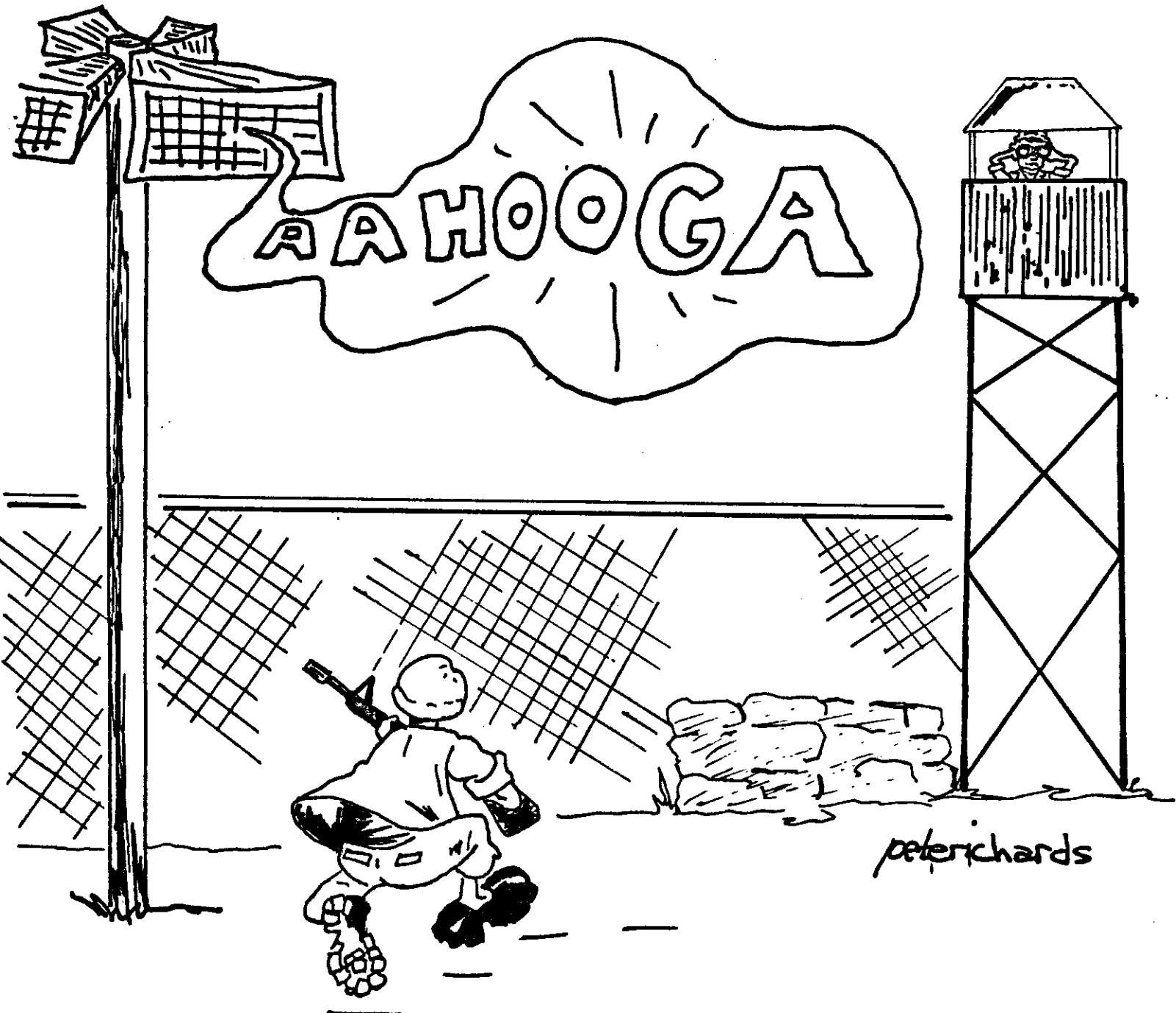

LABOR DAY, in the United States and Canada, a holiday on the first Monday in September. The celebration of this day was inaugurated by the Knights of Labor who held a parade in New York City in 1882, in 1883, and in 1884. In the last year a resolution by one of the knights, George R. Lloyd, was passed, recommending that parades be held on Labor Day. According to an article published by the United States Department of Labor, Oregon was the first state to legislate for general observance of Labor Day as a legal holiday. This law enacted February 21, 1887, specified the first Saturday in June as Labor Day; but in 1893 the day of observance was changed to the first Monday in September. In March, April, and May of 1887, Colorado, New Jersey, New York, and Massachusetts passed similar legislation, all setting the first Monday of September as the holiday, and in 1894 Congress declared it to be a national holiday.

