SUBJECT: Conversion to Unlimited Appointment (Career Service)
Proposed Effective Date: August 5, 1973

Your conversion from a time-limited to an A.I.D. career appointment has been recommended by the Foreign Service Personnel Division and authorized by the Director of Personnel and Manpower. Although A.I.D. does not have a career service established by law, an unlimited appointment is the administrative equivalent.

Since conversion constitutes an official action which has a direct bearing upon your career with A.I.D., we need to be certain that you are agreeable to the proposed conversion and are willing to be available on a continuing basis for an assignment to any post in the Foreign Service.

If you were appointed to the A.I.D. Foreign Service either from AID/Washington or another Government agency prior to May 20, 1959, you have statutory rights to a position with that agency even though you accept an unlimited appointment with A.I.D.

If you were appointed overseas after May 20, 1959, have reemployment rights with an Agency other than A.I.D., and you accept this conversion, your rights will expire on the terminal date of your present time-limited appointment. Or, if you have reemployment rights to a Departmental Service position in AID/Washington, your rights will be terminated as of the date of conversion to an unlimited appointment if you have served more than 30 months in our Foreign Service, or at the end of 30 months if you are now serving under your initial Foreign Service appointment.

Foreign Service employees will direct any questions concerning reemployment rights to their Executive Officer. Employees on rotation in AID/W and non-regional personnel should refer their questions to SER/PM/FSP.
