OUR NORDIC RACE by Richard Kelly Hoskins, Paperback, Illustrated.50¢

A capsule history of our race, told in an interesting way and abundant with colorful facts about our forbears. The perfect book for introducing young people to racial enlightenment.

EARLY CIVILIZATIONS OF THE NORDIC PEOPLES by Roger Pearson, Paperback, Illustrated. \$1.00

A brief survey of the early appearance of Nordic peoples around the world, including India, Greece and Rome. Of special interest are Pearson's descriptions of the physiological aspects of these early peoples, and their attitudes toward life and their fellow men.

THE DAWN OF EUROPEAN CIVILIZATION by V. Gordon Childe, Paperback, pp. 367 with maps, illustration, bibliography and index. . \$2.45

This is the sixth edition of Childe's enduring work of Europe's cultural and economic birth. During his lifetime, the author continually brought this book up-to-date in the light of all new archeological and historical evidence which was being discovered. *The Dawn of European Civilization* is considered the primary account of the evolution of Europe's distinctive culture.

THE VIKINGS AND THEIR ORIGINS: SCANDINAVIA IN THE FIRST MILLENNIUM by David Wilson, Hardback, pp. 144 with index, maps diagrams and 15 color plates, 95 black-and-white illustrations. \$5.95

The Vikings have been dubbed with a reputation as pirates and despoilers, but Wilson's book shows that, far from wrecking cultures of the lands they invaded, they usually enriched them. The scale of their exploits stand out in sharp relief during Europe's Dark Ages, for they conquered large areas of Britain, Normandy, Sicily and Russia; extended their trade routes from Byzantium and Persia to India, and established colonies in Iceland, Greenland and America. The author shows that we are indebted to these early Europeans for parts of our legal system, our tradition of individual freedom and large parts of our cultural heritage.

THE VIKINGS by Johannes Brønsted, Paperback, pp. 347 with index, bibliography and 24 plates \$1.65

Brønsted's exceptionally informative book covers primarily the height of the Viking era, A.D. 800 to 1100. He analyzed the motives for their notorious raids into foreign lands, and investigates why they were unable to secure permanent colonies in America. The Vikings' acceptance of Christianity, which was wholly alien to their view of life, is a subject of considerable interpretation by the author. He also considers such aspects of their society as the organization of their armies, their equipment and technology, their remarkable ships, their burial customs and their social organization.

A HISTORY OF THE VIKINGS by Gwen Jones, Hardback, pp. 504 with index, appendixes, bibliography and maps, copiously illustrated. . . \$12.50

Jones' study of the Vikings is considered the most comprehensive yet rendered in the English language. Tracing their origins back to the Northern European peoples of pre-A.D. 700, the Scandinavian community is closely examined in all of its conquests, movements, social developments and religious customs during the glorious Viking age. An exhaustive and thoroughly readable account of this exciting page of Aryan history.

ON BRITAIN (AGRICOLA) AND GERMANY by Cornelius Tacitus, Paperback, pp. 174. . \$1.25

Many of our most abiding impressions of the early Germans have been handed down to us by the writings of Tacitus. Tacitus was a Roman general whose service took him to the far corners of the Empire. *Germania* is a study of the character, customs and geography of the German tribes; in it Tacitus frequently contrasts the primordial virtues of the Germans with the degeneracy which was upon Rome, and makes special reference to the racial homogeneity of the tribes. *On Britian* is the biography of Julius Agricola, Tacitus' father-in-law and most famous Roman governor of Britain.

THE TESTIMONY OF THE SPADE by Geoffrey Bibby, Hardback, pp. 414, index, illustrated \$8.95

Testimony of the Spade is the first book written for the general public to trace consecutively the movements and the flowering of cultures of our early North European ancestors from the Alps to Scandinavia, and from Russia to Ireland—from the cave dwellers of France to the "barbarian" tribes described by Caesar and Tacitus and the Norse sagas. Bibby's citations of the latest archeological findings reveal that these early European civilizations were far from being culturally retarded, as they are all too often depicted. A truly magnificent job of recreating life in the European heartland from 15,000 B.C. up to the time of the Vikings.