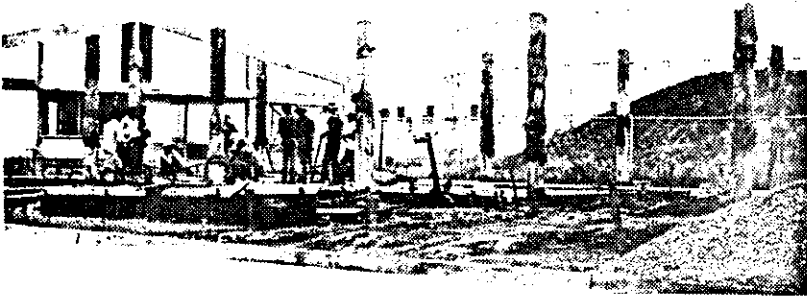
In Europe, the celebration of Labor Day May Day (May 1) was begun in the 1890's and has persisted to the present time. The holiday is also celebrated on this date and with great official gusto in the Soviet Union and other Communist-ruled countries.

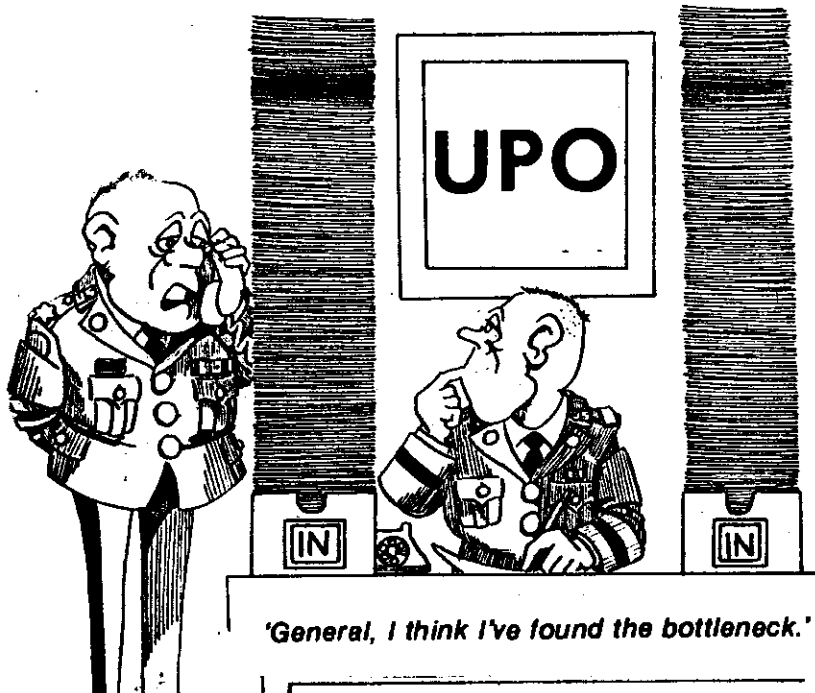

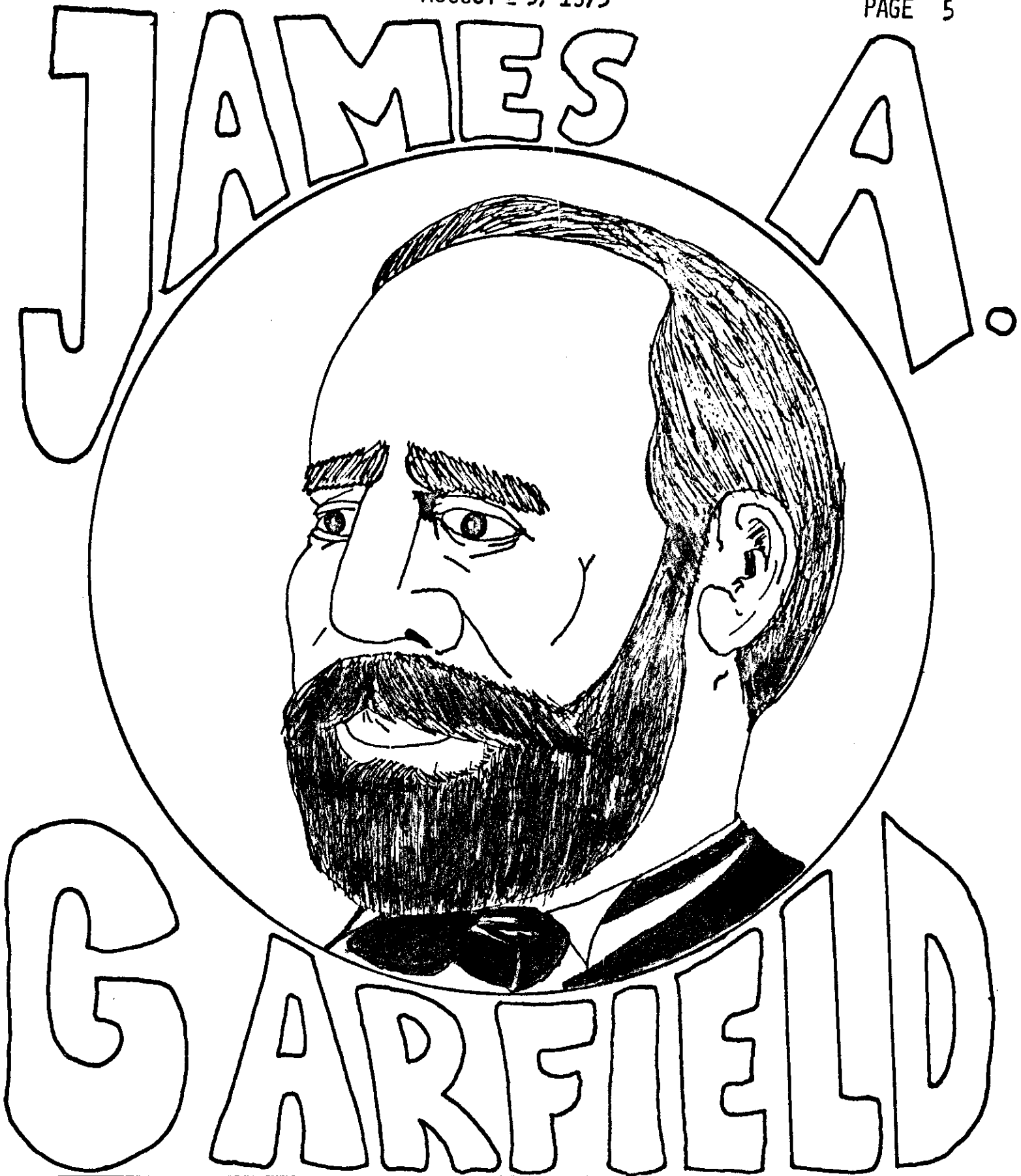

After routing all of the cobras from their nests for a couple of hours, seven unidentified troops watch grazing water buffalo as they man an A Co. bunker.

