LINEAGE

Constituted 24 May 1942 in the Army of the United States as Headquarters, Americal Division.

Activated 27 May 1942 in New Caledonia. Inactivated 12 December 1945 at Fort Lawton,

Washington. Re-designated 1 December 1954 as Headquarters, 23rd Infantry Division, and

allotted to the Regular Army. Activated 2 December 1954 at Fort Amador, Canal Zone. Re-

designated 25 September 1967 as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 23rd Infantry

Division, and activated in Vietnam. Inactivated 29 November 1971 at Fort Lewis, Washington.

LOOKING BACK ...

As events in our two wars became history, the record often necessarily surpassed individual efforts that went into executing the entire mission.

Discrete events and accomplishments are lost as figures in black and white on some report that is skimmed and filed.

But each of us treasures some moment we consider unique, perhaps because it was part of our own, more personal mission.

Such is this record; happenings which are, alone, small fractions of the whole. Events that could only happen at our own particular place in time and which will be remembered only by two separate groups of people, two generations ... who worked together in a quest for freedom.