Professor Gwen Jones is held by many students of Norse history to be the most knowledgeable and entertaining of scholars dealing with this subject. In *The Norse Atlantic Saga* he creates a powerful story of the men who set off on voyages in the cruel North Atlantic to discover new lands, found colonies, and sometimes suffer incalculable disappointment. Includes sections from four best-loved Viking sagas.

EIRIK THE RED AND OTHER ICELANDIC SAGAS, Selected and translated by Gwen Jones
Hardback, pp. 318. \$3.00

This selection of Viking sagas primarily describes the rugged existence and the often fatal feuds between rough-hewn individuals and families in Viking Iceland. Incomparable hardship and superhuman endurance characterized the lives of the early settlers, and the interaction of strong personalities often led to hostilities which were only quenched by blood.

THE VINLAND SAGAS & THE NORSE DISCOVERY OF AMERICA Translated by Magnus Magnusson and Hermann Palsson, Paperback, pp. 124 with maps. \$1.25

The two sagas presented here record the most fascinating voyages in the history of exploration. In their native prose the Norse bards recorded the first European glimpse of the new world more than five hundred years before Columbus' voyages, and of the strange red Indians (*sakraelings*) living here.

LAXDAELA SAGA, Translated by Magnus Magnusson and Hermann Palsson, Paperback, pp. 272 with maps. \$1.95

Laxdaela Saga pursues a theme and style uncommon to most early Icelandic writing. It is a medieval tale of a three-member love relationship; perhaps one of the oldest themes in literature.

STONEHENGE DECODED by Gerald S. Hawkins,
Hardback, pp. 202 with index and illustrations

The Druid Stones in Southern England have baffled men's imaginations since the days of King Arthur. It was widely perceived that there was some powerful significance to their arrangement, but until Professor Hawkins' research, even the most outstanding scholars could only speculate: Was it a temple of human sacrifice, a burial ground for heroes, an altar for worship of unknown deities, the foundation of an unknown city? It took the 20th century's computer technology to reveal the answer—and to dramatically demonstrate the wisdom of our British Isle ancestors. Hawkins' lively recreation of his discoveries include a survey of the popular myths which have grown up around this mysterious creation.

TEUTONIC MYTHOLOGY by Jacob Grimm,
Translated by James Steven Stallybrass, Paperback
in four volumes, pp. 1,887 with index, notes and
appendix, \$11.00

The cataloging of the Germanic fairy tales made the name of the brothers Grimm a household word in the last century. The brother Jacob, however, developed folklore into a science, and in this work he compiled every relevant piece of information from history, etymology and folklore into a definitive survey of the early Teutonic religions, including: rites, beliefs, diets, heroes, literature, games, curses, idiomatic expressions, magic spells, superstitious customs and temples of worship. Although written more than 100 years ago, it is so complete that very little can be added. This is definitely a scholarly work for a foregoing enthusiasts!

GODS AND MYTHS OF NORTHERN EUROPE
by H. R. Ellis Davidson, Paperback. . . . \$1.95

So infused is the culture of our Northern forefathers with that of our own, that the days of the week reflect the names of four of their dieties—Tiw, Woden, Thunor, Frig. This new book is a popular treatment of the colorful religious beliefs of the Norse and Germanic peoples. The author has provided a complete survey of their belief systems and has related their worship to daily life and their social organizations.

KING HARALD'S SAGA by Snorri Sturluson,
Translated by Magnus Magnusson and Hermann
Palsson. Paperback. pp. 190 with maps. . \$1.25

King Harald's Saga, written by primeval Iceland's greatest historian, records the turbulent life of Harald Hardradi, the warrior king who served and fought in every corner of Europe, from Russia to Sicily, and tells how the last of the great Vikings was rewarded for his claim to the English throne with "seven feet of English soil."