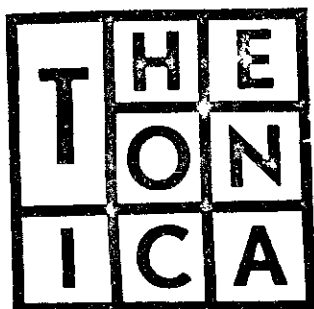

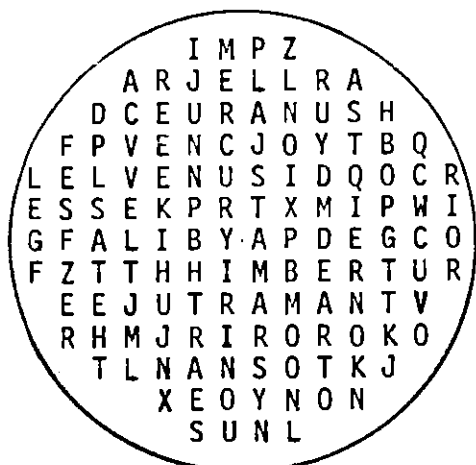

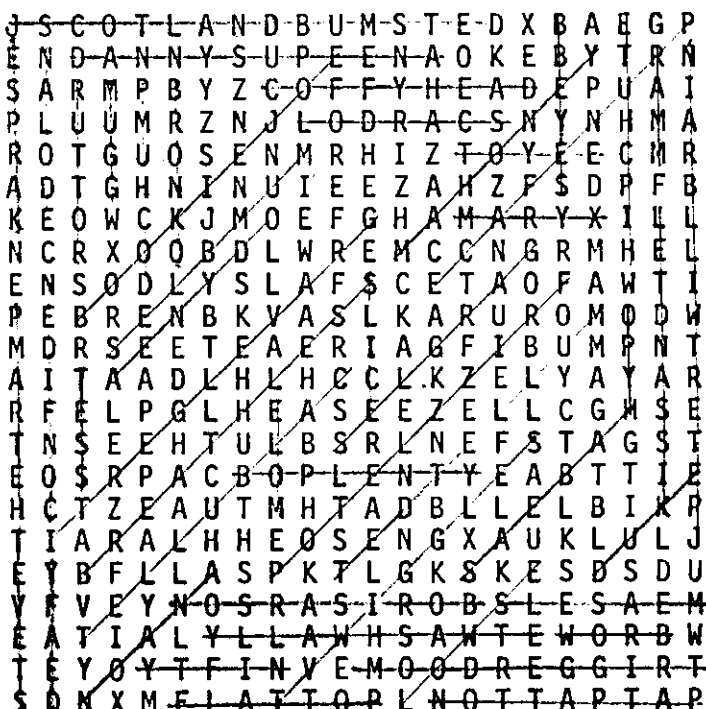

Kobra-7 Interview:

ASA Reserves



CSM Schlocker was drafted in 1943 during WWII and ETS'ed December 1945. He then joined the Los Angeles Police Dept. and for 22 1/2 years, worked quite a few of the many facets of law enforcement. Although he confesses that he enjoyed the Vice Squad - especially bookmaking operations - the best, he only spent five years in this specific field.

CSM Schlocker joined a counter-intelligence reserve unit during the Korean conflict and for pay purposes has 26 years in the Army.

He still works for the city (L.A.) as an airport security guard, but is currently on a two year military leave of absence in order to contact as many world-wide agency troops regarding the ASA Reserve Program.

A CANDID CONVERSATION WITH A "CAREER RESERVIST" ON HOW THE ASA RESERVES CAN BENEFIT YOU

KOBRA-7:

Tell us about the founding of the ASA Reserves.

SCHLOCKER:

Mr. Bass and myself are visiting all active Army ASA units throughout the world to encourage ETS people in ASA units to join the ASA reserve units back in the States. This program has been very successful in Germany because we have recruited about 10% of these people...and I think that's pretty darn good. However, not all of these people have gone to ASA units because there's only 23 companies and two battalions throughout the country. Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Seattle are the only units available on the West Coast, so we try to find a unit for anyone located between these points. Usually it's either a National Guard or a USAR unit. These units are using an Agency MOS as a secondary and re-training this man according to the type of unit he is placed into. If a national emergency ever arises then the Agency can always fall back and pick-up their secondary ASA MOS people.

KOBRA-7:

What is the reason for having ASA Reserve?

SCHLOCKER:

The reason for having any reserve force is to have a good back-up in case of national emergency. ASA reserve units are actually slotted to take care of active units.

KOBRA-7:

If I decide to try active reserves, what kind of obligation do I incur?

SCHLOCKER:

You incur NO obligation because after three years you have no obligation left. If you elect to join the active reserves you are automatically placed in a pool for the remainder of your six year period of time.

