltimore Chapter Leader Bill Brailsford, and his lieutenants, Roland Rode, Tom Lawson and others. Immediately afterwards we returned back to Richmond, arriving there at 2 A. M.

Later we flew back to Savannah for more work on meeting promotions, which included preparation of handbills and advertisements for daily newspapers.

On Friday, Aug. 20, I flew to Jacksonville for an important conference with NSRP activists at "Holiday Inn West." About 75 of our hard core faithful were on hand to lay plans for the out door rally to be held Aug. 29th. Immediately thereafter I flew back to Richmond again. Attorney J. B. Stoner flew in the opposite direction, out to Beaumont, Texas to address an out door mass rally arranged by Everett Cross the local Chapter Leader. At this writing Mr. Stoner is still out in Texas.

Meanwhile back in Richmond the people gathered on the rally grounds behind the store of Raymond Adams on Darbytown road. This time the crowd was larger and more enthusiastic than ever before. The governor was not defending the people in the court fight against merger of school districts for long distance busing (according to the "Richmond Times-Dispatch.") We therefore asked for volunteers to march on the governor's mansion for a demonstration and picketing.

This received good press and T. V. coverage, despite the fact that the newspaper sought to play down the true size of our 100 car motorcade and 200 demonstrators. It was just the week before that we marched in mass on the home of the radical reconstructionist federal Judge Robert R. Merhige. He was guarded by three squad cars of county policemen and one car load of federal marshalls - so fearful is he of the wrath of the White people of his own community.

This is only a sketchy outline of what has been taking place since I last wrote. We are continuing to push this fight as the newspaper clippings reproduced herein will attest.

The total collection at the meeting came to \$110. Those attending were mostly farmers and working people with large families who are the ones facing the busing of their children to Blackboard jungle schools. They do not have much money and we cannot expect them to even begin to contribute enough to carry the full weight of mass out door rallies. The above was the expense of just one such rally. The previous week the NSRP took care of all the expenses of the youth corps members who traveled to Richmond to help - so there are many necessary costs that go into such campaigns to win the public to our cause.

You, our inner hard core of supporters, are the only ones we can turn to for help to carry on this vital work. The expenses for all the other meetings over the past three weeks raises the above figure much higher. We feel sure that you want us to continue to carry on this struggle to reach the masses of our people. We regret to state that the response to our last letter did not live up to our hopeful expectations.

We do not like to have to come before you during the last part of the summer, just before the Labor Day holiday weekend. We know that many folks are busy squeezing in last minute vacations. Others are out shopping for back to school items, etc., etc. But, we cannot wait another week or two to make an earnest plea for your financial support. The fact is that our NSRP treasury has been drained of working funds due to our great press forward for out door mass rallies. In order to keep driving forward we need your backing right now - THIS VERY WEEK!

I would not be writing you this pre-holiday letter if the situation were not of the most extreme importance. Please take time out from your busy schedule to fill out the enclosed coupon and rush it back in the reply envelope. I hope that many of you can give more than normal, maybe some of you can double your gift this week?

I hope that some will be able to make it \$100, or \$200, I know that many of you can give \$50 or \$30. Raymond Adams has actually worked as hard as all of your National Leaders (the Richmond rallies have been held on his property and he has been the victim of many harassing calls by Blacks) Mr. Adams has pledged to send \$200 to aid with the large bills we are facing. (As this is proof read, the \$200 has just now arrived.)

Therefore, if a front line fighter like Mr. Adams can sacrifice and make such a gift, there should be many others who can try and make a similar substantial contribution. Of course we know that most of you are limited to donations in the range of \$10 or \$5, etc. We would not be able to continue this work with out a large response from our smaller donors which always constitutes the larger part of that received. What I am trying to impress upon you here is the importance of the NEED!

75 States Rights Pickets Are Not Allowed at Mansion

A caravan of the segregationist States Rights party came into Richmond from a Henrico County rally again yesterday — this time to deliver pickets to the Governor's Mansion.

The 75 pickets did not get a chance to parade with their giant Confederate and Ameri-

can flags and signs that read "White Power" and "Boycott Busing." They found out they had to have a permit in advance.

But their caravan of 25 cars, led by a red car flying a giant Confederate battle flag, did circle the capitol and pass the

mansion gate twice.

The circling protest was a stop-and-go event, confused by tourists trying to drive out of Capitol Square.

When the protesters got out of their cars, they were vocal and angry, but they dispersed and left after a Capitol policeman told them they could not picket. They were at the Capitol about 15 minutes.

The group was again led by Dr. Edward R. Fields, national secretary of the party, who led a protest last Sunday outside the home of U. S. District Court Judge Robert R. Merhige Jr.

