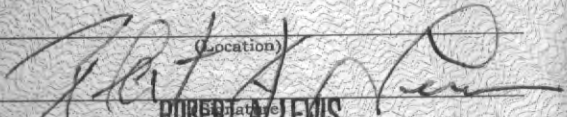

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR YOU

• GENERAL INFORMATION

You may prepare in advance to meet certain requirements that will govern your return from abroad. The following information will assist you in avoiding inconvenience and delay at the time of your return to the United States.

• CUSTOMS SERVICE

The pamphlet "Customs Hints" has been designed to give you pertinent information about Customs requirements. To learn how these requirements apply to articles which you may acquire while traveling abroad, obtain a copy from your nearest Customs office. "Customs Hints" are available at U.S. diplomatic and consular offices abroad, and at Passport Agencies in the U.S. A separate pamphlet "Customs Hints for Non-Residents" is also available.

• PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE

A smallpox vaccination within three years is an entry requirement when returning to the United States. Yellow fever and cholera vaccinations are also required if you visit an infected area. The vaccination(s) should be obtained before you leave. Vaccinations must be recorded on Form PHS-731, "International Certificates of Vaccination", and validated by a local or state health officer. You may obtain additional information from local health offices or the nearest Public Health Service facility.

• AGRICULTURE

The importation into the U.S. of certain agricultural items is restricted or prohibited entirely because they often contain pests or diseases that could cause immense damage to our crops, forests, or livestock. Import permits are required for most plants, seeds, bulbs, soil, meat or meat products, fruits, or vegetables. General information on this subject is contained in the pamphlet "Customs Hints". For specific information, write to the Agricultural Research Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C., 20250.

• TREASURY

Treasury Regulations prohibit purchase or importation of Communist Chinese, North Korean, North Vietnamese or Cuban merchandise and of Chinese-type merchandise specified in the Regulations, without a license or a certificate of origin of the type prescribed in the Regulations. Travelers should consult local American consulates for further information.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR YOU

• TRAVEL IN DISTURBED AREAS

If you travel in disturbed areas, you should keep in touch with the nearest American diplomatic or consular office.

• PROLONGED RESIDENCE ABROAD

If you reside for a prolonged period abroad, you should register at the nearest American diplomatic or consular office.

• LOSS OF NATIONALITY

You may lose your United States nationality by being naturalized in, or by voting in the elections of, a foreign state; by taking an oath or making a declaration of allegiance to a foreign state; or by serving in the armed forces or accepting employment under the government of a foreign state. For detailed information consult the nearest American diplomatic or consular office.

• VIOLATION OF CONDITIONS OR RESTRICTIONS

If you use or attempt to use this passport in violation of the conditions or restrictions contained in it, you may be liable for prosecution (Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 1544). You may also lose the protection of the United States while you continue to reside abroad.

• LOSS, THEFT OR DESTRUCTION OF PASSPORT

If this passport is lost, stolen or destroyed, report full details immediately to the Passport Office, Department of State, Washington, D.C., 20524, or to the nearest American diplomatic or consular office. If lost or stolen, local police authorities should also be notified. In American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Swains Island, or the Virgin Islands, report to the chief executive and to the local police authorities. In loss or destruction cases, new passports are issued only after careful investigation.

• ALTERATION OR MUTILATION OF PASSPORT

This passport must not be altered or mutilated in any way. You must not alter any dates or make any changes in your description, on the photograph, or on any other page of this passport. Alteration may make it invalid and, if willful, may subject you to prosecution (Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 1543). Only authorized officials of the United States or of foreign countries, in connection with official matters, may place stamps or make statements, notations or additions in this passport. However, you may amend or up-date information supplied by you on the inside of the front cover of this passport, if necessary.