KOBRA-7:

Suppose a man ETS's after three years in the Agency, can he join a reserve unit if he also wants to attend school?

SCHLOCKER:

Yes he can. But if he becomes burdened down with school, job, or marriage conflicts, all he has to do is call down to the reserve center and tell them that he can't attend meetings any longer and they will release him. Now if his problems are worked-out later and he wants to get back in, all he has to do is phone them again.

KOBRA-7:

What kind of an appeal does this program have to the potential college student?

SCHLOCKER:

However, it should be noticed that our Kings in the absolute monarchy were, practically, never really absolute in the strict sense of the word, because most of them considered themselves as fathers of their people, and always behaved themself-

ves and governed them as such. Throughout the long list of the absolute monarchs in our history we found, very fortunately, lots of benefactors but rarely a bad king or tyrant.

When the government was changed to the present form of government, called the Constitutional Monarchy. In this form of government, which is a kind of democracy, the sovereignty belongs to the Thai People and the King, who is the supreme ruler of the country, exercises this sovereignty for his people - according to the written constitution. He exercises legislative power by means of the Parliament, the administrative power by means of the Cabinet and the judicial power by means of the Court of Justice.

Early Black History

What has caused the racial turmoil in America? To answer this we must examine the history of the American Black Man.

Most Blacks brought to America, originated in West Africa. This territory encompasses the African rainforest and the vast grasslands known as the Sudan.

The political structure of the ancestral societies of American Blacks ranged from tribal organizations, through city-states in the Niger Delta, to large and complex kingdoms.

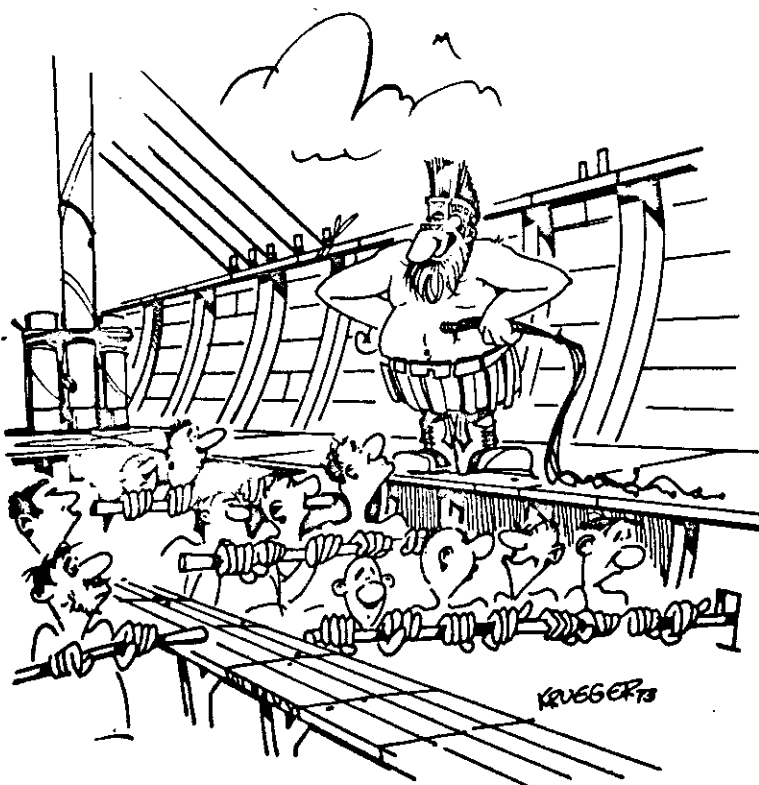
When Europe was just coming out of the "Dark Ages" Ghana (The first of the great empires) reached he peak (1067 A.D.). This empire lasted from 300 A.D. to 1240 A.D. It extended from the Atlantic Coast to Timbuctu.

1000 A.D. saw the zenith of the Zimbabwe civilization of Rhodesia whose highly developed culture was marked by architectural wonders.

IFE, a holy city in Nigeria, reached it's peak between 1300-1500 A.D. It was noted for it's fine sculpture.

The year 1307 A.D. brought the total rule of West Africa by the Mangingo empire. The Mangingo warriors were noted for their unparalleled fierceness and strength. Because of this they were the most sought after by slave traders.

