I have been out of town and only recently received your letter concerning Roger. I had heard some months ago that his condition had greatly improved and that he was out of danger but now I believe that perhaps this is not so. Naturally I am deeply saddened. I am no doctor, and can add nothing to your analysis of Roger's condition based on all the tests and treatments he has received. The check I enclose is obviously only a gesture to indicate my concern and great sympathy for Roger and his family. I hope you will keep me posted on Roger's condition. He did an outstanding job in Vietnam and made a host of friends. I mentioned receiving your letter to Bob Zimmerman this morning and Bob said he also wanted to write to you. I am giving him your address. I also have been in touch with Coll Bohannon, who has corresponded with me, and with Ed Lansdale concerning Roger's situation. It is possible that I might be making a trip to that area within the next few months although nothing is certain as yet, but if I do I will certainly call on you and hope to see Roger too if he is receiving visitors.
