Captain ENGLE was born in Petoskey, Michigan in 1916, received his MD Degree from the University of Michigan in 1940, entered the Navy in 1941 and has served continuously since that time. During World War II he served as Medical Officer aboard USS DETROIT.

Captain ENGLE's assignments have included Naval Hospital, Bethesda and Naval Hospital, Guam as Chief of Medicine 1948 - 49, post-graduate study in Tropical Medicine at the Tulane University 1950, Resident Course at the Armed Forces Industrial College in 1955 and 1956, Force Medical Officer, Service Force, U. S. Pacific Fleet and Director, Physical Qualifications and Medical Records Division, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery 1959 - 65.

On 16 October 1965 upon recommissioning of the USS REPOSE AH-16, Captain ENGLE assumed command of the Naval Hospital. Upon being relieved and detached he will proceed to Long Beach, California where he will place in commission and become the first commanding officer of the U. S. Naval Hospital, Long Beach.

Captain ENGLE wears the American Defense Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal with one star, American Campaign Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal with one star, World War II Victory Medal, and the Vietnam Service Medal.

Captain ENGLE was married in 1943 to Eloise Hopper of Seattle, Washington, who resides with their three children in Falls Church, Virginia.

Captain NADBATH was born in Cleveland, Ohio in 1914; received his A.B. in 1937 from W.R.Univ., Cleveland; his M.S. in 1938 as Research Fellow at the Grad.Sch. of W.R. Univ.; his M.D. in 1942 from Rochester Sch. of Medicine; his internship in '42 - '43 at Charity Hospital, Cleve.; his Ophthalmic Residency at Naval Hospital, Long Beach in '46 - '47, and at the Univ. Hospital, Iowa City in '47 - '49.

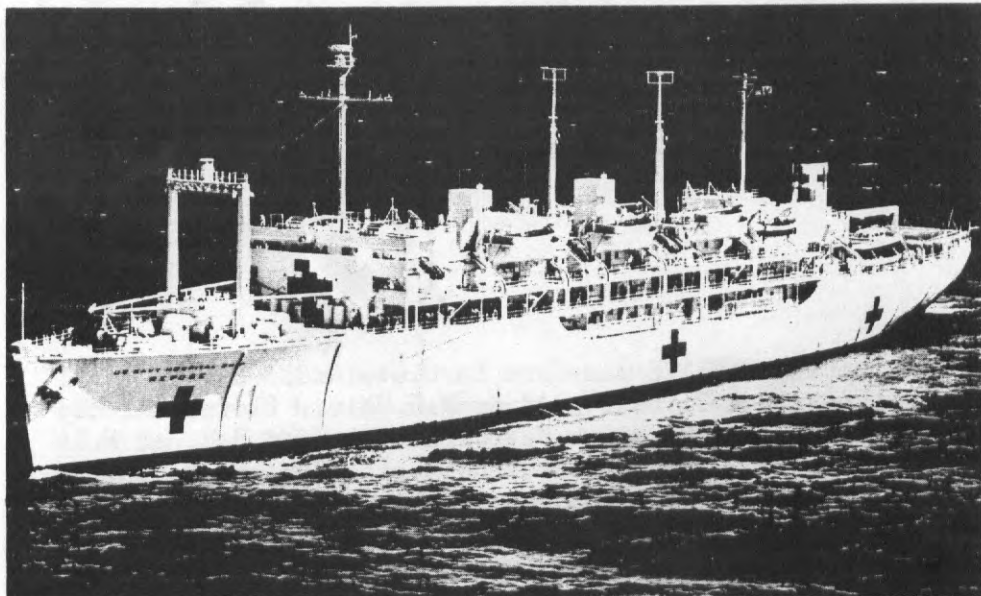
Captain NADBATH is certified by the Am. Bd. Opth., '51; member of the Acad.Opth., '52; FACS in '54; and is also member of the AMA, Research in Opth., and Military Surgeons. Professional appointments include Visiting Guest Lecturer, Grad.Sch., Phil. '53 - '54 and Assoc. Prof. Opth., Hahnemann Med. College, Phila. '53 - '54. He has published articles in the Arch.Opth., Am. J., Opth., Military Surgeon, etc. and has been Guest Speaker at the L.A. Research Study Club, Washington Annual Meeting, Pan-Surgical Conference, etc.

In July '43 Captain NADBATH entered the U.S.Naval Medical Corps. His assignments have successively been Air Station, Bunker Hill, Indiana; Mobile Hospital #12; USNH Treasure Island; Acorn #27; Seaplane Base 3505; Casu F-56; USNH at San Diego, Long Beach, Philadelphia; then Staff, ComPhibGru One; followed as Chief Opth. at San Diego, Bethesda, and Oakland.

Captain NADBATH wears the Korean Service Medal with one star, United Nations Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal with one star, American Campaign Medal, Asiatic - Pacific Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal and the Philippine Liberation Ribbon with 2 stars.

In November 1945 Captain NADBATH married Florence Haden of Piedmont, California.