The Mali empire came into being about 1350 A.D. Through the leadership of Mansa Musa, Mali became one of the greatest of African Empires. Mansa Musa brought a system of law to western Sudan, gave protection to the trade routes and expanded his rule over such cities as Timbuctu, (an important center of learning). Ambassadors from Mali represented their government in Morocco, Cairo, and other great centers of power. Scholars from the university of Timbuctu were received and honored at the universities in Egypt and Spain. Mansa Musa brought other scholars, architects, and men of science from Egypt to help build his magnificent empire in West Africa.

These empires were but a few of the many great empires which flourished before, after, and independently of when the white man first stepped foot on African soil.

We will now briefly look at some of the important forms of African culture. Black Afro-American folklore had it's roots in an "Oral" tradition which the slaves brought from Africa. For the African, the spoken language was his history. In African market places storytelling developed into a tradition which enabled the Black man to know his origin religion, and himself.

Music and dancing, although forms of recreation, were also highly developed arts used in worship and other rituals. While differing from classical music, African music is very complex in scale and rhythm. The uses of the drum and woodwind instruments are highly developed.

West Africans were also noted for their original sculpture. Most African carvings are of bronze, wood, stone, and Ivory.

This was but an abbreviated glimpse of what Africa was like before the Black man was brought to America. In the next article of this series we will examine the Black man's forced exodus from Africa to America.

The Art Of PINOCHLE

Pinochle is the name of a whole family of games, related by origin and having certain basic features in common, but varying widely in form and strategy. It was developed in the United States probably in the middle of the 19th century. The whole family grew up in the United States-not in Germany, as many persons assume merely because Pinochle games use a German ranking of the cards and took some of their features from German games such as Skat. The basic features common to the whole family are as follows:

CARDS:

The Pinochle pack is 48 cards-two cards, duplicates, of each rank in each of the four suits. (Clubs, spades, hearts and diamonds).

RANK OF CARDS:

In each suit the rank is: A(high), 10, K, Q, J, (9, if used). When duplicates are played to the same trick (as two aces of spades) the first played ranks higher.

CARD VALUES:

The higher cards have scoring value when won in tricks. Usually in single-deck or double-deck Pinochle, only Aces (one point), Kings (one point), and Tens (one point) have a scoring value. Winning last trick usually counts two points thus the total points at stake in the play are; single-deck 26 points and double-deck 50 points.

MELDS:

Certain combinations of cards (melds) have scoring value:

Sequences:

Following sequences pertain to single or double-deck pinochle.

A-K-Q-J-10 of trumps (run) 15 point
K-Q of trumps (marriage in trump) 4 point
K-Q of any other suit (marriage) 2 point

Groups:

A Clubs, A Spades, A Diamonds, A Hearts, (Aces around) 10 point
K Clubs, K Spades, K Diamonds, K Hearts, Kings around) 8 points
Q Clubs, Q Spades, Q Diamonds, Q Hearts, (Queens around) 6 points
J Clubs, J Spades, J Diamonds, J Hearts, (Jacks around) 4 points

Special:

- Single Pinochle:(4 points) -one Queen of Spades and one Jack of Diamonds
- Double Pinochle: (30 pts.) - two Q's of Spades and twom Jacks of D.
- Triple Pinochle: (90 pts) - three Q's of Spades and Three Jack s of Diamonds

d. Round-house: A King and Queen of each of the four suits which is 24 pts in meld value.

e. Double-run: 150 pts - two of each Ace through ten declares trump suit.

f. Dix: Used in single-deck Pinochle only; the 9's of trump, worth in meld value one pt.

A card may be used in two or three melds, provided that they are of different classes. For example, the same Queen of Spades may be used in a marriage Queens - around, and a Pinochle. But when a run is melded, the K-Q do not count separately as a marriage in trump.

Additional rules of melding and additional melds are met in various Pinochle games. It is virtually impossible to establish set rules of Pinochle that all will follow as each area has its different "House Rules". Shall we say, that if a small or large wager is made on the games, "Know the house rules before you set down at the table."
