Dear Mr. WILLIAMS,

You'll be surprised when receiving this letter. But let me introduce myself to you. My name is LOI DO, and I'm the brother in law of Mr. Luan, a former officer in the Army of the Republic of Vietnam. I have just got a letter from Mr. Luan. He requested me to send you this enclosed letter. He has just been released from a communist reeducation camp. For me, I had also been in various so called reeducation camps for 3 years before I was released from them. Then I fled away, by boat, and came to the U.S. in 1979. I'm now living in San Jose with two Mr. Luan's older children whom came to me last year. As you know, we are now in the parolee status only, so we weren't eligible to submit any petition or sponsorship documents for the Luans. We hope by your citizenship, you can do better things than us.

You can write directly to the Luans, or send your letter for them to me. I'll be very happy to transfer your letter to them. I hope to hear from you soon.