Savannah Chiropractor

Fields, a chiropractor from Savannah, Ga., said his party would hold a rally at 8 o'clock tonight and follow it up with another demonstration. He would not say where the protest is to be held.

C. L. Morrissett, a local States Rights party activist, told the group before it disbanded, "Let me get a permit for our outing next weekend."

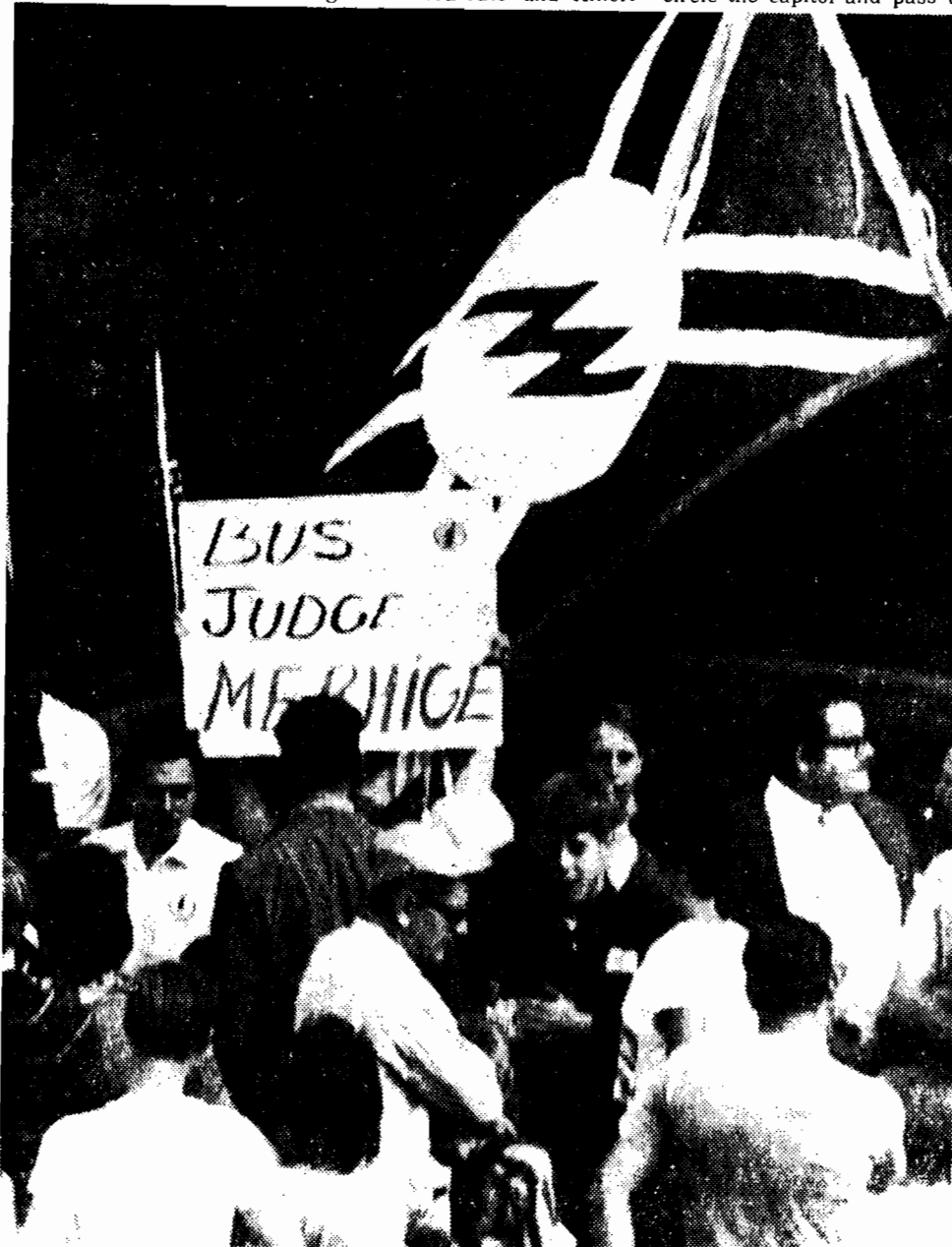
Fields said the pickets would be back, if they get a permit, next Sunday.

Gov. Linwood Holton and his family are in Virginia Beach until tomorrow.

The governor was the subject of some angry outbursts, sprinkled liberally with racial slurs, by the protesters.

One woman also shouted, "The governor can go to Chinese places, but he won't see us." She was talking about the Chinese New Year celebrations, she said.

The rally that led to the caravan was held at the Adams Farm in eastern Henrico. That's where tonight's rally will be held, Fields said.
