**NOTICE TO EMPLOYEE**

1. This is your official record of actual seafaring service with the Military Sea Transportation Service. In addition, this booklet includes a record of the MSTS training courses which you have completed. It is in your interest to make sure that these records are kept up to date.
2. Give this record to the Purser at the beginning of each voyage. At the end of each voyage your record will be returned to you with an entry, by the Master, showing the name of the ship, the date and place the voyage began, your position title, and the date and place the voyage ended.
3. Make sure that an appropriate entry is made in the Training Record in the back of this book for each training course that you complete.
4. Your attention is called to the fact that any persons making unofficial entries or alterations to this record may be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both (title 18, Criminal Code of the United States, section 72 and 76).
5. You must report the loss of this record to the Industrial Relations Office ashore.
6. This record will not be utilized as a record of service on any merchant vessels or any other vessels owned and/or operated by any other agency or establishment of the Federal Government.
7. The entry in this book at the end of a voyage DOES NOT mean the end of your employment with MSTS. This entry only records your most recent voyage. You remain an employee of MSTS, subject to assignment to any MSTS ship, until you are officially separated from employment.
8. This record of your sea service should be submitted to the U.S. Coast Guard when you apply for a higher endorsement or license.
