SIDNEY -- Australia's first heart transplant patient is doing very well. The operation on 57-year-old Richard Pye took nine and a half hours Wednesday night.

State police said "about 10" persons survived. The fate of the other 32 was not known.

MEXICO CITY---U.S. Athletes have won four more swimming gold medals at the Olympics and added others in shooting and showjumping. Bill Steinkraus became the first American in history to win the gold medal in showjumping. Second and third places went to British riders. Gary Anderson won the free rifle event with a world record score of 1,157. The American swimmers to take first places were Mike Burton in the men's 400-meter freestyle, Charles Hickcoc in the 400-meter individual medley, Kay Hall in the women's 100-meter backstroke and Sharon Wichman in the women's 200-meter breaststroke. Milena Duchkova of Czechoslovakia won the women's platform diving. While another Czech girl, Vera Caslavská, took individual honors in the women's gymnastics.
