DAILY INTERNAL INFORMATION SUMMARY NO. 22-26.

ARMY ELEMENTS OF THE MR F RAN INTO SOME OF THEIR STIFFEST OPPOSITION IN SEVERAL WEEKS MONDAY WHEN THEY WERE ATTACKED FROM PREPARED ENEMY POSITIONS WHILE COMPLETING AN AIRLIFT INTO THE AO WEST OF CAN THO.

BRAVO COMPANY OF 3/68 INFANTRY BORE THE BRUNT OF THE ATTACK, RECEIVING A HEAVY BARRAGE OF AUTOMATIC WEAPONS, SMALL ARMS AND ROCKET FIRE AS THEIR HELICOPTERS DROPPED DOWN AT THE OBJECTIVE LANDING ZONE AT 0940. TWELVE ARMY PERSONNEL WERE KILLED DURING THE DAY AND 25 OTHERS WERE WOUNDED, SEVEN SERIOUSLY. TWENTY VC WERE KNOWN TO HAVE BEEN KILLED AND ONE POW HAD BEEN TAKEN AS OF 2000. THE HELICOPTERS INVOLVED IN THE AIRMOBILE ASSAULT ALSO TOOK CONSIDERABLE FIRE, AND ONE WAS SHOT DOWN DURING THE BATTLE.

DESPITE THE HEAVY ARMY INVOLVEMENT, NAVY ELEMENTS REPORTED NO CONTACT

FROM TWO UNCLAS F  
HOLIDAY. THE CLOSEST  
RECEIVED AUTOMATIC WEAPONS AND ROCKET FIRE AT ABOUT 0600 AS THEY WERE  
BEING ESCORTED DOWN THE CAN THO RIVER BY BOATS OF RIVER DIVISION 91.  
ALTHOUGH ONE OF THE LC4-8'S WAS HIT, THERE WERE NO CASUALTIES.  
THE RIV DIV 91 BOATS AND OTHER UNITS OF DIVISION 111 ARE CONDUCTING  
PATROLS ALONG AN 11-MILE STRETCH OF THE SONG CAN THO, SOUTH AND WEST  
OF THE CITY.

OTHER BOATS OF RIVER DIVISION 92 ARE PATROLLING A SMALLER STREAM NORTH  
OF THE AO IN THE VICINITY OF THE AREA WHERE THEY BEACHED COMPANIES OF  
3/47 INFANTRY ABOUT 0830.

BRAND AND OTHER COMPANIES OF 3/60 INFANTRY WERE AIR LIFTED INTO THE  
AO AFTER BEING TRANSPORTED TO A PICK-UP ZONE ON THE SOUTH BANK OF  
THE BASSAC RIVER BY BOATS OF RIV DIV 111.

ON MONDAY AFTERNOON, THE MRF WAS VISITED BY MR. CHARLES L. EBERHARDT,  
DIRECTOR OF THE FAR EAST BUREAU OF VOICE OF AMERICA, AND MR. CHRIS  
ECONOMOU, A WAR CORRESPONDENT FOR "EIKONES", AN ILLUSTRATED WEEKLY  
MAGAZINE PUBLISHED IN ATHENE, GREECE. BOTH MEN WERE BRIEFED ON MRF  
OPERATIONS AND TOURED ASSAULT CRAFT ALONGSIDE THE BENEWAH. THEY  
WILL CONTINUE THEIR VISIT WITH US ON TUESDAY.
