Will drop you a couple of lines this afternoon while things are kind of slow. Am working the morning shift 6 am to 2 pm. Most of the things have been routine since we came back from Mildred - maybe even a little slower than usual.

About the only thing there is left for me to do is get out of here. We are presently training new people for those who were wounded and for me since I am short. It is a little hectic but nothing that I wont be able to handle.

Have not got too definite a word as when I will be leaving - either the last week in April or first week

in may. Any way I look at it only have a couple of weeks left at the max.

The battahon is moving up north shortly to some place close to Da Nang - within 5 miles. I don't know if I will go or not - depends on how soon it is. Would rather stay in Chu Lai - see base.

Will let you know if there are any further developments along this line. The only thing I am worrying about is whether or not I'll be out of the army when I leave here.

Nothing more for today. Will be home soon.
